An individual by the name of JOHN WILLARD, Monticello, Arkansas, came to the attention of the Little Rock Office because of the similarity of name utilized at the rooming house and description of UNSUB in this case. He has been eliminated as a suspect by investigation placing him in Arkansas during the pertinent period.

During interview however, WILLARD stated that during the summer of 1963 or 1964 he worked for the Daniels Construction Company in the construction of a tissue plant at Crossett, Arkansas. It was his recollection that the Daniels Construction Company was a firm operating out of Birmingham, Alabama. During this employment he worked in the Project Engineer's Office doing bookkeeping work. He did not become closely acquainted with anyone from this concern and could not at this time recall any specific individual's name.

The above is being furnished to the Memphis and Birmingham Offices in view of the background concerning the gun in this matter and for appropriate consideration should any employee of the Daniels Construction Company of Birmingham become involved in this investigation. Although not likely, it is conceivable that such an individual might have drawn on the name "JOHN WILLARD" because of some past connection with the Daniels Construction Company.

Again, Murder

The immediate tragedy of the murcer of Dr. Martin Luther King is that it worsens race relations at a time when improvement is imperative, that it submerges his family and friends in needless sorrow and overwhelms a vast number of Negro Americans with doubt of the validity of the American promise.

The larger tragedy of the assassination is its evidence that positive response to the American challenge which has been applauded in countain newcomers to this land can, when exampled by Negroes with roots more than 300 years deep in American soil,

lead on to murder.
The facts of American history probably made a violent death inevitable for Martin Luther King. They also would inducate that his removal from a cene instead of ending the movel in which he played so large a will deliver it into the hands of occass prepared to advocate more extreme courses than King himself would have endorsed.

The response of President Johnson, of former Gov. George Wallace of Adabama and of countless civic and spiritual leaders here and elsewhere in the nation and in the world condemns the murder and underscores the truth that nothing is ever gained by such cowardly violence.

If the murderer was opposed to King's cause, his act will impel it to prosper more than ever.

If the murderer was after King per-

sonally, he has done great disservice to his country because he has given new stature to the fanatics who cry, "Burn, baby, burn."

Many white Americans, including a large number of white Southern Americans, have believed honestly that the King movement for civil rights was subversive of American ideals and that the minister was, in spite of his protestations, an apostle of violence instead of peace. The fact remains, however, that most of the violence associated with King activities was directed against him and his followers rather than against those who opposed him and that he was himself the target of the ultimate violence.

Murder has marked American race relations for more than a century. It has scarred lives and communities in every section of the nation. It has solved nothing, and the problems still remain.

A decade before the war to deliver, the Negro American into freedom, Frederick Douglass, the chief Negro foe of slavery declared:

"We are here . . . and this is our country . . . we shall neither die out nor be driven out, but shall go with this people (the white American community) either as a testimony against them or as an evidence in their favor throughout their generations."

Those alternatives set out in 1851 continue in force today, still challenge men of good will.



On 4/8/68 LELIA WILDER, 3928 3rd Avenue, South, Birmingham, telephonically contacted SA JAMES H. BUNNELL from her place of employment, La Dame Cleaners, 1920 11th Avenue, South, and furnished the following information:

WILDER was previously shown the artist's conception of unknown subject in this case and advised Bureau agents that she would contact the FBI if she received any information. WILDER stated that at about 1:00 p.m. on 4/8/68 an individual resembling subject came into the La Dame Cleaners to pick up some laundry. This individual paid for this cleaning with a \$20 bill. She described this individual as being 5'10", slim build, brown hair, 25-30 years of age, and had "sort of a crew cut". He was wearing a sport shirt and dark pants. WILDER further advised that the name on the cleaning ticket was L. FINCH, 1316 19th Street, S.W.

This information was given to SA CHARLES DONALD BYRON for assignment to the group conducting neighborhood investigation.

BOWEN DESCRIBED HIM AS WEIRD-LOOKING BECAUSE OF THICK BLACK HAIR AND STATED HE HAD A "SILLY GRIN." BOWEN DESCRIBED SECOND MAN WHO WAS STANDING ON SIDEWALK AS WMA, APPROXIMATELY TWO SIX YEARS OF AGE, FIVE FEET EIGHT INCHES TALL, MEDIUM BUILD, WEARING WHITE SHIRT AND TIE WITH SPORTS COAT AND DRESS TROUSERS. THIS SECOND MAN REFERRED TO BY FIRST MAN AS TIM. DRIVER SAID. "COME ON TIM, LET'S GET THE HELL OUT OF HERE, YOU TALK TOO MUCH." T WO MEN DROVE AWAY, THEN QUICKLY PUT ON THE BRAKES AND BACKED UP TO WHER BOWEN WAS STANDING. THEY ASKED HIM FOR THE MATCHBOOK BECAUSE IT HAD AN THAT THE NEEDED.
