H. Ross and Rudolph Ramelli, both of Jackson, Mississippi. This tape comes in eight to ten colors; however, red is not a good color, in that the ink from the machine tends to fade and run on red tape.

EMMONS made available a sample of cloth with several samples of tape markings, yellow in color. He numbered the lettering on the tape as "02B-6", "MIF14," and "MIF15." He made available other items described in paragraph one which are enclosed for the Bureau.

The managers of the Rudolph Ramelli Company and F. H. Ross Company, both of Jackson, Mississippi, advised that the only machine handling Thermo-Seal to his knowledge in the central and southern portions of the state is the Phoenix Laundry in Hattiesburg, Mississippi. They do not handle northern Mississippi.

On 4/11/68, a review of the Birmingham file 134-302 determined that IRA NATUANIEL EVANS, JR., white male, born at Cordova, Alabama, was at one time carried as a bombing suspect by Birmingham. He was involved in a shooting incident on 1/22/57 at the Central Park Theatre in Birmingham which was a meeting place of the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of the Confederacy, then headed by ASA CARTER, wherein two Klansmen were shot. Efforts were made to develop him as a potential security informant in 1958 without success as he claimed to have severed all connection with any Klanggroup at this time.


He was interviewed on 4/23/65 at his home, 5001 Quincy Court, Ensley, Alabama, in connection with the Greenbomb case and denied possessing any knowledge concerning this case. He also advised that since 1957, he has not had anything to do with any type of association or group regardless of their aims and purposes.

EVANS is described as $5'7\frac{1}{2}"$ tall, 198 lbs., black hair, blue-green eyes, employed past 15 years as new and used car salesman for Steel City Oldsmobile Company, Birmingham.

Each of these persons has advised that they could not recall any customers in the shop during the times they were there who match the description of the unknown subject, who was wearing a business suit, or who was observed by them purchasing a rifle with a scope site. Neither could any of these persons recall observing any Mustang automobile parked in front of the Aeromarine Supply Company.

On 4/10/68, at approximately 9 p.m., the writer entered Mammy's Pancake House, Highland Avenue, Birmingham. Towards the rear of the restaurant, seated at a table with a woman in her late twenties, was a man who bore a very strong resemblance to the artist's conception of the suspect in this case. The writer sat at the counter about 15 feet from this table and observed them for the next 15 minutes, at which time they left the restaurant. The writer followed the couple into the parking lot, noticed that the man helped the woman into the car on the driver's side and then entered on the passenger's side. The car was a white Chevrolet, Impala. The car had 1968 Alabama license #1-99666. They left the parking lot which is located on the south side of Highland Avenue and to the immediate east of the restaurant and drove east on Highland. The writer followed three cars behind; they pulled off to the side of the road near John Carroll High School. The writer drove around the block and when he returned they were gone. It was thought that shortly thereafter they were driving on 24th Street about two blocks north of Highland. The writer returned to the restaurant and talked to the two waitresses. They both seemed to know the mand and said our artist's conception was not a likeness of him. They further advised the woman was named CAROL and the couple had been coming there often for the past month and a half. It was further stated that he worked for the telephone company and was well mannered.

Highway Patrol records reveal the car is registered to CAROLE BARR, 2543 Beverly Drive. The car is a 1961 Chevrolet.

At approximately 9:40 p.m. the writer called the SAC and informed him of these events. From 10:05 until 10:43, the writer made a written record of his observations.
