It was concluded that ANITA LOUISE KATZWINKEL, K26, did not prepare the questioned handwriting "Ginger & Anita Katzwinkel" appearing on Q118, the portion of a tissue box, previously submitted. Because of unexplained variations and insufficient comparable material, a definite conclusion could not be reached whether KATZWINKEL prepared any of the remaining questioned handwriting on Q118. Some significant handwriting differences were noted in this remaining questioned handwriting excluding the words "Day" and "at pool." These words are too limited and contain insufficient handwriting characteristics to determine if they were or were not prepared by KATZWINKEL.

Due to the lack of a sufficient number of significant comparable letters, it was not possible to determine if the words "broulh" and "Olkahombe" on Q118 were prepared by the person or persons responsible for the remaining questioned handwriting appearing on this specimen.

It was concluded that the FLIKEID signatures appearing on the bottom of K27, were prepared by THOMAS M. FLIKEID, FBI#534039D.

Because of insufficient significant comparable handwriting and unexplained variations, a definite conclusion could not be reached whether the questioned Lowmyer signature on the gun invoice previously submitted or the writings attributable to Eric S. Galt, previously submitted, were prepared by the writer of K27. Some handwriting differences were noted in the handwriting attributable to Galt when compared with K27, however, these characteristics are not sufficiently strong to definitely eliminate FLIKEID as a possible writer of the Galt material.

The K28 and K29 maps are not identical with two maps, Q18 and Q20, previously submitted and recovered from the blue bag in Memphis.

Q139, Q140, K27 through K29 are temporarily retained. Appropriate photographs of the writing appearing on K27 have been made.

One 8 inch head hair of Caucasian origin was found inside the Q139 left shoe. This has been dyed black. No similar hairs were found in or on items previously submitted in this case. No other hairs or debris was found in Q139 or Q140.



The following investigation was conducted at Parrish, Alabama, by SA JOHN H. KRESEK on 4/6/68:

Mr. RAY GILLEY, SR., Route 1, advised that the wife of his son, RAY GILLEY, JR., told his wife that her husband had called the FBI Office early this morning, that is, shortly after midnight. He said it was his understanding that his son's wife said he told the FBI that he had some first-hand information about the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. JR.

Mr. GILLEY stated that his son, RAY, had just been discharged from Bryce State Hospital, Tuscaloosa, Alabama, the Friday a week ago (3/30/68). He advised that his son has been committed to Bryce Hospital on three other occasions and he is classified as a paranoid schizophrenic.

Mrs. KAY GILLEY, Route 1, wife of RAY GILLEY, JR., advised that she had personal knowledge that her husband was sitting before the TV set on Thursday, 4/4/68, when the news of KING's assassination was broadcast. She stated that later that evening he asked her, "Do you think I could prove where I was at last night". When she replied she thought she could, he said something to the effect that "I simply know too much."

Mrs. GILLEY then said he continued to drink and they left their home and went into the town of Parrish where she heard him call the FBI from a pay booth outside the Piggly Wiggly Store in Parrish. She stated she could

not hear all the conversation completely but that he pretended that the call was from someone other than himself. When he returned to the car, she said he told her not to tell anybody or they would kill her.

Mr. RAY GILLEY, JR., when asked whether he had any information to give the interviewing agent about the KING assassination, stated he did not know anything about it and denied that he ever made a telephone call to the FBI Office earlier that day stating he had information of value.

The following is a description of RAY GILLEY, JR., obtained by observation and interview:

The following investigation was conducted by SA JOHN H. KRESEK on 4/13/68, at Jasper, Alabama:

A file review regarding LEONARD WILSON indicated that he was permanently expelled from the University of Alabama because he was one of the leaders of a demonstration against AUTHERINE LUCY several years ago when she was the first Negro student to seek admission into the University. The file also indicates that he contributed to the American Nazi Party on 8/17/60. WILSON has been for several years and is currently the State Executive Secretary of the White Citizens Councils of Alabama. The file reveals that he has been called an extreme segregationist and a dangerous type of individual in racial matters by JOE ROBINSON, Walker County Solicitor, and Judge ROY MAYHALL, Circuit Judge, Jasper, Alabama.

On 4/13/68, discreet inquiry was made of District Attorney GERALD COLVIN, Walker County, Jasper, Alabama, concerning LEONARD WILSON and his recent activities. Mr. COLVIN stated that although WILSON was well known to him, he was frequently in a travel status due to his job with the White Citizens Council and that he did not know what his whereabouts might have been from 4/1-9/68. However, Mr. COLVIN confidentially contacted HOYT ELLIOTT, a lawyer who has an office adjacent to WILSON in the Blanton Building, Jasper, Alabama, and made inquiry concerning WILSON's presence in his office since 4/1/68.

Mr. COLVIN advised that Mr. ELLIOTT said he knows WILSON was present in his office on Sunday, 4/7/68, as he had occasion to come to his own office that day and observed WILSON, but he did not have any knowledge of WILSON's whereabouts on the days previous to that.

Mr. COLVIN described LEONARD WILSON as follows:

He stated that his wife, PEGGY WILSON, is the official court reporter for Judge LEONARD BEAIRD, Circuit Court, Jasper. Mr. COLVIN stated that WILSON owns a maroon-colored Pontiac GTO, late model, and a red Falcon. He stated that WILSON also owns a hog farm located on Holly Grove Road just outside of Jasper.

Mr. COLVIN stated that LEONARD WILSON thrives on publicity and loves the public limelight and would in all probability instantly inform the press if he were contacted by the FBI and relate to them anything that was said between himself and the interviewing agent. He also believes that WILSON was probably involved in former Governor GEORGE WALLACE's present political campaign.

In view of the discrepancy in physical description between WILSON and known suspects in this case, the political connections of WILSON to former Governor WALLACE, and his delight in newspaper publicity, no further investigation regarding LEONARD WILSON will be made unless advised to the contrary.

Mrs. FRANCES SMITH, Ashville Road, advised that she remembers her brother-in-law, LONNIE PHIL SMITH, coming out to see her husband at Leeds Hospital sometime in September, 1967, and she also recalled that on one occasion a white male had driven him to their house. However, Mrs. SMITH said she did not take any particular note of this man and when shown the artist's conceptions of the UNSUB in this case, she advised that they were in no way familiar to her. Mrs. SMITH said her daughter, GAYLE, was not at home at the time and worked as a secretary in the Clinical Laboratory at University Hospital in Birmingham.

On 4/16/68, SA KRESEK contacted GAYLE SMITH at University Hospital in Birmingham and she stated she recalls that her uncle, PHIL SMITH, came to Leeds Hospital in September, 1967, to visit her father and that on one occasion he was driven by a white male whom she described as about 5'10"-6', 185-190 pounds, and about 35 years of age. She said this man had long sideburns and a lot of dark brown hair which was graying. She also stated she remembered in answer to a question from her father to this man as to what he did, he replied he was an artist. When shown the artist's conception of the UNSUB in this case, she advised that the person she saw with her uncle had a face which was much fuller and his eyes and hair were different.



NOBLES stated he has been working the last three weeks at Mason's Cash Register Company, 2717 3rd Avenue, South, as an office equipment repairman and that he had gotten fed up with this job and was at the restaurant in hopes of contacting someone who was to meet him there about another job.

Neighborhood Investigation in Vicinity of the Friendship Club, $731\frac{1}{2}$ Graymont Avenue, Birmingham, Alabama

The following individuals were contacted by SAs JOHN H. KRESEK and NEIL G. MARTIN on 4/15/68, with negative results regarding artist's conception of UNSUB:

Mr. J. J. BEAVERS, Beavers Service Station and Sales, 900 North 5th Avenue, which station is across the street from the Friendship Club, advised he closes his business at 6:30 p.m. each night and when shown the artist's conception of the UNSUB, he stated he never saw any man resembling him in this neighborhood. Mr. BEAVERS also stated, when asked about the Inferno Club located next door to his station, that this place has been closed for the past six or seven months and it opened just last week, possibly just three days ago for the first time since it was closed several months ago.

MARY CARTER, Manager, A&B Playhouse, 718 Graymont Avenue, stated she never saw anyone come into that establishment who resembled the artist's conception of UNSUB. She advised, however, that Mr. VELVA BENNETT was the person who was on duty at night and he frequently mingles with the customers and might have observed the UNSUB.

Mr. VELVA BENNETT, after viewing artist's conception of UNSUB, stated this person's face seemed to be vaguely familiar to him and he vaguely recalled this person came into the Playhouse one night, exact time not recalled but possibly several months ago, and after having

a few drinks insisted that he have his picture taken with one of his Negro waitresses, KATHERINE, who worked at Britlings Cafeteria on Highland Avenue.

Mrs. IDLL BROCKLE, 624 Green Springs Avenue; Mrs. NELL WILLIAMS, 2425 11th Avenue, South; MARGARET MERRELL, 417 12th Street, Southwest; and Mrs. VINIE HINKLE, Route 1, Mount Olive, Alabama, were all contacted at the LCL Grill, 5th Avenue and 9th Street, North, with negative results. Mrs. HINKLE stated that patrons of the Friendship Club often frequented the Hickory Hut, Bessemer Road, and Grammas, which was once known as Happy Johns, but seldom came to the LCL Grill.

JAMES H. COHILL, Route 1, Box 437; GRANVILLE SMITH, Route 1, Box 374, Eutaw, Alabama, Shell Service Station, 5th Avenue and 9th Street, North, were contacted with negative results.

RAYMOND COUCH, Box 722, Mount Olive, Alabama, Hess Service Station, 5th Avenue and 8th Street, North, was contacted with negative results.

Mr. J. H. PRICE, owner, Beco Cleaners, 831 9th Street, North, Birmingham, made available his records from 3/1 - 4/15/68, and these records indicated that H. N. GAULT on 3/21/68, had brought in a jacket and five pairs of pants for cleaning. Mr. PRICE advised that this person was personally known to him and was a white male, about 60 or 65 years old, who has been a regular customer for several years. He stated he believed Mr. GAULT had a son who lives in Bluff Park, just outside of Birmingham. It is noted that it was determined that SA NEIL P. SHANAHAN had previously checked out H. N. GAULT's son with negative results.

On 4/16/68, SA KRESEK contacted Mr. RAYMOND L. THOMPSON, Manager, Britlings Cafeteria, 2173 Highland Avenue, Birmingham, who advised that he had a Negro waitress whose name is KATHERINE SMITH, 1200 Avenue G, Ensley, working at his cafeteria but this was her day off.

Miss KATHERINE SMITH, 1200 Avenue G, Ensley, was contacted and advised on 4/16/68, that she did frequent the A&B Playhouse from time to time but never recalled having her picture taken with a white patron. She was shown artist's conception of UNSUB and advised that she never noticed any person resembling him come into the A&B Playhouse on Graymont Avenue when she was present.
