On 4/17/68, H. GRISHAM MORGAN, Division Freight Agent, Seaboard Coast Line Railroad Company, #30 South 20th Street. Birmingham. Alabama, advised as follows:

The Seaboard Coast Line Railroad at Birmingham owns two pieces of property that is used as parking lots; one is located at the rear of #30 South 20th Street with the entrance on South 19th Street, and the second lot is directly across 19th Street from the entrance of the first parking lot and is on the west side of the street. The two lots have been marked and numbered to accommodate 232 automobiles.

The parking spaces in the two lots are leased to people who work nearby or who are employed by the railroad and the lot is used by the people who lease the spaces, most frequently during the hours between 7:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. Rarely is the space used during the night-time. There is no attendant on either lot.

Among his duties which he performs for the rail-road is to lease the parking spaces in the two parking lots. Occasionally someone will park a car in one of the spaces leased and the person to whom the space is leased will call him and complain. The complainant will furnish the space number and occasionally will furnish the tag number of the car parked in his space. If the tag number is not furnished, MORGAN will go to the space assigned to the complainant and obtain the license number and leave a note on the car. He will then ascertain from the Motor Vehicle Bureau, Jefferson County Court House, the identity of the

person to whom the license is issued and he will then call the person's home and advise him that the vehicle will be pulled in if it is left on railroad property again. Occasionally he will block the space and the owner of the car will have to come to his office before the car can be removed.

He maintains a record on notebooks which lists the complainant's space number, the license tag of the car which had parked in the space, and the person's name to whom the tag is issued as well as the date.

While reading an article in the Birmingham News during the past week regarding the death of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., he noticed the name GALT and a Highland Avenue address, which seemed to ring a bell to him. name ERIC STARVO meant nothing to him. He has since checked his records pertaining to complaints received of cars parked in the parking spaces not assigned to them and has been unable to locate a record of a complaint against GALT. He now believes that the association of the Highland Avenue address was in respect to some students of United Electronics Laboratories, 2717 7th Avenue, South, who lived at a rooming house or hotel on Highland Avenue, with whom he had had trouble in that they were parking cars on the railroad parking lot and he had made calls to the rooming house threatening to have the cars pulled in.

He cannot say that a car registered to anyone by the name of GALT has parked in the company parking lots and after viewing the artist's conception, he stated this meant nothing to him. MORGAN stated that when he first noticed the name of GALT in the newspaper he made some kind of remark at home which his son, JOHN D. MORGAN, overheard but at the time he took no significance to his first impression as he was not sure; had he been sure, he would have called the FBI immediately.



The following investigation was conducted by SA JAMES W. SAMMON on 4/15/68, at Southaven, Mississippi:

Located at the Southaven Minnow Shop, Highway 51 S. one-half mile from the Tennessee State Line, was a quantity of "Schlitz" beer, 12 ounce, pop-top cans in the plastic sixpack holder. This beer was dated "03/158", and was distributed from Clarksdale, Mississippi.

INTERVIEWS WITH PERSONS WHO RENTED ROOMS AT ECONOMY ROOMING HOUSE, BIRMINGHAM, ALABAMA

The following investigation was conducted by SA RAYMOND J. MAXWELL on April 12, 1968:

O. L. BLACK, Route 5, Box 227, Andalusia, Alabama, telephone number 222-1508, telephonically advised that he had not been in Birmingham, Alabama, and did not stay at the Economy Rooming House on Highland Avenue; however, it was his wife, Mrs. O. L. BLACK, and his daughter, Mrs. JAMES E. WELDON, who stayed at the rooming house.

BLACK advised that the name of ERIC STARVO GALT means nothing to him, and that to his knowledge, he has never heard of ERIC STARVO GALT, nor has he ever heard of HARVEY LOWMEYER.

Mrs. O. L. BLACK, telephonically advised that during the fall of 1967 she and her daughter, Mrs. JAMES E. WELDON, Route 4, Box 73, Opelika, Alabama, took Mrs. WELDON's baby to Birmingham, Alabama, for medical treatment. While they were in Birmingham, they stayed at the Economy Rooming House on Highland Avenue. She recalls staying in Rooms 18 and 29 during the period of September 17 through September 24, 1967. Mrs. BLACK advised that when she was not at the hospital where her grandchild was being treated, she would be resting in her room at the Economy Rooming House and she did not mingle with or associate with other people staying at the rooming house. On occasions, she would talk briefly with other women at the rooming house, but she never engaged in any conversation with any men.

Mrs. BLACK advised that the name of GALT and the name of LOWMEYER are not familiar to her, and she definitely does not remember anyone at the rooming house by the name of GALT or LOWMEYER. She stated that if she saw a picture of GALT, she might be able to state whether she had ever seen this individual at the rooming house, but from a description she could not state whether she saw anyone answering GALT's description at the rooming house.

that they wanted her to look at, she would be glad to look at these pictures in an effort to determine if anyone was at the Economy Rooming House during the period of time when she stayed at the rooming house in September, 1967.

The following investigation was conducted by SA HOWARD R. LINSCOTT on April 13, 1968 at Andalusia, Alabama:

Mrs. O. L. BLACK, Route 5, Box 227, Andalusia, Alabama, was shown the sketch of the suspect ERIC STARVO GALT. Mrs. BLACK advised that she had never seen anyone at the rooming house in Birmingham who resembled the photograph. Mrs. BLACK advised that she resided at the rooming house during the period September 17-24, 1967, at which time she was in Birmingham to see about a grandchild of hers who was in the hospital there. Mrs. BLACK advised that the only time she saw any men around the rooming house was in the mornings at breakfast time; however, she stated she had never seen anyone at breakfast who resembled the photograph.

The following investigation was conducted at Opelika, Alabama, by SA ROY H. EVELAND:

On April 12, 1968, JAMES E. WELDON, 23 Dorsey Street, mail address, Route 4, Box 73, Opelika, Alabama, an employee of Ampex Corporation, advised that his wife, SHELLEY WELDON, and his mother-in-law, Mrs. OVIS LEE BLACK, Route 5, Box 227, Andalusia, Alabama, had stayed at the Economy Rooming House, Birmingham, Alabama. for several days during part of 1967. His daughter, . was having an operation and his wife would stay at the hospital with their daughter during the nights and sleep at the rooming house during the days. The mother-in-law would stay with the daughter at thehospital during the days and would sleep at the rooming house at night. He and his wife have been taking their daughter to the Crippled Children's Hospital in Birmingham for five years for corrective operations. He and his wife generally stay at the Economy Rooming House when in Birmingham. He said that if he had been at the Economy Rooming House during September, 1967, it would have been only for an overnight visit. He does not remember anyone at his rooming house by the name of GALT or a similar name and could not place anyone fitting the description as given for suspect ERIC STARVO GALT.

On April 12, 1968 it was ascertained that THOMAS D. FRANKLIN was residing at the Phi Theta Tau, 317 S. College Street, Auburn, Alabama, while attending Auburn University. It was ascertained that on that date he was away from Auburn believed to be attending the Masters Golf Tournament in Augusta, Georgia.

On April 15, 1968, FRANKLIN was contacted on his return to Auburn and advised he had stayed at the Economy Rooming House, 2608 Highland Avenue, Birmingham, for about two weeks during the last part of August and early September, 1967. He advised he was working at the Avondale Mills in North Birmingham under the Co-op Program of Auburn University.

FRANKLIN said that he had seen articles in the newspaper recently, including a sketch of suspect in the killing of MARTIN LUTHER KING at Memphis, Tennessee. He said that he did not know anyone by the name of ERIC STARVO GALT, and he does not recall anyone at the Economy Rooming House who looked like the sketch of the suspect which he had seen in the newspaper. On 4/18/68, Mrs. ELFANOP TODD, 4240 Pulaski St., Birmingham, Alahama, came into the FBI Office. Mrs. TODD advised that she was employed by the Internal Revenue and gave her office phone number as 841-3487. She said she was presently living at 3811 43rd Ate. W., which is the home of her mother.

Mrs TODD advised that a man she knows as RICHAPD DAVIS looks exactly like the picture of MRIC STAPVO GALT that was in the newspaper. She said DAVIS drove a white automobile of sone description but she did not know the make. According to her, DAVIS was an acquaintance of her ex daughter-in-law, MARTHA LOU TODD, who lives on Ave. J in Phsley. She said that DAVIS wived with MARTHA LOU TODD in 1966 and drove an older model black and white Chevrolet with Tennesse plates.

Mrs. MODD said she saw the two of them together in March.

Mrs. TODD said that DAVIS matched the description of GALT given in the paper except his hair was somewhat longer and slightly curley. We claimed to have lived in "untsville and drove a truck for the Canada Dry Bottling Company. Mrs. TODD had with her some belongings of DAVIS'. These included a shirt with a Canada Bry patch on it, ar old Army fatigue cap, and an empty vodka bottle.

DAVIS has the following relatives in Birmingham:

MAUDE DAVIS - Mother

DORIS PILKINGTON - Sister who worked at Britling's on Wighland Ave.

According to Mrs. TODD, MARTIA LOU TODD would probably know where DAYTS is living. MARTIA LOU TODD can be reached through her aunt, Mrs. TINCY HUGHES, 2010 Avenue H, Ensley.

Mrs. TODD said that DAVIS and MARTIA LOW TODD had killed her son, M.J. TODD'S former husband. When ques tioned about this, she said it had been ruled a suicide but she did not beleive it.

Re telephonic conversation between SA J. T. ARNETT, SA MARION B. HUMMEL, and SA DONALD R. SORENSEN on 4/17/68 with reference to a Memphis teletype relating that an informant had advised that an individual known as ERIC GAULDEN, aka "Stevie", was an associate of TOMMY ELLIS PIKE; WILLIAM EUGENE SIDES; GORDON FORBES; and UNSUB, aka "Duke", of Memphis. Teletype indicated that these individuals were possibly operating a stolen car ring on a farm near Huntsville, Alabama and that GAULDEN could be identical to suspect GALT in captioned matter. SA ARNETT advised that review of Birmingham indices of these names reflected that TOMMY ELLIS PIKE and WILLIAM EUGENE SIDES were the only individuals indexed in the Birmingham indices, and these individuals were indexed to Birmingham file 26-25195.

Attached to this memorandum is a copy of Memphis letter to Birmingham, 3/26/68, captioned WILLIAM EUGENE SIDES; TOMMY ELLIS PIKE; JERRY MC GILL; BUD MASON; JIMBO STUART; ITSMV; OO:ME. Of these subjects, JERRY MC GILL is one of the fugitive subjects of Birmingham file 87-7049 entitled JIMMY EARL PARKS, aka-FUGITIVE; JERRY LLOYD MC GILL, aka-FUGITIVE; LINDA DELL MC GILL, aka; ET AL. ITSP. OO: Knoxville.

LINDA DELL MC GILL was apprehended on 3/6/68 by Bureau Agents of Huntsville and Decatur RA's at Decatur, Alabama, and the circumstances leading up to this apprehension are as follows:

Sheriff BUDDY EVANS, Limestone Co., Athens, Alabama, received a routine complaint regarding the residence of an old farm house located on Route 9, Athens, Alabama. Sheriff EVANS made an inquiry regarding this complaint and determined that two couples had been residing at this farm house for

three weeks prior to his inquiry. Immediately after he made his inquiry, they hurriedly abandoned this farm, leaving personal property and other valuables behind. This being quite suspicious, EVANS reported this fact to Bureau Agents, and investigation identified these subjects as MC GILL and his wife LINDA, subject PARKS and an unknown female. Subject LINDA DELL MC GILL was subsequently apprehended at a motel in Decatur, Alabama, but the other subjects were no longer with her and were not apprehended. Their whereabouts are unknown at the present time.

Investigation conducted at this farm house reflected some evidence that possibly this location might have been used to alter stolen automobiles. A wrecked 1968 Chevrolet was abandoned at the house and the serial plate from this vehicle had been removed. A 1968 Chevrolet had been registered at Huntsville, Alabama under the VIN for this wrecked car. The registration was for a fictitious name and address. This car has not been located to date. There was no evidence, however, that any large-scale ring activity had been going on, and there was no indication that other than these four individuals, two male and two female, anyone had been seen in or around this farm house.

In connection with this investigation, SA CRABBE interviewed the landlord of the farm, as well as neighbors, and the results of his interviews do not indicate that anyone other than these two couples were occupants of this farm.

Based upon the above, it would appear that these facts coincide sufficiently with the information set out in Memphis letter, 3/26/68, a copy of which is attached, to assume that this farm and this activity was the farm where MC GILL and PARKS had previously stayed. Concerning Memphis' statement that a contact with these subjects in the Huntsville, Ala. area was PAUL BATES, it should be noted that PAUL BATES is presently incarcerated at the Federal Penitentiary at Atlanta, Ga. and has been there for approximately two years. It would have been impossible for these subjects to have been in contact with PAUL BATES in the immediate past. Also Memphis letter sets out a lead for the

Birmingham Division at Huntsville to contact a Det. YOUNG at the Muntsville PD for further information regarding this farm and this activity. Det. YOUNG is identical with Lt. CARL N. YOUNG (NA), who has been contacted on a continuous basis regarding this matter. Lt. YOUNG is in possession of no additional information. The information which Lt. YOUNG has concerning this matter coincides with the information already known to the FBI, and he has no new or additional information regarding any other farms utilized by these subjects.

In the absence of any descriptive data regarding the individuals referred to by Memphis, no further investigation is contemplated. It is also pointed out that Memphis is aware of the facts set out above, and they were advised that the Birmingham Division was consolidating its file 26-25195 into 87-7049 and suggesting that Memphis consolidate their files.

Lt. JOHN WRIGHT, Burglary Squad, Memphis PD, Memphis, Tenn., advised that an informant of his had furnished information concerning an alleged car theft ring believed to be operating in or near Huntsville, Ala. Lt. WRIGHT stated that this informant had advised that JERRY MC GILL, who is a fugitive at this time, is believed to be living on a farm near Huntsville, Ala. This farm is supposedly used to change identification numbers on automobiles stolen in various sections of the country. According to Lt. WRIGHT, this informant does not have any information as to where the automobiles are sold nor does this informant know where these cars are being stolen.

According to WRIGHT's informant, MC GILL. PIKE and SIDES apparently operate this ring outside the Memphis area. MASON and STUART supposedly are the contacts of this ring in the Memphis area. All of the above mentioned individuals have records with the Memphis PD and have been engaged in burglary and other illegal activities in the past. MC GILL, who is supposedly in the Huntsville area, was contacted by telephone in the recent past at Huntsville by a girl friend named GYPSY KELLY. KELLY has telephone #324-4962 and is the ex-wife of an individual serving time in the TSP at this time. Lt. WRIGHT stated that the informant claims that SIDES and PIKE supposedly hade a late model, gun metal gray Pontiac and a late model Cadillac in the recent past but it is not know if these automobiles are stolen.

Lt. WRIGHT stated that the only contact known to the Memphis PD of these various individuals in the Huntsville

HOOVER, GALT'S TRAVELS IN THE MUSTANG INCLUDED TRIPS TO LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA; NEW ORLEANS, LOUISIANA; BIRMINGHAM, ALABAMA; AND MEXICO, AS WELL AS TO MEMPHIS, TENNESSEE, AND ATLANTA, GEORGIA. GALT WAS REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN IN MEMPHIS ON APRIL 3 AND 4, 1968, AND TO HAVE DEPARTED FROM THERE FOR ATLANTA.

INTENSIVE INESTIGATION BY THE FBI HAS DISCLOSED THAT GALT HAS CLAIMED TO HAVE BEEN EMPLOYED AS A COOK ON MISSISSIPPI RIVER VESSELS AND AS A MERCHANT SEAMAN. HE IS SAID TO BE AN AVID DANCER AND TOOK DANCING LESSONS IN NEW ORLEANS IN 1964 AND 1965; IN BIRMINGHAM DURING SEPTEMBER AND OCTOBER, 1967; AND IN LONG BEACH CALIFORNIA, FROM DECEMBER, 1967 TO FEBRUARY, 1968.

GALT LEFT LOS ANGELES ON DECEMBER 15, 1967, AND DROVE

HIS WHITE MUSTANG TO NEW ORLEANS, WHERE HE CLAIMED HE CONTACTED

EITHER AN ENGINEERING OR A CONTRACTING FIRM. HE LEFT NEW ORLEANS ON

DECEMBER 19TH AND ARRIVED BACK IN LOS ANGELES ON DECEMBER 21, 1967.

WHILE IN THE LOS ANGELES AREA EARLY THIS YEAR, GALT

TOOK A COURSE AT A SCHOOL OF BARTENDING AND WAS GRADUATED ON MARCH 2,

1968.


