ReBuairtel to Atlanta, Birmingham, Los Angeles and Memphis, 4/24/68.

Reairtel contained photo subject, purportedly taken by woman in Mexico. This photograph displayed to Birmingham witnesses JOHN WEBSTER DE SHAZO, JOHN DENNIS HANNERS, DONALD WOODS, U. L. BAKER, PETER CHERPES, WILLIAM DAVID PAISLEY, JR., and HERBERT KELLY on 4/26/68. DE SHAZO stated he thought the photo was a good likeness of subject and HANNERS said it looked "something like" subject, especially the hairline. The remaining witnesses each stated they did not believe this was the subject, and could not identify him from this photo.

These same witnesses were shown the 1966 Missouri prison photo of the subject, and all agreed this was a poor photo of the subject as they each did not remember him being that thin in the face.

Each witness to date has stated the best likeness of the subject is the 1960 Missouri prison profile photo, if hair was added.

C.

It is felt that such an article would receive nationwide publicity with barbers and barbershop owners since the JBHCP publication is sent to each member of the International within the U. S. and AMBB publication is sent to each barber-shop owner within the U. S.

The results of such publication may be of great value in determining whereabouts of subject since, in all probability, subject will use the services of a barber.

PAUL ALVIN LAIL was informed of the identities of the interviewing agents and the nature of this interview.

LAIL advised he is presently living at 34 Barbados Drive, Palm Springs, with his wife BETTY and five month old baby.

LAIL stated he had been an inmate in the Missouri State Penitentiary for three years and while confined there he had met and known JAMES EARL RAY. He stated he was not very close or friendly with RAY but he did eat with him a number of times when he was in the kitchen visiting with his friend, LEWIE "WHITEY" DOWDA. He said he also watched a number of ball games and television programs with RAY.

LAIL described RAY as being a guy who knew his way around but was not one of the wheels or leaders in prison; that RAY was a sharp intelligent guy who hung around with the boys who were always up to something and were in on all of the deals. LAIL advised RAY never seemed to have a lot of money but always seemed to have enough to get whatever he wanted.

LAIL said most of the guys (he cannot recall their names) that he, RAY, was with most of the time were on dope and were peddling it.

LAIL continued by saying that RAY's big buddy was NEAL ABBEY who was a "big wheel" and the guy who ran the prison kitchen with "an iron hand." LAIL stated ABBEY was the guy who got RAY into the kitchen which was a good deal (job).

LAIL advised that LEO BARNETT handled dope and peddled it in the Missouri State Penitentiary and he believes he is now in prison somewhere in Florida. He said that BARNETT would know for certain if RAY had been on dope and where and who he got the dope from.

LAIL further advised that FRED MILLER, "a cut and dried con," who worked in the tag plant of the prison, was one of the leaders and knew RAY well and he might be able to furnish information about him if he would talk to the FBI.

LAIL related that WHITEY DOWDA also knew RAY pretty well and would know more about him than he did since they both worked in the kitchen together for quite a while. He said WHITEY had been living in Marietta, Georgia, and he recently heard that WHITEY is now in jail in Marietta on a robbery charge.

LAIL stated there had been trouble with some of the Negro prisoners in the Missouri State Penitentiary who were Black Muslims so some of the prisoners decided to teach them a lesson and three or four of the Negro leaders were killed. LAIL stated he did not know if RAY was in on the actual killing, but he was close with the ones that did it and therefore could have been in on the killing or at least he knew who did kill the Negroes.

LAIL would not make any further statements about the killing of the Negroes in the Missouri State Penitentiary and he stated he could not furnish any names or identities but he did say there were ten inmates who were in on the killing of the Negroes.

LAIL said he could not recall RAY saying too much about Negroes and he does not believe from his conversations with RAY that he, RAY, was a racist, however, all of the inmates in the Missouri State Penitentiary did not like the Negroes because of their belligerent attitude and animosity toward the white inmates.

LAIL stated RAY liked to wear his hair short in the summer months and long in the winter. He said RAY used to have a "butch" cut in the summer months.

LAIL stated from his association with RAY that he felt RAY would have a .45 automatic "stashed" on his person somewhere and he would not give up or be taken without a fight. LAIL said RAY is a "killer" in his opinion and that RAY would not be easy to catch or find. LAIL said RAY is "a city boy" and he does not figure him to be hiding out in the country. However, LAIL stated he would not figure RAY would hide out in a really big city like New York, but would pick one about the size of Houston, Texas.

LAIL said he could not recall RAY telling him or mentioning any place in particular he, RAY, always wanted to go to or visit, but he felt RAY would be in a warm climate rather than a cold one.

LAIL stated he had not been contacted or heard from RAY since he got out of the Missouri State Penitentiary over two years ago and to the best of his knowledge RAY would not know where or how to contact him.

LAIL advised he had visited WHITEY DOWDA in March, 1968, in WHITEY's home in Marietta, Georgia, for a few days. He said that WHITEY is his best friend.

LAIL continued by saying he recognized the name of SCHAFER and he thinks SCHAFER was a captain in the prison guard force, but he did not know him and/or if SCHAFER peddled dope in the pen.

LAIL stated he felt that there was a possibility RAY's escape was engineered by and assisted by outside help but he did not have any knowledge about it. Also he stated just about anything is possible with outside help and money, however, escape from the Missouri State Penitentiary is something else and is just about impossible in his opinion.

LAIL stated he did not feel badly about MARTIN LUTHER KING getting killed, but he was sorry it happened in Memphis, Tennessee, and he would have rather seen KING killed in some Northern city. LAIL said he is a Southerner and his feelings are Southern.

LAIL stated that he is of course interested in the reward money and he could certainly use it. However, he said he really does not know if he would turn RAY in or not for the reward money if he had the opportunity. LAIL stated he was certain RAY did the killing of KING himself and not involved with anyone else. LAIL stated that he wanted to be honest with the FBI and he would have to think about this a couple of days as to whether or not he would or would not turn RAY in if he knew his possible or current whereabouts.

LAIL stated he really does not know where RAY is and he said that RAY had not contacted him and he had not seen RAY for over two years.

LAIL continued by saying he was a little surprised when he learned from the newspaper and television that RAY had been identified as KING's killer because he always figured RAY as being a guy that would be too smart to leave any clues or evidence around so that the police or the FBI would be able to trace and/or identify him.

LAIL examined the photographs of RAY and said he would never recognize him with the tuxedo and bow tie outfit on and further he said he never saw RAY with his hair long as it is either. However, he said the guy with the bow tie and tuxedo on is RAY.

LAIL said after thinking it over that he is very interested in the money and if he thinks of anything or comes up with anything concerning RAY, he will contact either Special Agent PATRICK A. PHILBIN or ROBERT W. WISEMAN.

LAIL is a white male, born [redacted] Marion, North Carolina, 175 pounds, blue eyes, red hair, medium slender build, 6' 3", wife BETTY, and resides 34 Barbados Drive, Palm Springs, Florida.

Referenced airtel reflects the FBI advised that pillow case and bed sheet located in Atlanta on 4/11/68 contained Thermo-seal laundry tapes, yellow in color, containing the code "208-3" with the first three characters of the code being 15 point type and the last two characters being 13 point type.

Enclosed herewith for the FBI Laboratory are four pages of sample laundry marks bearing the code, "208-3" as made by four Thermo-seal machines, located at the Oak Park Cleaners, 3314 East Broadway, Tampa, Florida on 4/23/68. These machines contained the serial numbers 31630, 31603, 31721, and 32140, and produce a five character laundry mark with the first three characters being a 15 point type and the last two characters 13 point type.

He saw the photo of the man in the Martin Luther King case flashed on TV at the end of the FBI program and the request for assistance from the public in this matter.

He felt compelled to express the following opinion. He believes the FBI has become very political and he does not believe it is a good thing for the FBI or the country. He does not know if Mr. Hoover is responsible for this and recalled that Mr. Hoover called Dr. King a liar a few year ago and never retracted the statement. He suspects the President, the AG and Mr. Goldberg of the IT as responsible for this political turn by the FBI.

Mr. WADE HARMAN described himself as a Lt. Col. in the Ala. State Militia, a businessman and a long time resident of Alabama. He advised further that he is a "strict segregationist" but he does not condone murder.

He was advised that his opinion would be made a matter of record, as requested.

It was pointed out to MR. HARMAN that the killing of Dr. King was a violation of federal Civil Rights statutes and that the FBI would investigate this matter, like all other cases within our jurisdiction, to the full limit of our ability and without apology to anyone.

WEST, a native of Birmingham, Alabama, owns a home there at 3514 7th Avenue South, which he rents to R. T. CAMERON. This property has been managed for him by a cousin, GENEVA HARDEMON, 219 67th Street, who also operates a beauty school under her own name.

After visiting his son at Forrest Park, Georgia, Mr. WEST arrived in Birmingham and checked into the Bama Motel, 6712 First Avenue North, shortly after noon on 4/4/68. He remained there until 4/9/68 or 4/10/68 when he left to return to Dayton, Ohio where he is employed as a photo engraver by the McCall Corporation.

WEST had traveled to Birmingham to remove certain personal property from the home he owns there and through attorney J. CARTER MC FERRIN to initiate eviction proceedings against his tenant.

WEST who made the trip alone took with him in his automobile a .44 caliber Marlin carbine which he inadvertently left in his room at the Bama Motel. On the day he checked out of the Motel he discovered after traveling some distance that he had left the carbine in his motel room, and he stopped at a pay phone from which he contacted a man at the motel who informed him that they had the rifle. WEST told him to give the rifle to his cousin, GENEVA HARDEMON, above, who would ship it to him. The man he talked with at the motel indicated that he is acquainted with Mrs. HARDEMON and that this would be done.

WEST called his cousin on the night of 4/21/68 to find out if she had shipped his rifle and was told by her that a maid at the Bama Motel had reported the matter of the rifle to the FBI at Birmingham and possibly the Birmingham PD. Mrs. HARDEMON told him that FBI agents had been to her home and examined the rifle after which she was told to hold onto the rifle and not ship it to Mr. WEST.

WEST suggested that his cousin might be confused and that she had probably been visited by Birmingham detectives rather than FBI agents.

WEST is willing he said to cooperate with law enforcement in anyway possible where his carbine is concerned; however, he is interested in its return to him. He has no record of the serial number on the weapon but stated he bought it from a fellow employee at the McCall Corporation in Dayton more than a year ago and has a cancelled check for the purchase of the weapon.

As an additional means of securing widespread publicity concerning Ray, offices covering the place of publication of magazines which have previously cooperated in publicizing FBI fugitives should request the assistance of such publications in carrying an article on captioned fugitive. The Bureau press release, copies of which are available in each office, along with a glossy photograph of this fugitive can be furnished. The earliest possible utilization of this material should be encouraged and special attention should be given to publications aimed at minority groups.

CHARLES R. MASHBURN, Route 1, Owens Cross Roads, was located on 4/30/68, and interviewed by the writer. MASHBURN advised he was sentenced from Portageville, Mo., to the best of his recollection, in 1961. He received two four-year sentences to run consecutively. He was released in July of 1965, on parole to Alabama.

MASHBURN advised that the name JAMES EARL RAY sounds vaguely familiar to him and he believes that he had heard that name while in prison at Jefferson City, but he does not know him. After being shown a photograph of RAY, MASHBURN advised that the photograph also looks vaguely familiar, but he could not definitely say that he recalls it from his prison time. He said a good possibility exists that the familiarity of the picture and the name could be caused by the recent publicity which RAY has been given.

MASHBURN advised that in 1963, he was sent to the prison farm known as Renze Farm and remained at the farm until he was paroled. He is positive that RAY was not at the farm. MASHBURN also stated he is positive that RAY was not in his particular cell block at the main prison because he knew the prisoners in his own cell block. He said there were three different cell blocks and that the only time the prisoners from the three cell blocks were together was on Sunday when they were all in the yard at the same time.

Concerning dope at the prison, MASHBURN said that he personally did not use any, even while he was in prison, and has no personal knowledge of any traffic in dope; however, he does know dope and narcotics were available and he knows that one guard whose nickname was "PADDLE FOOT" was fired, prior to 1963 when MASHBURN was sent to the prison farm, for "fooling with dope."
