Re telephone call of SA NEIL G. MARTIN, Birmingham, on 5/3/68.

Telephone conversation on Friday morning, 5/3/68, of SA NEIL G. MARTIN advised that a RODNEY GENTLE, who works for the Civil Defense Mobilization Board at Scottsboro, Alabama, telephoned and advised that a 1967 blue Stingray automobile, 1968 Alabama License 39-2400, was stolen from the County Square in Scottsboro, on 5/2/68. GENTLE advised that a person said one of the men who stole the car looked like JAMES EARL RAY. On 5/3/68, Mr. MAX ROBERTSON, Jackson County Sheriff's Office, advised that License 39-2400 belongs to a RODNEY GENTLE. Mr. ROBERTSON advised that GENTLE has a reputation in the Scottsboro, Alabama area as being a drunk and going on three and four day binges. ROBERTSON advised that he was on duty last night when GENTLE's wife came in about 12:00 midnight looking for her husband, whom she said was on a drunk. Mr. ROBERTSON further advised that the 1967 Stingray in question was found wrecked in Jackson County.

State Trooper BENNY LEVELL was contacted and advised he handled the wreck of the 1967 blue Stingray. Trooper LEVELL advised that the car was driven by Miss SUE MORRIS, 309 E Laurel Street, Scottsboro, Alabama. Trooper LEVELL advised that he interviewed Miss MORRIS and she advised that she was with RODNEY GENTLE until about 11:30 P.M., and she was driving his car. She advised him that he was in a drunken condition and she left him off and went to a party, and on the way to the party she wrecked the 1967 blue Stingray. Trooper LEVELL advised that during the interview with Miss MORRIS she advised that there was never another man in the car. This automobile is currently stored at Hardin Ford, Scottsboro, Alabama, in a wrecked condition.

In view of the above information, it is suggested that no further investigation be conducted concerning this lead.

On 4/6/68, Mr. CHARLES C. DAWSON, 1723 11th Place South, Birmingham, personally appeared at the Birmingham Office of the FBI and advised that he desired to furnish some information concerning the KING assassination in Memphis, Tennessee. He advised that he and his wife occupy a downstairs apartment at 1723 11th Place South, and that on 3/30/68, a man and woman came to look at the upstairs apartment at 1723 11th Place South, and that they moved into this apartment on 4/1/68. He said that he has not observed this individual since this day, and pointed out that when he first observed this individual, he closely resembled ERIC STARVO GALT, being sought in connection with the KING assassination. He said that he did not know if this individual could be identical, but desired to furnish this information to the FBI for whatever action they deemed necessary.

On 4/7/68, SA's WILLIAM A. SAUCIER and ROBERT M. BARRETT contacted Mrs. MALTA VINES, 1727 11th Place South, who advised that she owns the property at 1723 11th Place South, which consists of a downstairs apartment and upstairs apartment. She said that Mr. CHARLES C. DAWSON and wife occupy the downstairs portion, and that Mr. JOHNNIE RAY SHORE and wife occupy the upstairs apartment, having moved in on 4/2/68. She said that Mr. SHORE allegedly is employed at a filling station and described him around 30 years of age, 5'10", 160 pounds, with light brown hair.

On the same date, JOHNNIE RAY SHORE was contacted at the above residence, and through personal observation, it was determined that he was not identical with ERIC STARVO GALT.

Referenced airtel advised that the FBI Laboratory stated that a pillowcase and bed sheet were found in the trunk of the 1966 Mustang registered to GALT which was located in Atlanta, 4/11/68.

These items contained Thermo-Seal laundry tapes of approximately the same size as tapes on items previously recovered but were yellow in color and contain the code "20R-3".

In the opinion of the Textile Marketing Machine Company. Syracuse, New York, the tapes were produced by a different machine than previous tapes, since the first three characters are 15 point type and the last two characters are 18 point type.

The company suggests the 20 in the above code would be the lot number; the R may mean that this was a return of a batch of laundry; and the 3 is the bundle number.

The Memphis Division set forth a lead for all offices to recontact laundries determined to be operating the Thermo-Seal marking machines in an effort to locate laundry using the code 20R-3.

- 1. Reference is made to this Agency's out message number 94270 dated 25 April 1968 concerning the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther KING, Jr.
- 2. On 16 April Roderick Claflin BROWN, a Panamanian national born 1 July 1917 in British Honduras, voluntarily appeared at the Department of National Investigations (DENI) of the Republic of Panama and signed a deposition, the highlights of which are as follows:
- (1) On 26 October 1962 he served as cook/seaman aboard the Texaco S.S. Southhampton which docked at Mobile, Alabama.
- (2) While on a shore visit to the Mobile airport on the morning of 26 October 1962 in the company of two fellow Panamanian seamen, he was approached by Marvin P. LITTRELL, owner of LITTRELL Notor Co., 921-25 South Clinton Street, Athens, Alabama, who after ascertaining BROWN was a Panamanian seaman, asked if he knew of Dr. Martin Luther KING, Jr.
- (3) LITTRELL inquired whether BROWN was interested in employment, the details of which were unspecified. He went on to describe Dr. KING as "Our greatest problem who is causing us much trouble." He gave BROWN a business card to use in the event he was interested in pursuing the employment offer.
- (4) On 28 January 1963 BROWN wrote LITTRELL from New York City, stating he was interested in a job and





requested \$75 for travel from New York City to Mobile. On 2 February 1963 BROWN received a reply from LITTRELL, restating that he had a job waiting for BROWN in Alabama, but questioning why \$75 was needed since the fare was less than \$40 by bus.

- (5) After discussions with a relative and friends in New York City, BROWN suspected that the LITTRELL job offer was related with assassination plans for Dr. KING. Therefore he did not respond to the LITTRELL letter and dismissed the incident until the death of Dr. KING in April 1968. BROWN returned to Panama in 1964.
- 3. Enclosed for your information is a copy of the LITTRELL letter and the Spanish language deposition made by BROWN, as well as an English translation of the deposition as described in paragraph 2 of the referenced out message.

Report submitted by Roderick Claflin Brown

In Panama City at 2:45 p.m. on 18 April 1968, Roderick Claflin Brown appeared before the undersigned Chief of the Homicide Section of the National Investigation Department to submit a report dealing with the present investigation. Unsworn and without any hurry, and in complete liberty to answer or not the question put to him. Asked to identify himself, he said his name is as given, male. Honduran national, Negro, 50 years old, born on British Honduras; married, barber by trade, son of Charles T. Brown (deceased) and Drucilla Elizabeth Castro de Brown, with personal Identity Card residing at Pueblo Nuevo, Calle 5, house # 4505, room #3, lower floor.

QUESTION: Declarant, explain the reason why you have come to the Homicide Section today? ANSWER: Because of the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, about which I learned from the press, radio, and television in this country; after thinking over the problem that the United States was living through because of the crime against Dr. King, and having gone through an experience there in the United States that may throw some light on that I communicated to a friend of mine here in Panama City, and he advised me to talk to Inspector Cordoba, of the National Investigation Department; the latter suggested that I present and sign a declaration to that effect, and I gave him a letter which I am keeping to have a photo-copy made so that it can be added to my declaration. On 18 April 1962 I left Tocumen airport here in Panama City, for Port of Spain, where I was to go on board the SS SOUTHAMPTON TEXACO, on which I was to be the cook. I was employed on this ship for six months: I travelled throughout Africa, Venezuela, Trinidad, Canada, and Mobile, Alabama. We arrived in Alabama on 26 October 1962 around 10:30 in the morning. We left the pier toward the Mobile airport at 12:30 P.M. along with two friends who were also sailors on their way to Panama, Pedro ROUSE, son of Dr. Pedro ROUSE, and Victor RODMAN, who lives at #5268 1st St., Juan Diaz, here in Panama City.

While waiting for the airplane Mr. Marvin LITTRELL called me to his table in the airport cafeteria. Up to that moment I did not knowhis name nor had I met him. Later on he asked me to have a cup of coffee, and he asked the following question: "Are you students or tourists?" I replied that we were neither, only sailors on our way to Panama or home. He kept asking questions, and asked if I had visited the United States previously, and whether I liked the U.S. I answered that I did not like the United States, I simply

adored it, which gave way to more questions.

He asked if I would like to stay. I asked how I could do that, and he replied: "My Party is in power." Besides, he owned one or two automobile dealerships, and owned real state.

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For that reason he could get favors from the government at anytime. That is when he said: "I'll employ you, and get an apartment for you." But he then asked me a question: "Do you know Martin Luther King?" I replied that I did not, but that I had read something about him and his activities. Then hr. Littrell said: "This man is the only problem that we have in our way; he is causing us a great deal of inconvenience." I said that our time at the airport was very limited, and we were to leave in ten or fifteen minutes, and for that reason we could not evaluate our conversation carefully.

At that moment he took one of his cards, and said: "As soon as you get to Panama write to me at this address

if you are interested in working for me."

When I left his table I told Pedro and Victor about the subject of conversation, and we all agreed that what this man wanted was for us to kill Dr. Luther King, and we reached that conclusion because of the conversation with Mr. Littrell.

On that occasion we returned to Panama. but upon reaching Miami, Florida, around 10:30 P.M., I was told at the airport that I could not leave for Panama because I needed a visa in order to return. I immediately went to Immigration at the airport and reported what was happening to me, and with the aid of Immigration I was able to find the agent of the ship in which I travelled, and he got me a room at the airport hotel.

Because this happened on a weekend I had to stay at the airport until Monday, when I got to the Panamanian Embassy and got a visa; arriving in Panama on 31 ctober

1962.

I was in Panama during the celebration of the national holidays, and on 5 November I got a visa for New York. I stayed in Panama until 23 December and left for New York at 12:05 on 24 December and arrived in the

airport in New York at 12:30 the same day.

I stayed in New York until 28 January 1963. While in "ew York I decided to write to Mr. Marvin P. LITTRELL to get more information about the job about which we had talked. It was then that I received the letter dated 2 February 1963, copy of which, signed by Mr. Littrell, is in the photocopy that I am civing to this office. I am keeping the original. In the letter that I sent him I asked him to send me \$75 (US), which I was to use on a trip to Mobile. Alabama.

I did not know how much the ticket from New York to Alabama was, but I thought that \$75 was sufficient for the trip, because I had previously travelled from New York to New Orleans by train and it had cost me only \$46, and thinking that Mobile, Alabama, was farther down than New Orleans, it was going to cost more than \$45.

But this gentleman told me in his reply that he did not understand why I needed \$75, since bus fare from New York to Mobile was less than \$40. Then I took his letter and had a meeting with my relatives in New York, and they advised me not to answer the letter, let alone take the trip to Mobile, Alabama, to find out what kind of job it was. Because of the conversation that this man and I had at the airport. and this letter, my relatives understood that the only job that this man might give me was to murder Dr. Martin Luther King. If I were to go to Mobile and refuse the job I was sure that I would not leave Mobile, Alabama, alive.

It was then that I decided to follow the advice of my family. Nevertheless, I spoke with some other people in New York City to get their opinion. They had the same idea that my family had. I forgot about the matter after that, but I kept the letter.

I remained in New York until 30 May 1964, when I returned to Panama. I am not sure that this is the man who organized the murder of Dr. Hartin Luther King, but this may be a clue leading to the person or persons responsible for the act. He was asked the following: Has the declarant anything to add about which he has not been questioned during this inquiry? He answered: This is all that I have to say about this case.

And that being the case, this inquiry is declared completed. It was read and found in order and signed by all those concerned.


