For information of the Bureau and the Memphis Division, the following is set forth:

On 5/23/68, the Birmingham Division personally contacted all television stations in Birmingham, as well as local daily newspapers, these being "The Birmingham Post-Herald" and "The Birmingham News." The purpose of these contacts was to solicit their continuous cooperation in affording the MURKIN investigation all possible news coverage in an effort to develop any information concerning the possible whereabouts of JAMES EARL RAY.

A photograph of RAY, which was made in California last January (1968), which witnesses say resembles him more nearly than any other they have seen, was furnished to the television stations and newspapers for their assistance in affording this matter appropriate news coverage.

The aforementioned television stations and newspapers were most receptive and pledged their continuous cooperation in assisting the Bureau in bringing about RAY's apprehension. As a result of these contacts, the photograph of RAY, as well as a story concerning the KING assassination received front-page publicity in all editions of the Birmingham newspapers. This

The TCR-1 is actually completed or filled in by banks, savings and loan associations and other financial type institutions when a transaction involves a deposit, withdrawal, or other payment or transfer effected by, through, or to such financial institution, which involves U.S. Currency as follows:

- 1. Transactions involving \$2,500 or more of U.S. Currency in denominations of \$100 or higher.
- 2. Transactions involving \$\frac{10,000}{010,000} or more of U.S. Currency in any denomination.
- 3. Transactions involving any amount in any denomination, which in the judgment of the financial institution exceed those commensurate with the customary conduct of the person or organization concerned.

After the TCR-1 Forms are executed they are then sent to the Federal Reserve Banks and their branches, who in turn retain them for about one month and at which time they are then sent on to IRS Intelligence Units in the particular area.

In a recent major case (YOUNGNAP) within the Los Angeles Division, the above information became known, and as a result a Confidential Source was developed who furnishes us copies of these forms on a weekly basis. In reviewing the data on such forms it was believed that the information would be of value in investigations relating to Anti-Racketeering, Federal Reserve Act, Bankruptcy, Ascertaining Financial Ability, Fraud Against the Government, Bank Robbery and larceny cases as well as Security type matters.

For the above reason the Los Angeles Division opened a dead file captioned:

"CURRENCY TRANSACTIONS, REPORTS OR PERSONS OR ORGANIZATIONS INVOLVED AR"

And copies of all the TCR-1 Forms received since March 3, 1968 have been filed alphabetically in a special indices after they have been indexed to the general office index. These forms are then reviewed periodically for individuals whose name continually reappear for possibly anti-racketeering matters.

Enclosed for the Eureau and each office receiving this communication is one unexecuted copy of the TCR-1 Form.

For information of the Bureau, the Los Angeles Division is currently reviewing the TCR-1 Forms for individuals who may have made a \$10,000 withdrawal of funds and appropriate investigation will be conducted as to each such individual.

The Bureau may wish to have each office contact the IRS Intelligence Units within their division and review copies of these forms for the month of April, 1968. It is believed that this would expidite coverage of the requested lead and cover a larger geographical area.

On May 17, 1968, at approximately 1:00 p.m., the writer received a telephone call from JACK NELSON, who identified himself as a Reporter for "The Los Angeles Times," and working out of Atlanta. Georgia. NELSON stated that he was at that time in the office of Chief of Police W. FLOYD DYAR, Huntsville, Alabama, and that he had some information concerning captioned matter, which he desired to make available to the FBI. The writer proceeded to the office of COP DYAR where he met NELSON and Chief DYAR. thereafter proceeded to read a teletype which he stated came from his City Editor in Los Angeles, California. COP DYAR had his private secretary transcribe verbatim the contents of this teletype, a copy of which is attached hereto. Concerning the source of this information, NELSON advised that they were receiving the information from an anonymous but Mive source who would not identify himself to them. NELSON stated that this same information was at that time also being furnished to the FBI in Los Angeles, Memphis, Kansas City, and Miami.

This information was furnished to the SAC, who advised that investigation should be conducted to definitely establish the falsity of this information.

The following investigation was conducted at Huntsville, Alabama:

At the time the information was received from NELSON, Chief DYAR caused the name of EDDIE WILBURN to be searched through the records of the Police Department and advised that they could locate one card indicating

that an EDDIE WILBURN, an insurance salesman, age 50, on November 18, 1966, had reported a burglary at his home address, Route 3, Box 215, Oakwood Road, Huntsville, Alabama. No additional information was available at that time.

The current city directory and telephone directory for Huntsville, Alabama, were reviewed for the name of EDDIE WILBURN and no listing could be located. The City Directory reflected one EDWARD WILBURN, residing at 3337 Delia, wife VIVA, and employed as an Assistant Manager for SHOCKLEY's Restaurant, Huntsville. SA ALLEN J. GILSON attempted to locate this EDWARD WILBURN and determined that he was no longer employed by SHOCKLEY's Restaurant and his current whereabouts was unknown. The records of the Huntsville Credit Bureau were checked under the names of EDDIE and EDWARD WILBURN. No record could be located for EDDIE WILBURN; however, the records did reflect a report for EDWARD WILBURN, who had been on file since December of 1965, at which time he resided at 3003 Ford Place, Huntsville. His wife was named VIVA and he was employed as Assistant Manager, SHOCKLEY's Restaurant, Huntsville, Alabama. His wife was employed as a supervisor for the Southern Bell Telephone Company. Huntsville. He had last been checked in December of 1965.

Mr. R. L. JAMES, Security Officer, Southern Bell Telephone Company, was contacted and furnished information from the employment records of Southern Bell Telephone Company, indicating that VIVA WILBURN was married to EDWARD WILBURN. She had been employed by the Southern Bell Telephone Company for a number of years. It was determined that EDWARD and VIVA WILBURN currently resided at 445 East Madison Street, Pulaski, Tennessee, and that EDWARD WILBURN operates the bus station cafe at Pulaski, Tennessee, telephone number 363-1416.

SA ADOLPH R. MARX, JR. checked the membership records of the VFW Club, Huntsville, and was advised that there was no EDDIE or EDWARD WILBURN who was a member of the VFW Club. He ascertained that one ESMOND WILBURN, who is also known as Eddie Wilburn, and was an insurance salesman, had frequented the VFW Club on occasion but was not a member. The Motor Vehicle License Records of Madison County were reviewed and it was determined that ESMOND WILBURN, of Route 3, Box 215, Huntsville, had registered a 1967 Dodge Dart and had been issued 1968 Alabama license 47-15645. There was no record under the name of any license having been issued under the name of EDDIE WILBURN.

SA DAN STEPHENS, Montgomery, Alabama, telephonically advised that he had caused a check to be made of the registrations for the entire State of Alabama and no license had been issued under the name of EDDIE WILBURN, WILBORN, or WILBOURN.

A review of the City Directory under the name of ESMOND WILBURN reflected that ESMOND WILBURN, of Route 3, Box 215, Huntsville, in 1966, was employed by the Associated Doctors Health & Life Insurance, Times Building, Huntsville, Alabama. There was no listing subsequent to this time. Efforts to contact Associated Doctors Health & Life Insurance Company, Times Building, Huntsville, were negative inasmuch as this firm was closed for the night. SAS LEON No. FRANKENFIELD and ADOLPH R. MARX, JR. made efforts to locate ESMOND WILBURN, Route 3, Huntsville, with negative results.

Arrest records of the Huntsville Police Department under the name of ESMOND WILBURN, reflected under Huntsville Police Department No.006526, that WILBURN received a traffic ticket on July 6, 1966, at which time he was driving a four-door brown Cadillac, bearing 1966 Alabama license 47-45597. He was also arrested on August 31, 1934, on a charge of petty larceny which was dismissed. He was arrested on June 12, 1939, on a charge

of petty larceny and fined \$25.00. This file reflects that he was described as a white male; born at Paint Rock, Alabama; height 5' 9"; weight 165 pounds; eye blue; residence Route 3, Box 215 Oakwood Road, Huntsville, Alabama.

On the morning of May 18, 1968, ESMOND GRANVILLE WILBURN was located at his place of employment, Associated Doctors Health & Life Insurance Company, Times Building, Huntsville. He was interviewed by the writer and SASLEON N. FRANKENFIELD. WILBURN advised that he had not been out of the Huntsville area since December of 1967, at which time he and his wife had visited relatives in Ohio. reviewed his daily report sheets and determined that on April 4, 1968, he sold a policy to an individual by the name of THOMAS E. GRIFFITH, of Route 3, Guntersville, Alabama. This sale was recorded on the records on April 5, 1968, indicating that he was personally in Huntsville, Alabama, on April 5, 1968. The record reflected that on April 3, 1968, he sold an insurance policy to VASTHI S. GROSSO, 411 Kyle Street, Scottsboro, Alabama, which policy was reported on April 4, 1968, indicating that he was personally present in Huntsville, Alabama, on April 4, 1968. JAMES MALONE, Manager, Associated Doctors Health & Life Insurance Company, was interviewed, and from his daily production records and also his personal recollection, accounted for WILBURN's presence in Huntsville, Alabama, on April 4, 5, and 6, 1968.

SA STEPHEN L. CRABBE, Decatur Resident Agency, contacted all motels in the Athens, Alabama, area with negative results.

The day before shooting of King, Ray was in Athens Alabama and was taken to Memphis. There registered in a rooming-house with Samuel Lewis, back-up man who was supposed to shoot King Anyalley if Ray missed.

Ray walked off two or three blocks with a girl and a bey accompanied with a man, with a new Buick, Alabama plates supposedly beginning with 14. The car is owned and driven by Eddie Wilburn of Huntsville. And, is equipped with a police radio.

Lewis is supposed to have stayed overnight in the roominghouse in Memphis where shots were fired. Then took a bus to Knoxville and then took a bus to Los Angeles.

Ray, two girls and a child were driven out of Memphis by Wilburn in the blue Buick and went to Kansas City, trip took 6½ hours. On 5/26/68 DAVID PETTUS, Clerk, Southern Airlines, Anniston Municipal Airport, advised an individual at the terminal who was waiting for the 1:30PM flight looked like JAMES EARL RAY.

SAS LARRY K. SYLVESTER and JEREMIAH J. SMITH proceeded to the airport and this individual identified himself as Dr. DWIGHT OLIVER CHAMBERS, residing Box 307, Blackburg, Virginia, and employed at Virginia Polytechnic Institute. He advised he had been visiting Dr. LONG, President of Talladega College, which is approximately 20 miles south of the airport. It was noted that CHAMBERS was age 33, 5'9" tall, 160 pounds, short brown hair. CHAMBERS exhibited Virginia driver's license number 480365 and his flight ticket indicated he was flying to Roanoke, Virginia via Piedmont Airlines ticket number 873352.

Although there were some similarities in the general physical description as to approximate height, weight, and hair there was no facial characteristics to suggest that CHAMBERS was identical with the subject.

CHAMBERS was advised that he was questioned as to his identity as he resembled the general description of a fugitive but he was not advised of fugitive's name as it was quite apparent that he did not resemble subject's facial features. Above submitted for information.

Mr. WALTER WHITTEN, Rural Route, Hackleburg, Alabama, who resides near the Antioch Church on Highway 237, advised as follows on 5/21/68:

HOWARD SIDE has never resided at WHITTEN's home; however, he said HOWARD's brother, LLOYD SIDE, a nephew, came to WHITTEN's home on 4/14/68, stating he had come there from Foley, Alabama, where he had been living on a part-time basis with his brother, HOWARD SIDE, who receives his mail at Box 166, Foley, Alabama.

WHITTEN stated that this was the first time SIDE has been to his home or in this area since SIDE's mother and WHITTEN's sister died many years ago. SIDE's father is PURVIE SIDE, age about 80 years, who is said to reside at an unidentified hotel or rooming house somewhere in Jasper, Alabama. WHITTEN advised that LLOYD SIDE stated he had a daughter, BONNIE WHITE, who was employed in an unknown capacity by the Birmingham Police Department. WHITTEN reported that his nephew, LLOYD SIDE, departed from WHITTEN's home on 5/11/68, and did not state where he intended to go. He pointed out that LLOYD had been married; however, he was presently not living with his family and WHITTEN did not know where other members of LLOYD SIDE's family might be located. WHITTEN stated LLOYD SIDE may have been arrested in the past for offenses such as public drunkenness; however, he said he knew of no major difficulty in which SIDE had ever been connected and had no reason to believe that SIDE had ever spent time in a penitentiary.

Ex-convict JAMES W. BROWN reinterviewed at his present residence, Talladega, Ala., and following is synopsis of additional information obtained:

BROWN was shown all available photos of JAMES EARL RAY and picked out photo taken at bartending school as one most resembling RAY. Concerning other photo taken of RAY in California in January or February, 1968, BROWN said this did not resemble RAY, but did strongly resemble a person who came to a gas station where BROWN worked in June, 1967, in Reform, Ala. This person was driving a late-model red Mustang, and was accompanied by two white males, one being an ex-convict from the Missouri State Pen, TNU ALLEN, other unknown to BROWN. BROWN had no conversation with driver of Mustang, but ALLEN, whom BROWN had known in the pen, told BROWN that he and his two friends were going to Tuscaloosa, Ala., from Columbus, Ga. ALLEN had been released from pen few months before BROWN (June, 1965.) BROWN claimed he had seen ALLEN and RAY in conversations in the pen on several occasions and that BROWN was positive that ALLEN and BROWN knew each other.

BROWN claimed that ALLEN was considered to be a "stool pigeon" inside the pen. ALLEN came from Kennett, Mo., and had been convicted of robbery. BROWN claimed that RAY was living in F Hall when BROWN met him through JOHNNY VELANTI, and that ALLEN also lived in F Hall. (Review of Kansas City report dated 5/15/68 fails to indicate that RAY ever lived in F Hall; however, it is noted that in St. Louis report of 5/10/68, VELANTI claimed that RAY did live in F Hall.)

BROWN claimed the information he was furnishing concerned JAMES EARL RAY and he did not have him confused with any prisoners with similar names such as JAMES RAYE (as claimed by VELANTI) or JAMES WRAY.

BROWN claimed that VELANTI once said he, VELANTI, could get along in Mexico if he ever got there, and that he, VELANTI, would go to some small town past Mexico City to hide out, if he ever escaped. VELANTI named the town, but BROWN can not recall name. This claim was made in presence of RAY. VALENTI also claimed he had run off from an orphans home at the age of 14, and was later "taken in" and raised by a Sheriff. VELANTI then became involved in allowing the escape of several prisoners being held by this Sheriff in Louisiana. Because of their close association in the pen, BROWN said it was most likely that RAY and VELANTI would get together outside.

BROWN continued to claim he had no knowledge of any convict organization in the pen, but it appeared to interviewing agents that he was possibly withholding information when pressed on this point. He said there were several poker games operated by certain convicts and that some others took bets on sporting events. One of these was JOHNNIE JOHNSON, who operated a game with his half-brother BOBBY ASHE. BROWN claimed he had seen JOHNSON and RAY in several conversations together and that RAY usually always played in the game operated by JOHNSON and ASHE.

BROWN identified one "SLICK" STEDHAM (ph) as a poker game operator who also was used to collect gambling debts inside the pen.

BROWN identified his closest friends in the pen as DONALD COX from St. Louis, who left in 1963 after serving

five years on robbery conviction; CHESTER EELEY (ph) from St. Louis, who is still confined; CHARLIE LAWSON, from St. Louis, who was released in 1965 after serving assault sentence, and WALTER STRAKEY, who is now believed to be in the Texas State Pen.

These records revealed that HILL was convicted of Grand Theft in the Circuit Court, State of Missouri, County of Barton on 10/10/66, and was sentenced to State Prison. HILL was paroled to California from Missouri on 5/16/67.

A social evaluation of HILL reveals he has average intelligence, but has a noticeable difficulty accurately expressing himself. His lack of education tends to be magnified by his hillbilly accent, and backwoods logic.

HILL was on parole from Missouri and had been out of that institution only a very short period of time prior to his involvement leading to his arrest and continual confinement since 6/17/67.

On 5/24/68, FLOYD EVANS HILL, California State Prison No. Bllll2 was interviewed at the above institution and furnished the following information:

He was arrested 6/17/67 by Los Angeles Sheriff's Office near Compton, California, has been in continual confinement since, and is serving a sentence of six months to ten years for Grand Theft of Pistol.

He was arrested for Grand Theft of Copper Wire in Barton County, Missouri in October, 1966, convicted, and sentenced to the Missouri State Penitentiary for a two years period. By about 11/21/66, he arrived at the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri, to start serving his sentence, and where he was confined for about 1½ months thereafter being transferred to the Men's Institution Training Center, Moberly, Missouri, where he remained for about six months. From there, he was transferred to a Missouri State Penitentiary honor farm called Rinse Farm (phonetic) which is just across the bridge from the State Prison at Jefferson City, where he was confined for only a couple of weeks prior

to release on parole on 5/16/67. When released on parole, he flew to California by airlines and was on the street about one month prior to his arrest confinement on 6/17/67.

At the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, he was confined in a two-man cell, but was moved around quite a bit and had quite a few different cellmates. At Moberly, Missouri, they had individual cells, and Rinse Farm housed them in barrack-type buildings.

HILL said he knew a lot of the inmates in the Missouri State Penitentiary at the above locations, but he does not know their names. He initially stated that he cannot place JAMES EARL RAY by name, photograph, or description as having been a cellmate at any of the above institutions. Upon further reflection and consideration, EVANS thought the center photograph on the FBI Wanted Flyer No. 442-A looked a little familiar to him, but he still definitely does not recognize RAY as having been one of his cellmates. He said that if RAY is identical to the person who he recalls resembled the center photograph on the above Wanted Flyer, that person was only a casual acquaintance of his. The man who resembled the center photograph on the Wanted Flyer Walked back and forth to work with him at Moberly, Missouri Institution. The person who resembled the photograph on the Wanted Flyer worked in the woodshop at Moberly and HILL went to school there for a while and worked in the plumbing shop. HILL stated he did not get too well acquainted with this individual and can recall nothing of value about the person that he thinks resembles RAY except that person claimed to know quite a bit about safes, was to get out soon and wanted some help in writing up scores which HILL ignored since he wanted no part of it. As he recalls, the person he knew who resembled the center photograph on the Wanted Flyer of RAY wanted to score on safes in California and "go to Mexico" and cool it." EVANS stated that since he was not interested in the matter, no specific place in California or Mexico was mentioned.

EVANS repeatedly denied that he knows RAY or anything about RAY other than stated that above and was emphatic in pointing out that he had no contact with RAY or the person who resembled RAY when he, HALL, was in California on the street in May and April, 1967.

She said that the rental ledger card reflected that GALT surrendered the keys to this box on December 13, 1967, (prior to expiration of his contract) and a notation on the ledger card states he had moved out of town.

Mrs. REEDY advised that she recalls the keys were received from GALT through the mail and that GALT had enclosed a letter saying he was returning the keys as he had moved out of town and that if anything was remaining in the box that the bank was to destroy the items. Wrs. REEDY added that the envelope the letter was received in has been destroyed and she does not recall what postmark the envelope bore.

Mrs. REEDY stated that on December 13, 1967, the box was opened in the presence of bank officials BRUCE BEYER, C. E. KIRKPATRICK, BILLIE BENDER and herself, and the box was found to be empty. She advised that a notation to this effect was made on the record of access to the safe deposit box.

Mrs. REEDY, on examining the contract on this box executed by GALT on August 28, 1967, stated that she is certain she accepted the contract from GALT and, to the best of her recollection, she is certain GALT rented the box on the morning of August 28, 1967, and at that time GALT did not have anything to put into the box, but advised her he would return Nater in the day to place something in the box. She added that, although normal banking hours are from 9 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., customers do have access to their
