





On April 17, 1968, press release given to radio, television, and press media in the Pittsburgh Division. On April 19, 1968, press release and copies of photograph and wanted flyers given to news media, Pittsburgh Division.

On April 22, 1968, Identification Order and Wanted Flyers furnished to JERRY MOORE, U. S. Narcotics Bureau, and he was requested to contact his sources regarding JAMES EARL RAY. Contacts have been negative to date. It should be noted that the Pittsburgh Office of U.S. Narcotics Bureau covers Western Pennsylvania and West Virginia.

On April 26, 1968, publicity outlets were furnished material in connection with RAY being added to the Top Ten list.

On May 9, 1968, a newspaper mat and two photographs of RAY were mailed to 294 newspapers in the Pittsburgh Division for appropriate publication.

On May 15, 1968, it was determined that the Bureau of Vital Statistics, Charleston, W. Va., receives the original death certificate on all deaths in that state. Search of records in progress. The Bureau of Vital Statistics for Pennsylvania, located at Harrisburg, Pa., is unable to check their records with regard to local deaths for the year 1968 until May, 1969. Local checks are being made within the Western District of Pennsylvania, covered by the Pittsburgh Division.

A review of unsolved bank robbery and bank burglary cases in the Pittsburgh Division from April 23 to May 4, 1968, fails to indicate JAMES EARL RAY as a suspect.

DANNY CARLTON MARKINS

The following investigation was conducted by SA RAY V. SHOEMAKER:

K. D. YEATER (PROTECT IDENTITY), Assistant Transportation Superintendent, Cabell County Board of Education, Huntington, \hat{W} . Va., voluntarily advised Bureau agents on April 9, 1968, that he is concerned about DANNY CARLTON MARKINS, a former school bus driver in Cabell County, W. Va. On March 30, 1968, MARKINS telephonically advised YEATER he had to resign effective Monday, April 1, 1968, saying it was imperative that he be in Memphis on Tuesday, April 2, 1968. MARKINS' reason was that he was seeking employment with Roadway Transfer Company , Memphis, Tenn. then telephonically contacted Roadway in Memphis on March 30, 1968, and learned that they had no record of MARKINS seeking employment there. MARKINS requested all retirement be withdrawn and insisted he must be in Memphis by Tuesday A.M. YEATER confronted MARKINS with the information that he had learned MARKINS had no commitment to Roadway on Tuesday. MARKINS then said he was committed to a friend who expected him to go to Memphis with him. MARKINS then worked on April 1, 1968, and left that night for Memphis. He recontacted YEATER on Friday, April 5, 1968, and insisted that he had left Memphis prior to the "trouble." YEATER said he believed, however, that MARKINS left Memphis late Thursday night, April 4, 1968, and arrived Huntington, W. Va., approximately 10:00 AM, April 5, 1968. YEATER said he did not know identity of person accompanying MARKINS to Memphis.

YEATER said MARKINS has been trusted employee for more than ten years and he cannot understand his leaving with no notice. He said MARKINS is reliable individual who was outstanding employee, but has acted strangely for approximately two or three months.

On April 16, 1968, K. D. YEATER, Assistant Superintendent, Catell County Board of Education, Huntington, W. Va., advised SA RAY V. SHOEMAKER that the person who went to Memphis, Tenn., with DANNY CARLTON MARKINS was JOHN JUSTICE, residence address 5695 Altizer Avenue, Huntington, W. Va. He said JUSTICE was formerly employed by the Owens-Illinois Glass Company, Huntington, as a truck driver, but the employment was terminated several months ago. YEATER said JUSTICE is now believed to be a truck driver for Grey-Bell, Holland, Michigan.

On April 16, 1968, LEONA DOWLING, Personnel Department, Owens-Illinois Glass Company, Huntington, W. Va., advised SA SHOEMAKER from records that JOHN JUSTICE was employed by that company as a truck driver from November 20, 1963 to March 31, 1967, when his services were terminated by reason of the trucking operation being closed by Owens-Illinois. She stated the file contains no derogatory information on JUSTICE. She advised from records that JOHN JUSTICE is described as follows:

She pointed out that her telephone number and her daughter's telephone number and address are unpublished primarily for the reason of avoiding contact with SKAGGS. She stated her mother-in-law, Mrs. RUTH HARRIS, recently had an early morning telephone call believed to be from SKAGGS, but his whereabouts at the time of the call were unknown.

The composite drawings of subject were exhibited to Mrs. NIFFENEGGER, and she stated that they did not, in her opinion, look like SKAGGS. She stated SKAGGS' parents reside in Jonesboro, Ark., but that family members here have no contact with them primarily to avoid disclosing SKAGGS' wife's address.

Efforts to locate her, both at her residence and telephonically, the afternoon and evening of April 16, 1968, were unsuccessful, however, since a photograph of SKAGGS has been obtained, and based on the contact with CAROL SKAGGS' mother, no further effort will be made to locate her.
