

Dr. RUSSEL HADLEY, 7080 Hollywood Boulevard, was interviewed and furnished the following information:

Dr. HADLEY stated that the information he would furnish concerns a patient and therefore he considers it of a confidential nature. He stated that prior to making this information public or prior to his testifying to it he first would need a release from the patient.

JAMES EARL RAY utilizing the name of ERIC S. GALT appeared at Dr. HADLEY's office on February 19, 1968, at 11:30 a.m. for consultation. He furnished his address as 5533 Hollywood Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, telephone 464-1131 and date of birth as ______. He listed his nearest relative as CARL L. GALT, 2608 Highland Avenue, Birmingham, Alabama. GALT stated he had been referred to Dr. HADLEY by the Los Angeles County Medical Association.

Dr. HADLEY stated he performed a nasal tip reconstruction for an elongated nasal tip on GALT in his office on March 5, 1968. A local anesthetic was used. On March 7, 1968, GALT returned to Dr. HADLEY's office to have packs removed from his nose. On March 11, 1968, he again returned and the sutures were removed from his nose by Dr. HADLEY.

GALT was scheduled to return in six weeks for a final postoperative checkup but failed to keep the appointment.

Dr. HADLEY stated he personally saw GALT on each visit. He continued that GALT was quiet and pleasing in manner, unassuming and composed. Dr. HADLEY stated that GALT paid \$200 in cash for the surgery on the date of the operation, March 5, 1968. Dr. HADLEY stated that the surgery he performed on GALT did not alter his appearance to any degree.



On October 22, 1968, Mr. Arthur J. Hanes, Sr., Birmingham, Alabama, attorney representing James Earl Ray, telephoned Ralph J. Miles, Special Agent in Charge, Federal Bureau of Investigation, Birmingham, Alabama, stating that "This is a genuine concern call." Mr. Hanes expressed his deep interest in the well-being of his country and stated that the forthcoming trial of Ray could provide "a great forum for exposing some things which need exposing." In the ensuing conversation Hanes stated that his specific concern was "with the Black militant groups at work in this country whose activities should be exposed."

Mr. Hanes requested that arrangements be made for him to meet with an official of the FBI in Birmingham, Alabama; Washington, D. C.; or any other suitable location for the purpose of exchanging information as to activities of Black militants. He indicated that his purpose in securing information from the FBI was in order that a suitable expose of such Black militant activities could be made during the forthcoming trial of James Earl Ray in Memphis, Tennessee.

. Mr. Hanes was informed that the FBI would be happy to receive from him any information pertinent to the security of the United States, but that information possessed by the FBI could not be disclosed to him under regulations of the Attorney General of the United States. This advice
