BLA RE HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON Re Mnoxville teletype to Charlotte and Memphis 4/4/68; Charlotte teletype to Memphis and Knoxville 4/68. At 10:35 p.m., 4/4/63, JAMES M. UNDERHILL placed from Charlotte a long distance telephone call to JIM HEST at telephone 487-9453, Shelby, M. C. The telephone was answered by a person sounding like an elderly white male, who stated JIM WEST was not there. After some delay, he identified himself as LEM PATTERSON, and conversation continued with him. After a short period, he turned the telephone over to another person who identified himself as MERMAN PATREESON, son of LEH PATTERSON. During further conversation, the younger PATTERSON was asked his middle name and he stated it was IUGHI. HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON sounded obviously intoxicated and during the conversation moutioned he had been taking some "pills" that day. It was extremely difficult to get any kind of coherent story from him and he at first denich any knowledge of JIH WEER and then later said that WEST had been there earlier that evening and had been drinking heavily and had left to go get some more to drink. HERMAN EUCHNE PATTERSON stated he had been in Shelby all that day but did not give any clear account of his activities. Later during his rambling conversation, he said he had been in Knowville, Tenn., up until a week or so earlier and had returned to Shelby When the family wired him money. Further during the conversation, which was not coherent, he stated he had that morning drawn his pay from Mowell Stroup of the Cherryville Nursery, for grading work he had done. He said he had taken this money which amounted to about \$12, to make the trip on. HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON was asked where he had been in Tennessee and he would only say he had been at a poolroom in Knoxville and claimed he did not know the name of it or its location or the name of the operator. HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON denied any knowledge of any telephone call having been made to the FBI from that telephone on that date by anyone. At several points during the conversation, he denied any knowledge of a JIH WEST. It is pointed out there is no commercial air service at Shelby, the nearest commercial airport being at Charlotte, approximately 40 miles away. HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON and LOW PATTERSON stated the above telephone was located at the residence of LEM PATTERSON, 627 S. DeKalb St., Shelby. SAS FRANCIS X, BRADSHAW and JANES M. UNDERHILL conducted the following investigation on 4/5/68: Detective HOWARD SHITH, Shelby DD, stated that HIRMAN EUGENE PATTERSON is the son of LAM PATTERSON, who lives at 627 S. DeKalb. LEM PATTERSON has operated a grocery store at that location for a number of years but recently suffered a stroke and has great difficulty in talking or getting around. Another son operates Patterson's Cleaners at the rear of the same location. WERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON () a notorious town drunk and has been for years. Detective WITH knows that MERMAN RUGENE PATTERSON had been away for some time up until 2025 RELEASE UNDER E.O. 14176

a couple of weeks ago and reportedly had been in Tennessee. He had no knowledge that he had been away from Shelby within the last several days. He knew that within the last few days HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON had been doing some landscape grading work at the location of a new branch bank on DeKalb St. in Shelby, for HOWELL STROUP, Cherryville Nurseries. He had not seen HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON on 4/4/63. Detective SMITH further stated that PATTERSON, for years, has followed the pattern of working as little as possible and only until he can get enough to buy something to drink, and thereafter he will get drunk and usually wind up being arrested. He commented it would be impossible for HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON to have gone as far as Knoxville, Tenn., and back in the same day, because in his opinion as soon as he got to the firstplace he could buy liquor, he would buy it and get drunk and that would be as far as he would go.

Detective SMITH stated that HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON has had about 30 arrests since 1930, at the Shelby PD alone, mostly for drunk, and some for cursing, fighting and petty larceny. He was locally arrested on 3/30/63 for drunk, at which time he gave his address as 627 S. DeNalb. From Mrs. MARTIN, Clerk of Recorders Court, Detective SMITH determined that PATTERSON had appeared in Court in Shelby on Tuesday, 4/2/63, and was sentenced to serve 20 days or pay costs of court. Further, he had come to Mrs. MARTIN's office on the early morning of 4/4/63 with part of the money for the costs of court and fine and left saying he would try to get the rest of the money. He returned about noon and paid the entire amount.

Detective SMITH stated that PATTERSON has on numerous occasions in the past called the PD with false reports. One time, a year or so ago, he called the PD without giving any name and said there was a drunk at a particular service station. This was late at night, and when officers responded, they found PATTERSON in an automobile, obviously waiting for them, and when the officers approached the automobile, he produced a gun and stuck it right in the stomach of one of the officers. The officer managed to get the gun away from him and placed him under arrest, after which it was determined this was only a toy gun, though it very definitely resembled a real gun. At that time, PATTERSON admitted he had been the

CE 157-5800 one who had made the call and indicated it had just been to see what the officers would do. In addition, within the last week, PATTERSON had telephoned the PD and said there was going to be a riot but he did not give any details or where it would take place. He had not given his name but his voice had been recognized and the call had been disregarded. On another recent occasion, he had telephoned the PD giving some false name which was not recalled, and said there was going to be a bomb placed at some unrecalled location and made the comment, "You'll find out where when it happens." Detective SMITH had been the one answering the telephone and he recognized the voice of PATTERSON and called him by his first name, after which PATTERSON gave his own full name and cursed the officer for recognizing his voice. No arrest action had been taken as a result of this incident. Detective SMITH stated he had no knowledge of any JIM WEST in Shelby except for an attorney JAMES A. WEST, and definitely he was not any associate of PATTENSON and would not be hanging around drinking with him. Detective SMITH stated in his opinion if a telephone call from a person claiming to be JIM WEST had been made to the FBI accusing HERMAN PATTERSON of being involved in something, the call had probably been made by HERMAN PATTERSON himself. He stated the only reason he could suggest for these activities on the part of PATTIMSON was a desire to attract attention or to possibly play tricks on the police. Mrs. JAMES T. WEST, 604 LeGrand St., Shelby, stated her husband is not related in any way to MERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON or his family. The stated she knows of another family named WEST in Shelby and has no knowledge or re son to believe that they are in any way related to the FATTERSONS or have any association with them. On 4/5/68, WILLARD PATTERSON at 1 his wife MAE were interviewed at their residence located at the rear of 627 S. DeKalb St. Mr. PATTERSON is the Lother of HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON and is the operator of therson's Cleaners. He expressed himself as completely disguised with HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON, saying he is a notorious and astant drunk and has as little to do with him as possible However, since he

stays with the father at their house at the same location, he does see him constantly. Both WILLARD PATTERSON and his wife stated that HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON had been in Knozville and other unknown locations in Tennessee for several weeks up until about three weeks ago. At that time he contacted the family and his father sent him money to come home on. HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON had worked for a few days doing grading work for Cherryville Nurseries, but got drunk over the weekend of 3/30/68. He received a fine in court on 4/2/68 but was not required to pay it on that particular date. They continued that on the morning of 4/4/68 HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON had said he was going to Cherryville to collect his pay in order to pay off his fine. Sometime after noon, he came back to that neighborhood and said he had paid his fine. At that time he was drinking and continued to be very drunk and Mr. and Mrs. PATTERSON stated they had seen him at least three times between 3:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. on 4/4/63. Part of that time he had been in their house since Mrs. PATTERSON had gotten him to come in and lie down just to get him off the streets.

WILLARD PATTERSON stated that HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON had called over from the house of their father at the time the news came over the radio or television about the killing of MARTIN LUTHER KING, and HERMAN EUGENE had commented in his drunken fashion that he was elated over this occurrence.

WILLARD PATTERSON stated he knows of a JAMES WEST in Shelby but there is no WEST who is related to his family or to the family of the wife of MERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON. In addition, he has no knowledge of any JIM WEST being an associate of MERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON or of ever being in or around the house of their father, LEM PATTERSON.

On 4/5/63, HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON was located at the home of a neighbor near his father's house. At that time he appeared sober. He stated that he had been at various places in and around Knoxville, Tenn., up until about a month ago, when the family sent him money and he came home. For

CE 157-5800 about two weeks he has been working for HCWELL STROUP doing grading work, but has not worked in the last few days. He was arrested over the past weekend in Shelby for being drunk and on 4/4/63 he went down to the Clerk of Court's Office to pay his fine. He found he did not have enough money and he hitched a ride with an unknown Negro truck driver to Cherryville to collect his pay. He said he went there once before 9:00 a.m. and again about noon. He collected his pay of something under \$20 and returned to Shelby and paid his fine, paying it sometime around noon. He continued that after that he went out and got drunk and spent most of the afternoon and evening in and around his father's house. He recalled that he had been at one time on 4/4/63 at the service station operated by HOWARD LEWIS in Shelby, and that at one time on that date he had ridden in a cab driven by ADAM HUMT. PATTERSON stated he had no knowledge of a JIM WEST but said he believed he had heard that name in the last day or two, and possibly it was the name of the Negro truck driver who had given him a ride to Cherryville. He denied any knowledge of a telephone call having been made to the FBI in Knoxville. He added that when he gets drunk he does not remember what happens. He did remember having talked to agent UNDERHILL on the telephone on the night of 4/4/68. PARTERSON was strongly warned against making any false calls to the FBI on police agencies. 



Further, he had come to Mrs. MARTIN's office on the early morning of 4/4/68 with part of the money for the costs of court and fine and left saying he would try to get the rest of the money. He returned about noon and paid the entire amount.

Detective SMITH stated that PATTERSON has on numerous occasions in the past called the PD with false reports. One time, a year or so ago, he called the PD without giving any name and said there was a drunk at a particular service station. This was late at night, and when officers responded, they found PATTERSON in an automobile, obviously waiting for them, and when the officers approached the automobile, he produced a gun and stuck it right in the stomach of one of the officers. The officer managed to get the gun away from him and placed him under arrest, after which it was determined this was only a toy gun, though it very definitely resembled a real gun. At that time, PATTERSON admitted he had been the

one who had made the call and indicated it had just been to see what the officers would do. In addition, within the last week, PATTERSON had telephoned the PD and said there was going to be a riot but he did not give any details or where it would take place. He had not given his name but his voice had been recognized and the call had been disregarded. On another recent occasion, he had telephoned the PD giving some false name which was not recalled, and said there was going to be a bomb placed at some unrecalled location and made the comment, "You'll find out where when it happens." Detective SMITH had been the one answering the telephone and he recognized the voice of PATTERSON and called him by his first name, after which PATTERSON gave his own full name and cursed the officer for recognizing his voice. No arrest action had been taken as a result of this incident.

Detective SMITH stated he had no knowledge of any JIM WEST in Shelby except for an attorney JAMES A. WEST, and definitely he was not any associate of PATTERSON and would not be hanging around drinking with him.

Detective SMITH stated in his opinion if a telephone call from a person claiming to be JIM WEST had been made to the FBI accusing HERMAN PATTERSON of being involved in something, the call had probably been made by HERMAN PATTERSON himself. He stated the only reason he could suggest for these activities on the part of PATTERSON was a desire to attract attention or to possibly play tricks on the police.

Mrs. JAMES T. WEST, 604 LeGrand St., Shelby, stated her husband is not related in any way to HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON or his family. She stated she knows of another family named WEST in Shelby and has no knowledge or reason to believe that they are in any way related to the PATTERSONS or have any association with them.

On 4/5/68, WILLARD PATTERSON and his wife MAE were interviewed at their residence located at the rear of 627 S. DeKalb St. Mr. PATTERSON is the brother of HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON and is the operator of Patterson's Cleaners. He expressed himself as completely disgusted with HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON, saying he is a notorious and constant drunk and has as little to do with him as possible. However, since he

stays with the father at their house at the same location. he does see him constantly. Both WILLARD PATTERSON and his wife stated that HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON had been in Knoxville and other unknown locations in Tennessee for several weeks up until about three weeks ago. At that time he contacted the family and his father sent him money to come home on. HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON had worked for a few days doing grading work for Cherryville Nurseries, but got drunk over the weekend of 3/30/68. He received a fine in court on 4/2/68 but was not required to pay it on that particular date. They continued that on the morning of 4/4/68 HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON had said he was going to Cherryville to collect his pay in order to pay off his fine. Sometime after noon, he came back to that neighborhood and said he had paid his fine. At that time he was drinking and continued to be very drunk and Mr. and Mrs. PATTERSON stated they had seen him at least three times between 3:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. on 4/4/68. Part of that time he had been in their house since Mrs. PATTERSON had gotten him to come in and lie down just to get him off the streets.

WILLARD PATTERSON stated that HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON had called over from the house of their father at the time the news came over the radio or television about the killing of MARTIN LUTHER KING, and HERMAN EUGENE had commented in his drunken fashion that he was elated over this occurrence.

WILLARD PATTERSON stated he knows of a JAMES WEST in Shelby but there is no WEST who is related to his family or to the family of the wife of HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON. In addition, he has no knowledge of any JIM WEST being an associate of HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON or of ever being in or around the house of their father, LEM PATTERSON.

On 4/5/68, HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON was located at the home of a neighbor near his father's house. At that time he appeared sober. He stated that he had been at various places in and around Knoxville, Tenn., up until about a month ago, when the family sent him money and he came home. For CE 157-5800 about two weeks he has been working for HOWELL STROUP doing grading work, but has not worked in the last few days. He was arrested over the past weekend in Shelby for being drunk and on 4/4/68 he went down to the Clerk of Court's Office to pay his fine. He found he did not have enough money and he hitched a ride with an unknown Negro truck driver to Cherryville to collect his pay. He said he went there once before 9:00 a.m. and again about noon. He collected his pay of something under \$20 and returned to Shelby and paid his fine, paying it sometime around noon. He continued that after that he went out and got drunk and spent most of the afternoon and evening in and around his father's house. He recalled that he had been at one time on 4/4/68 at the service station operated by HOWARD LEWIS in Shelby, and that at one time on that date he had ridden in a cab driven by ADAM HUNT. PATTERSON stated he had no knowledge of a JIM WEST but said he believed he had heard that name in the last day or two, and possibly it was the name of the Negro truck driver who had given him a ride to Cherryville. He denied any knowledge of a telephone call having been made to the FBI in Knoxville. He added that when he gets drunk he does not remember what happens. He did remember having talked to agent UNDERHILL on the telephone on the night of 4/4/68. PATTERSON was strongly warned against making any false calls to the FBI on police agencies. The following description was obtained through observation and interview: Race White Age Has weatherbeaten appearance and looks about 45 Born Shelby, N. C. Height Weight 150 lbs. Build Medium to stocky 2025 RELEASE UNDER E.O. 14176

CE 157-5800 Complexion Tanned and weatherbeaten Brown Eyes Hair Black Scars and Marks Crude tattoos on both arms He acknowledged that he was identical with the HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON who had, in 9/67, together with another individual, stolen a taxi cab in Charlotte and driven it to Clover, S. C. In that case, Federal prosecution was declined and PATTERSON, on 9/7/67, was sentenced in local court in Charlotte to serve 90 days. On 4/5/68, Cab Driver ADAM HUNT, Shelby, stated he had hauled HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON as a passenger from somewhere in downtown Shelby to a service station operated by HOWARD LEWIS on the edge of Shelby, this being somewhere around noon. He stated he did not recall having seen him later on that date. PATTERSON had apparently started drinking at the time he hauled him. No further investigation as to HERMAN EUGENE PATTERSON is being conducted by Charlotte. 2025 RELEASE UNDER E.O. 14176

On 4/9/68, Mrs. MAUDE GIBSON, residence address, Red Springs, N. C., was interviewed at the Scotland County Hospital, Laurinburg, N. C., as a patient. She was questioned concerning the current location of her son, CHARLES NELSON GIBSON. Mas. MAUDE GIBSON furnished the following information concerning her son.

CHARLES NELSON GIBSON, was born

Co., N. C., quit him school and enlisted in the USAF in April 1947 or 1948. We served in the Air Force through the Korean War, after which he was discharged about 1952. Since about 1952 he has never settled down and has traveled from place to place all over the U. S. He is not married and to her knowledge has never been married. He maintains infrequent contact with her and will call her collect two or three times each year. She has never received any correspondence from him. Each year she receives, through the mail, letters from GOBSON's former employers enclosing the W-2 Forms for his income tax data which she keeps as she has no forwarding address.

She described her son as an alcoholic and a person who has a mental problem. She said that he was confined in the VA Hospital in Tomah, Wisconsin, for about 9 months, approximately 4 years ago. He visited her home for a short time after being released from this VA Hospital after which he left her home and she has not seen him to date.

She stated the last contact she has had with her son was approximately six weeks ago when she received a collect long-distance telephone call from him, reportedly from Dallas,

Texas, and she did not accept the collect call inasmuch as she was of the impression that her was was intoxicated and she could hear music in the background. She assumed that he was calling to request her to send him some money. She said that she understands that her son called collect another son of hers, HAROLD GLENN GIBSON, at Charlotte, N. C., at the same time, and her son in Charlotte also refused to accept the collect telephone call.

She advised that her son, CHARLES NELSON GIBSON, usually has work at various construction jobs and based on information she has received concerning his income tax data, he does not stay on one job very long and has been in practically every state in the U. S.

She stated that he has been arrested on many occasions in the past 15 years, usually for public drunk and assault. She recalled that he was arrested in Fayetteville about 4 years ago which she thinks he paid out and to her knowledge he has never served a prison sentence.

She stated that she knows of no associates or acquaintances of her son and the only other relatives she has are three sons in addition to CHARLES NELSON GIBSON. One son, HAROLD GLENN GIBSON resides at 634 Lansdown Rd., Charlotte, N. C., home phone 306-6780 and is employed as a salesman for the Beaunit Mills in Charlotte, Another son, EARL JONES GIBSON, age 40, retired from the USMC after serving 21 years and is presently residing Jacksonville, Fla., address unknown and his employment is with an unknown printing company. Her other son, THOMAS ALLEN GIBSON, a confirmed alcoholic, is confined at the state mental hospital, Columbia, S. C.

Mrs. GIBSON was most cooperative during this interview and she expressed much concern in helping to have her son located. She said that she knows very little regarding his habits or beliefs but did not consider him to be a dangerous

individual. She said that he is an alcoholic and has been an alcoholic for the past 15 years. She said that she believes that his excessive drinking has effected his mind because when he was visiting her about 4 years ago, he seemed to be in a trance at times and some correspondence she received from a doctor at the VA Hospital at Tomah, Wisc., indicated to her that he had some type of mental problem. Mrs. GIBSON expressed her regret in that she was unable to furnish any additional information that would assist in locating her son.



On 4/10/68, Mr. WILLIAM CINDE MILLSAPS, 926 Howard Ave., off Auten Road, Gastonia, N. C., telephone 865-0792, appeared at the Charlotte Office of the FBI and advised that he would like to furnish the following information to the FBI on a strictly confidential basis:

He stated he has a nephew by the name of JOHN CLINTON MILLSAPS. White male, age 20, 6' 1"-6' 2", 220 lbs., blond hair, dresses well, who resides in Salt Lake City, Utah, telephone number 1-801-359-4897, which is an unlisted number. He stated the boy was discharged from the Army in the summer of 1967. He advised the boy inherited a considerable amount of money from his father and is now wealthy.

Mr. MILLSAPS stated that in January or February, 1968, the boy and his wife visited him for approximately three days. He stated that during this visit, the boy advised him that he was going to purchase a high-powered rifle to shoot Negroes with. He stated he advised the boy at that time not to get involved in any type of violence. He stated the boy did not indicate that he was a member of any type of organization during his conversation regarding the purchase of the rifle. Mr. MILLSAPS stated the boy is reportedly a "crack shot" with a rifle.

Mr. MILLSAPS stated he did not hear from his nephew again until approximately one week prior to the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING. He stated he received a telephone call from the boy from Richmond, Va. He advised the boy told him he was working for a sign company but did not mention the name of the company. He said that the boy advised him he was coming to visit him for about three days and then would go on to Atlanta, Ga. He stated that during the telephone conversation he asked the boy why he was working as a traveling salesman but the boy did not say. He stated he told the boy that he did not have to do that type of work due to the large inheritance he had received. Mr. MILLSAPS stated the boy did not come to his home as he said he would. Therefore, he called the boy's residence in Salt Lake City and talked with the boy's wife, who advised him that his

CE 44-1365 nephew was not at home due to his employment with a machine company, name of company not mentioned. Mr. MILLSAPS thought it was strange that the boy advised him he was working for a sign company and the boy's wife advised he was employed by a machine company. He stated he requested the boy's wife have him call, but has not heard from the boy yet. Mr. MILLSAPS stated that after MARTIN LUTHER KING was killed, a compoite drawing of the subject responsible was published in the newspaper. He stated that viewing the picture, he feels his nephew strongly resembles the individual. Mr. MILLSAPS stated he is afraid that the killer of MARTIN LUTHER KING could possibly be his nephew due to the resemblance of the boy with the picture in the paper and the fact that the boy had stated he was going to purchase a high-powered rifle to use on Negroes. stated he had no other reason to suspect his nephew other than the reasons mentioned above. Mr. MILLSAPS stated he does not know what kind of automobile his nephew drives but at one time had a Cadillac and later purchased a new Chevrolet. He stated he feels the boy is not driving around the country in connection with his employment but feels he is flying on commercial airlines because the boy stated during the telephone call mentioned above that he would call him from the Charlotte Airport when he arrived. Mr. MILLSAPS stated he did not have his nephew's address with him, but would call this office from his home and furnish the address. Mr. MILLSAPS stated he was not interested in any reward money and only wanted justice done in the killing of MARTIN LUTHER KING. He further advised he would talk to an Agent at any time. He stated he is retired and is usually home. Mr. MILLSAPS again requested that this information be held in strict confidence. He was advised it would. Mr. MILLSAPS appeared to be a stable individual. 
