Experts also state the use of this system on laundry items is unusual in that the system is normally used on garments being dry cleaned.

On April 17, 1968, SA JAMES J. ROCHE, JR., telephonically advised that he had received call from the Henderson, N. C., Police Department on the morning of April 17, 1968, and the police department had advised that a man had checked into the Vance Hotel in Henderson on April 16, 1968, registered under the name D. HOUSTON. It was reported that individual had made statements at the hotel indicating he had some knowledge of the KING assassination. He was invited by the police to the police department, at which time he advised his name was EMIL MATLIK, a white male, born at Highland, PH Wisconsin, 5 feet 10 inches, 165 pounds, short blond hair, peaked nose, blue eyes.

MATLIK informed the police that he had been questioned by the FBI at Baltimore on either 4/6/68 or 4/7/68. He had clippings in his possession indicating he is running for "President of the World."

He stated he desired to talk with the FBI.

On 4/17/68, ASAC CHARLES CHAPMAN, Baltimore Office, was contacted concerning this matter. SA ROLAND SWANSON of the Baltimore Office advised telephonically that MATLIK was interviewed by agents at Baltimore on 4/6/68, concerning the KING ASSASSINATION. MATLIK claimed he was in Washington, D. C., for a month prior to 4/6/68, when he left and went to Baltimore. SA SWANSON stated MATLIK is publicity hungry, is a "kook", and an advocator of sterilization.

In view of the above, SA ROCHE was advised to notify the Henderson Police Department concerning this matter and to make no effort to interview MATLIK at the police department but to have the police tell MATLIK that in the event he wants to talk with the FBI, he should contact the nearest office or an RA.



Sylva Cleaners uses a code beginning with Roman numeral I or II, to indicate the residence of the customer as Route 1 or Route 2. This is followed by the letter W (to indicate Western North Carolina) or C (used to show that the customer will call for his clothing). In view of the foregoing, it is believed that referenced marking tag did not originate at the Sylva Cleaners.

On 4/9/63, MRS HILDRED SEAGO, owner, Highlands Cleaners and Laundry - operating two establishments at Sylva and Highlands North Carolina, stated that each place of business utilizes colored tags as a means of identification.

Mr. O.B. PEARSON, owner, Franklin Cleaners, Franklin, North Carolina stated that his company uses large solored tags to identify clothing cleaned by that firm. Mr. PEARSON noted that the Sylva Cleaners is the only business w est of Haywood County, M.C., to use that Textile Marking Machine. He could not advised as to the identity of any cleaners in Haywood County who use this system.

No additional cleaners or laundries exist in the territories covered by this Agent.




