



JAMES EARL RAY, also known as Eric Starvo Galt, Harvey Lowmyer, John Willard, James McBride, James Walton, W. C. Herron and James O'Conner.

James Earl Ray, a Missouri prison escapee, sought under the alias Eric Starvo Galt in connection with the gunshot slaying of civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., is one of the FBI's "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives." FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover ordered the special addition of Ray to the "Top Ten" list to insure widespread dissemination of Ray's photograph and description to speed his location.

Ray has been intensively sought since the murder of Dr. King on April 4, 1968, as he stood on the balcony of a Memphis, Tennessee, motel. An exhaustive FBI fingerprint search, comparing latent fingerprints uncovered in the Dr. King case against fingerprints of over 53,000 persons on whom wanted notices were posted, determined that Galt and Ray are identical.

A Federal warrant, issued at Birmingham, Alabama, on April 17, 1968, charges Ray, under the alias of Galt, with conspiring to interfere with a Constitutional Right of a citizen. Ray, who escaped on April 23, 1967, from the Missouri State Penitentiary, is also sought for unlawful flight to avoid confinement for robbery. His long criminal record also includes convictions for burglary and forging U.S. Postal Money Orders.

A white American, born in Alton, Illinois, on Ray is 5'10'' tall, weighs 163 to 174 pounds, has blue eyes and short brown hair. He has a nervous habit of tugging at an ear lobe and his left ear protrudes noticeably. Known as a "loner" and "drifter," Ray has worked as a baker, laborer and color matcher. He has taken dancing lessons and completed a course at a school of bartending.

Consider Ray armed and extremely dangerous. Report any information concerning him to the nearest FBI office.

On 5/2/68 Mr. DAN CAULDER and his wife, ELOISEx CAULDER. mailing address Rt 1, Box 228, residence Springfield Mill village, were interviewed separatedly and they both advised substantially the same fint information, which is as follows:

Their son, NICHOLAS NATHANIEL CAULDER, who they refer to as Nick and Sonny, had been working as an electrician for the Bryant or Bryan Construction Co. on the construction of the Hercules Plant at Wilmington for about one year until he was "laid-off" during the latter part of February or first part of March, 1968, when he returned to their home to stay and seek employment in the vicinity. He was unsuccessful in getting local employment and he then traveled to an unknown place in the State of Mississippi to get employment at an unknown EMERTHERINA PLANE Company. They RANAEX furnished him sufficient money for his travel to Mississippi, which he perormed in his personally owned auto. He stayed away from home about three days and returned saying that he found that the Company/warxannetrike were on strike and, he did not

dates he made this trip but thought is was during the middle part of March, 1968.

They advised that CAULDER was at their home the evening that MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. was shot and killed because they specifically recalled that MR. DAN CAULDER and SUSPECT CAULDER were watching television the evening of 4/4/68 and shortly after the news broadcast from 6:30 to 7 PM they saw a special bulletin flash on the screen that KING had been shott and DAN CAULDER and suspect CAULDER called for MRS. CAULDER to come from the kitchen to watch the TV. They said several minutes later they saw on TV that KING had died.

MR. and MRS. CAULDER were emphatic that suspect CAULDER, their son, was at their home the maximx evening of 4/4/68 and statuted further that he stayed at their home continuiously for at least two weeks prior to 4/4/68 but could not state definitely as to his specific whereabouts on 3/29-30/68, other than the fact that he was at their home at nights on these dates.

They advised that their son has never been in trouble before and they are completely heartbroken to learn that had been arrested in Charlotte for burglary.

They both advised they was they work at the Springfield Textile mill near Laurel hill. Mrs CAULDER works on the first shift and her husband works on the third xhits shift.

RE: JIMMY RAY BUNDY

By communication dated April 23, 1968, the San Diego Office of the FBI advised as follows:

On April 22, 1968, a Mrs. WILLIAMS telephonically advised that approximately one and one half weeks previously a male cousin of a neighbor and another male individual named JIMMY RAY BUNDY visited a neighbor of hers. The cousin was driving a car bearing North Carolina license. Mrs. WILLIAMS stated that she and her husband thought that BUNDY bore a striking resemblance to ERIC STARVO GALT and that his actions while at the neighbor's home were most circumspect. She said that BUNDY had a peculiar reluctance to converse and that he left rather unexpectedly, hitchhiking his way south.

Upon contact, Mrs. WILLIAMS advised that the neighbor to whom she referred is Mrs. MARJORIE GREGG, who resides directly across the street from her home at 138 Quail Drive, Chula Vista, California. The neighbor's cousin was driving a 1957 Chevrolet bearing North Carolina license HJ-7057.

Mrs. WILLIAMS said that she had determined that JIMMY RAY BUNDY was taken to Alpine, California, by Mrs. GREGG several days previously and was let out at which time he began hitchhiking back to North Carolina.

MILTON GRAY MANNING, temporary resident at 138 Quail Drive, advised he is the cousing of MARJORIE GREGG, the owner of that residence. He said about April 9, 1968, he and a friend, JIMMY RAY BUNDY, left Greenville, North Carolina in his Chevrolet en route to California. He said they were in California for about one and one half weeks, and when BUNDY departed he was hitchhiking to Greenville, North Carolina or Portsmouth, Virginia.

LUNCEFORD was described as a white male, age 30 to 35, 5 feet 8 inches tall to 5 feet 10 inches tall, medium build, sandy, receding hair.

By communication dated April 6, 1968, the Washington Field Office of the FBI advised as follows:

Doctor NORMAN FORRESTER, Dentist, 212 M Street, Southwest, Washington, D. C., advised that the artist's sketch of the suspect in the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., which appeared in a local newspaper, looks like an individual who accompanied a patient of his by the name of RONNIE CHRISTBERRY, 202 27th Street, Hickory, North Carolina, whom he treated on April 6, 1968.

He described the individual he considers a suspect as being a white male, 20 years of age, blond hair, and wearing a red sweater.

The following investigation was conducted by SA J. RALPH JONES:

AT HICKORY, NORTH CAROLINA
