This money order, too, was in the amount of 175.00 payable to williard it corrido with the varchaser being shown as Veraou ReBride. The manager of take firm, being a solutious of this transaction, directed an employee to follow the custimate. The employee noted the model and make of the automobile entered by the customer and the license number of the car. Later when this money order was accordingly
