As he unpacked the magazines, JERRY RAY said to PCI "Just between you and me, I saw my brother right after he escaped. We had a meeting place where he would meet on my days off." RAY did not say if these alleged meetings occurred after his escape from prison or after the murder of KING.

JERRY RAY also said he had visited his brother who owns a tavern in St. Louis, Missouri, after the assassination and before his first interview by the FBI. He stated that before the FBI contacted him, he saw the photograph of an individual identified as ERIC STARVO GALT with his eyes closed. He recognized this man as being identical with his brother JAMES EARL RAY.

JERRY RAY said if he told the FBI everything he knows, "with all of their resources" they would be able to "track him down." He stated, "I do not know where he is right now. I do not think I'll ever see him alive again." He explained his brother would probably not permit himself to be captured alive. JERRY RAY added that he did not want the subject apprehended because of the additional bad publicity it would result in for the RAY family. RAY further said he does not refer to the subject since the assassination by his real name but calls him STARVO or GALT. He did not explain why he does this.

RAY also said, "I tell the FBI only enough to keep them off my back."

On 6/5/68, RAY speculated to PCI that the subject would probably flee the country to Mexico or Canada. He also said the subject was too hot for him to be in touch with now.

On 6/6/68, PCI asked JERRY RAY if his brother shot KING. He replied, "This is his business. I didn't ask him. If I was in his position and had 18 years to serve and someone offered me a lot of money to kill someone I didn't like anyhow and get me out of the country, I'd do it."

Later the same day JERRY RAY commended to PCI even if the subject confesses to committing the murder of KING, he, JERRY RAY, would not agree with him. He did not further explain this statement, PCI advised.

RAY said he now carries a gun from his room to his car. He keeps the gun in the trunk of his car. When he walks

to his room from his car, he removes the gun from the car's trunk and takes it with him. He said he carries the weapon for personal protection.

RAY said the subject is a supporter of Presidential Candidate GEORGE WALLACE. He said the subject once drove a man to Alabama from possibly the California area so he could vote for WALLACE. He then identified this man by his photograph which appears in the 5/3/68, issue of "Life." It is noted PCI said the magazine states this man's name is CHARLES STEIN. JERRY RAY, according to PCI did not say when the trip to Alabama occurred.

JERRY RAY said he was considering moving his residence again to a place where the press and possibly the FBI would be unaware of. He also said he was thinking of beginning to use the alias of JERRY RYAN. He then displayed a new Illinois driver's license in the name of JERRY RYAN. He said he recently obtained that license for his own use. He did not further explain why he might change his address and begin to use an alias. He did not say he intended to leave his present job.

On 6/7/68, PCI said on 6/6/68, she asked JERRY RAY if he thought his brother shot KING. RAY replied by pointing out if he were in his brother's position of having an 18 year sentence to serve once he was apprehended and someone offered him money to kill someone he did not like and thereafter be able to leave the country, he would do it. RAY further volunteered at this point the subject might have fled to Canada or Mexico. He did not say anything further about where he thought the subject was.

got the money to buy instant white Mustang with. JERRY RAY replied, "They gave him part of the money. He put the money in a safety deposit box, but when he left, he drew it all out. It broke his heart to have to leave the white Mustang."

On 6/9/68, PCI also said on 6/6/68, she recalled RAY commented the subject was paid either \$100,000 or \$500,000.

JERRY RAY said this while PCI and he were discussing if the subject killed KING. According to PCI ACCORDING TO \$100,000 or \$500,000 sum. Neither PCI was able to extract a direct statement from JERRY RAY that the subject killed KING.

On 6/9/68, PCI said she received a telephone call from JERRY RAY. He said he was calling to alert her, in

the event she did not know, the subject had been arrested. He also said he did not think the RAY family would have any difficulty obtaining a lawyer to represent the subject because he was certain several good ones would want the job because of the publicity they would receive.

JERRY RAY also told PCI he intends to visit the subject with his brother who owns a tavern in St.

Louis when the subject is returned to the United States.

RAY that he did not know the subject was traveling as he was just before his arrest.

JERRY RAY also said he intends to travel to St. Louis, Missouri to confer with his brother who owns a tavern there within the next week. He said he will do this so he and his brother can agree on how they should handle inquiries from the Press. He said he might consult with an attorney himself so he would not mistakenly say anything in public which might be detrimental to the subject's case.

On 6/10/68, PCI advised she received on 6/3/68 an airmail special delivery envelope from JERRY RAY postmarked in Wheeling, Ill., on 6/1/68. The envelope contained a money order from JERRY RAY to the amount of \$40.00. The money order was about 8½" long by 3½" wide. The paper the money order was on was yellow in color and had a white edge. Across the bottom of the face of the money order was "PERSONAL MONEY ORDER" written in black letters. PCI said she could not recall noticing what kind of a money order it was.

This money order represents one of several instances where JERRY RAY has mailed money orders or cash to PCI for her personal use. It is noted for the Bureau's information JERRY RAY is apparently quite fond of PCI and this is probably the reason he sends her money.

The money order was enclosed in a four page formtype newsletter bearing the heading of "THE ROYAL BANK OF CANADA MONTHLY NEWSLETTER". Beneath this heading appears the information this newsletter represents Vol. 49, No. 5, NK 44-854 JEO:1gd

and the organization's head office is in Montreal. The newsletter is for May, 1968, and contains an article entitled "TECHNOLOGY AS A WAY OF LIFE". The article deals generally with the various aspects of technology's affect on contemporary living.

Across the front of the newsletter is written in ink, "Look inside, I am at the post office and didn't have any paper." PCI said this is the only message from JERRY RAY which appeared in this piece of correspondence.

PCI said she recalled receiving the communication containing the described newsletter after learning the subject had been in Canada prior to his apprehension. She said that JERRY RAY indicated to her during his visit he obtained and sent the money order from the Wheeling, Ill. area.

PCI said the money orders appears to her to be identical with the kind of money order she received from JERRY RAY on 6/3/68, which was wrapped in the news letter from The Royal Bank of Canada.

PCI said the money order she received on 6/11/68, is drawn against the Wheeling Trust and Savings Bank, Wheeling, Illinois, and is dated 6/8/68. She noted the letters in the wording of "PERSONAL MONEY ORDER" written across the bottom of the face of the money order are light yellow-green in color. She previously thought the color of these letters was black. She said, however, she was apparently wrong about this.

The money order she received on 6/11/68, was enclosed in a piece of newspaper. The newspaper contained advertisements for businesses located in Wheeling, Illinois. JERRY RAY did not write anything to PCI in this communication.

Referenced communication indicated HEALEY had been in contact with CALVIN S. CRAIG, Grand Kleagle of the UKA, on January 22, 1968, in Atlanta, Georgia. HEALEY stated CRAIG looked like JAMES EARL RAY. HEALEY also indicated CRAIG invited him to join UKA.

Chicago files and references relating to HEALEY (CG 65-122, 65-1735, 65-45-21, 100-11331 and 66-431) were carefully reviewed. Bufile 65-6990 which relates to HEALEY sets forth information indicating HEALEY furnished information to the Bureau in early 1940's which proved not to be reliable. HEALEY's main file (Bufile 65-6990, CG File 65-122) contains information indicating he would most likely cause embarrassment to the Bureau, if he was utilized as a source as well as be unreliable.

In addition, on May 23, 1968, HEALEY telephonically called FBI, Chicago, Illinois, and advised he did not want to join the UKA, but would do so only upon instruction from FBI. He indicated his close association with Governor LESTOR MADDOX of Georgia and "right-wing" groups, and his belief that their philosophy was correct would permit him to have their confidence. Phraseology and statements made by HEALEY appeared to be self-serving and were unexplainable unless tape-recorded for possible future use by him or "right wing" groups.

CARPENTER, FB1 #236 243 is known to have visited GAWRON on these dates, however, CARPENTER was in St. Louis City Jail from 5/5/67 - 3/1/68, and could not have participated in the Alton bank robbery.

The bank of Alton, Illinois was robbed by 2 unknown subjects on 7/13/87, wearing nylon stocking masks and using a sawed off shotgum. They escaped with \$27,236. Description of the number 2 man could fit RAY.

Private WILLIAM DENNIS HARRY, ASN US 518 81 614, assigned to Company G, Third Battalion, Student Brigade, U. S. Army Southeastern Signal School, (USASSS), Fort Gordon, Georgia, advised he has been assigned to this unit at Fort Gordon since February 8, 1968, and his home address is 3498 Bosworth Road, Cleveland, Ohio.

HARRY related that on April 6, 1968, he boarded a United Airlines flight #396Y from Atlanta, Georgia, to Cleveland, Ohio, leaving Atlanta at approximately 6:30 PM, as well as he could recall, and arriving Cleveland around 9:00 PM. He pointed out he has made several trips since then to Cleveland, and for that reason his mind is confused as to the exact departure and arrival time on this flight on April 6, 1968.

HARRY continued that after boarding the plane at Atlanta, he observed a man to take a seat about six or seven rows ahead of him, sitting on the right side of the plane, HARRY was seated on the left side, and noticed that this man bore a resemblance to the composite sketch being shown at the time on television of the fugitive who later turned out to be JAMES EARL RAY. He said that he does not recall that this man was carrying a briefcase or any other article and after taking his seat, the man did not appear to pay any attention to anyone else around the plane. However, he noticed that as the man came aboard, he seemed to look around at the various passengers already seated before taking his own seat.

HARRY said he did not pay much attention to this man en route to Cleveland, does not recall if he talked to anyone who may have been seated beside him, and did not observe any further activity by this man until he left the plane at Cleveland. HARRY said that he had to get a couple of dress uniforms before leaving the plane at Cleveland, and this man left before he did. Consequently, HARRY did not see where

According to HARRY, this man was about 35 - 37 years old, his weight and height he would not estimate because he paid more attention to the man after he was seated than before, was dressed in a gray sport coat with white shirt and dark tie, with dark trousers. He did not wear a hat and his hair appeared to be of medium length, and was probably brown. He said the man did not appear nervous to his recollection.

HARRY further stated he did not pay any attention to this man's left ear to detect any difference between the left and right ears.

HARRY related that after he reached Cleveland, he discused this matter with his mother, but he reached the conclusion that this would not have been the fugitive because he did not believe the fugitive would have gone back to Atlanta so soon after the murder of Dr. KING. Consequently, he forgot the matter, thinking that it would not be important, and would not have reported it had not his mother contacted the FBI at Cleveland.

HARRY continued that he had made connections with the United Airlines flight #296Y from Augusta, Georgia, by Delta flight #423 to Atlanta on the same date.

HARRY said that he, prior to entering military service, was a compositor and Linotype operator for the Mansfield News Journal Company, Mansfield, Ohio, for about ten years and for about seven or eight weeks immediately prior to entering military service with the "Toledo Blade", Toledo, Ohio.

HARRY concluded by saying that he could not make a positive statement as to whether this individual was JAMES EARL RAY, but could only say that it might have been.
