Result of examination:

It was concluded that JAMES EARL RAY, K171, K211 and K257 propared the questioned Rayms signature on Q407; the questioned handwriting on Q408 and the questioned handwriting and hand printing on Q406. Although significant similarities were noted in the endorsements on Q598 through Q405. except the

endorsement on Q403, when compared with the known writings of RAY, the presence of unexplained variations, insufficient comparable material and distortion in some of the questioned endorsements precluded a definite determination as to whether RAY prepared the endorsements on Q398 through Q405.

The endorsement on Q403 is too distorted for comparison purposes. Although some similarities were noted in the date on line 24 on Q407 beside the Rayms signature when compared with the comparable writing of RAY, the limited and overwritten nature of this date precluded a definite determination as to whether RAY prepared this date.

Q398 through Q408 have been photographed and will be returned to Chicago separately.

On August 23, 1968, Nr. ELIVAT A. WARNING and Mrs. Middle S. Mille Middle, owners, Indian Trail Restaurant, 507 Chestnut Street, Minnetka, Illinois, phone Ht 6-1703. residence 391 Linden, Cinnetka, Illinois, phone Hi 6-2992, were interviewed jointly in the conference rock at the Vinnetka, Illinois, Police Department, after being introduced to the interviewing Agents by Chief W.H. DELEZER (NA), Vinnetka, Illimois, Police Department.

They advised that on Tuesday, August 20, 1960, they were contacted by HIMAN BRODY AD HULL, Hartselle, Abbasa, the is the author of Three Lives for mississippi. Hr. HULL was accompanied by hir. (First Lane Unknown) HAROLE, who is a photographer for "Lock" compains. Or. INLE exhibited letters which he claimed were from 1/1/195 1414. Well and were addressed to a Mesissippi attorney. These letters tero purportedly given to Will by the attorney. HUTE told then that he had obtained all consercial rights to RAY's story and for this he has agreed to underwrite the costs of WY's defence in the forthcoming nurser trial in hempits. Termesson. The aforementioned letters were writted on half disets of veilor legal foolscap and both of the ULIMARIAN stated that they recognized the handwriting on these papers on that of the subject RAY, whom they know under the mone of Julia RAZLIS. At tib point, the LLANGLING were exhibited several photographs of the subject, Jakes Take Ray, along with other photographs and they both positively identified Jakes 1968 have as a man exployed by them from hey 3, 1967, to June 24,1967, as a distresher and cock's helper. The MINDIPARS verified the foregoing statement by formishing to the interviewing Agents their payroll ledger sheet. A review of the ledger sheet reveals the following information:

RAYES OF JUNE MAYES and signed by HARVEY A. BLINGWAM. The checks are endorsed by Julie L. RAYES or JUNE RAYES, two of which have the address 1648 Lunt, Chicago, undermeath the signature. The foregoing checks total \$664.34.

Mr. K.INGENAN edvised that to the best of his recellection at this time, the last check, Number 5357, was mailed to RAY's brother, name unrecalled, in Northbrook, Illinois, at RAY's request since he left his employment prior to receipt of the check, stating that he was going to work on boats with his brother. As Mr. KilliGENAN recalls, he received a letter from EAY requesting that the pay due be sent to his brother.

Both of the CLRODANS characterized James EARL NAT as an excellent employee, quiet, attentive, prompt, polite, a very good spricer, but to their knowledge. had no friends or visitors during the time of his employment. They did retall that during the subject's last week of employment, he received three or four phone calls from a male individual who sweed that he was DAY's brother. They could not recall the individual's name, nor did they believe that they would receptize this person's voice if they heard it again.

In conversation with ir. HULL, the KLISTLIANS received the following information on a confidential basis and edvised that they were rather reluctant to divulge it, but felt that it was their duty as citizens. They requested that this information be mintained on a confidential basis within the FBI. They advised that they contected Chief DEKNIMS because of his reputation and are now following his advice in furnishing this information to the FBI:

er: Mile deved the Klimmans letters from RAY in which Rev Listed employment at the Indian Trail Restaurent. (It should be noted that this restourant is an old, large, upper class restaurant, of excellent reputation. Glef DENVISC advised that the KLINGDIANS themselves have an excallent reputation within the computty and that he bolds then in very high regard). Will told them that RAY had verved seven years of a treaty-year contends at Jefferson, Hissouri, prison, during which time he had eight visitors. one of which was his brother, hovever, MUL did not identify which one. Frior to his escape, Wil had stanked away a rapor, green prison trousers which had been dyed flock, and 12 hersey bors in anticipation that he would have to go without food for some time. That also had \$300 in his slow. He escaped in a bred truck and valued to Chicago, Illinois, from Jefferson City, Missouri, which took him about eight days. (The KLIEGEWEs do recall that when the subject first appeared at the restourant, his feet were smallen and that their sister-in-law gave him two Ace bandages to use which he returned three or four days leter. This supposedly was mentioned in the letter in HUE's possession).

Thereafter, ANT read the advertisement in the Tribune when the KLINGRAMS had advertised for help in the restaurant. HULL said that the subject in the letter

mentioned that the employment at the Indian Iral Restaurant was the "high point of his life".

MUNIC mentioned that had had only three jobs in his life, one of which was in a shoe factory outside of East St. Louis, Illinois, which we prior to his soing to prison the last time. He also said that during the time RAY was employed at the restaurant, he was tapped on the shoulder by an individual vio recognized his and who threstened to reveal his identity to the police and cause RAY's nature to prison if he, RAY, did not work for this person. Will said that RAY was given St. 200 during the initial contacts by the alleged conspirators, and was ultimately paid \$15,000, but was due to receive sore.

Again, according to INTE. But was told to go to Conside to Idvestigate the difficulty of crossing the border. Supposedly RAY ands two trips through the Detroit Tunnel Into Canada. He also made a third trip to Canada, dote and sequence not given, and was instructed to obtain a 40-year-old newspaper, get the manes of the cales born that de, and search the current phone directory for similar names. He was then to mirroil the individuals with similar names to determine whether or not his physical description was similar to theirs. Thereafter, he telephoned persons of his like description, utilizing a prefert, and thereby found a men who had never applied for a passport. RAY then applied for a passport in this name.

The MLINGENANS advised that they were not same that they were furnishing this information in its proper sequence, but that to the best of their recollection, the information preceding and following was given to them in this order by HULE. Thereafter, AAY was given more money to purchase a fustang which was to be driven to Acapulce, Mexico, for the purpose of obtaining a tourist attacker. He then drove through Mexico to the West Coast and hid out there to receive further instructions from the other insiviousle in the alleged conspiracy. HULE sweet that HAY was flown to Atlanta from the West Coast, but the time was not right, there was no action endie was sent back to California. He was also told to be in Hesissippi at a certain time and place. Supposedly Reversed MARTH LUTHER MING, JR. was at a Medicay Im Hotel in Atlanta, Georgia, when FAY was flown there.

Subsequently, Not wer given money to obtain binosulars and a shotgum and was to go to Memphis to be somewhere at 3 p.m. in room 312 or 33. Supposedly there were other individuals who also came to this room and there was a Megro male who purportedly called \$155 out to the balcony. According to MULE, the actual murderer of KING was not MAY, although MAY was present and at a later time (probably the trial) MAY will identify the murderer. MAY did pick up the rifle, ran to his car, and sped to a rendervous in Atlanta, Georgia, he was supposed to pick up a bundle of money, however, the conspirators did not appear. RAY allegedly spent several days or hours at this apartment in Atlanta, Georgia, swalting the arrival of his "fellow conspirators".

According to NUID, the plan was for RAY to go to limited, but immediately fly morth to throw off pursuit and to steer all investigation to herico. If wever, since the conspirators did not appear in Atlanta. NAY fled to Capita thereafter utilizing his knowledge to obtain a pessport and fled to ingland.

The KLINGHAM'S privated that the rest of HALE'S proty substantially follows the newspaper accounts which appeared after publicat RAY's errest in Declard. They did note that HALE stated that RAY did not a back in londen because he get real low on maney. HALE at no time identified the alleged fellow conspirators of RAY. He did executive the Ladding to secrety and told then that he would buil the look' proofs on September 10,1968, and the story would be in the ROY and the following agents for review.

The Milkowide advised that MV began working for these as a dishwasher and because of his excellent attitude was advanced to cook's helper. During the time he was in their employ, they did not observe his in a car, nor did they know his to own an automobile. We had no visitors, he did not wear glasses, he had no women friends, nor did he make any givences toward the female personnel employed at the restaurant and they noted that his hair was 'less highy' during the time he was at the restaurant than shown in the photographs.

They are not sure how he came to work from his apartment, but believe headfat have been met at the Eden's Expresses by HILLE FLERY and FALD HIRES, who were also employees at the restaurant.

His conduct was excellent and they cannot recall him making any comments one way or another about members of the Hegre race and specifically to comments whatsoever concerning MARTH LUTHER LING. JR. RHY made no reference to his previous caployant, but did mention that he was in brimerhoven, Germany, during Martin War II. They advised that when RAY received the phone calls during his last weak of caployment he seemed to be disturbed and that his concentration on his work was not as good as it toughly was.

They then recalled that according to HUTS, that when JAMES HARD BAY left England, he was going to Lisbon to get to Africa, however, he was unable to do so which is when he returned to England and held up a bank receiving about \$200 in loot. They again stated that the information furnished to them by HULB came from letters which had had written to his attorney, tho in turn turned them over to the author. Also Br. KLINGHAR stated that in one of the letters which he believed was to the attorney from HAY, while he was in London, England, there was a drawing identifying a location which appeared to be giversey Street and Sheffield Avenue in Chicago, Illinois.

At the conclusion of the interview, the illinguance again requested that this information be maintained in confidence and expressed a willingness to co-operate with the IBI in ay way possible.

Mr. DONNELLY stated that someone of the individuals who had lived in his apartments had told him he was moving out of the apartment to go home and stand trial for mardering his brother-in-law. However, Mr. DONNELLY was unable to recall who had made this statement to him, and he did not know if this statement had been made by Mr. RAYMS or some other person.

Mrs. DONNELLY advised she and her husband, EDWARD, own the building at 2731 North Sheffield. Mrs. DONNELLY stated that they ront apartments in the basement and on the second foor of their building.

Ers. DONNELLY reviewed the Rent Record Book maintained for the rentals at 2731 Forth Sheffield, and determined there was an entry dated April 30, 1967, showing a rental to a JOHN LARRY RAYS. Hrs. DONNELLY stated the bandwriting on the entry would be the handwriting of the person renting the reom. This person occupied the rear basement apartment.

Mrs. DONYELLY advised from the Bent Becord Book she could not determine how long this individual stayed at the apartment; however, the best she could recall at this time was that Mr. EAVES stayed there approximately three or four weeks. Mrs. DONNELLY advised the apartment is rented by the week and the rental is \$12, or \$12 a week.

Ers. DONELLY stated she had some difficulty recalling this individual, but to the best of her recollection he was a quiet man she did not associate with anyone else in the building and did not have any friends or visitors case by the apartment. She further recalled Mr. NAYME had complained of his feet herting. She stated on one or two occasions when she was in the rear basement apartment while he was reuting it, she noticed he had a lot of books and had begint some cooking utensils.

Mrs. DONNELLY said that Mr. EAYMS received one letter that she know of while he stayed at the apartment. endorsement on Q403, when compared with the known writings of RAY, the presence of unexplained variations, insufficient comparable material and distortion in some of the questioned endorsements precluded a definite determination as to whether RAY prepared the endorsements on Q398 through Q405.

The endorsement on Q403 is too distorted for comparison purposes. Although some similarities were noted in the date on line 24 on Q407 beside the Rayms signature when compared with the comparable writing of RAY, the limited and overwritten nature of this date precluded a definite determination as to whether RAY prepared this date.

On June 21, 1977, Kent Collins, Newscaster, KHQA TV, Quincy, Illinois, advised that on night of June 20, 1977, Jerry Ray, the brother of James Earl Ray, contacted KHQA - TV and wanted to be interviewed concerning James Earl Ray.


Jerry Ray advised that he has been employed as a greens keeper at a country club in subsurban Chicago, Illinois area. However, Jerry Ray has lost his jobs due to Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) pressure after Jerry Ray stated that the country club also employs a number of illegal aliens and the country club did not want Federal authorities messing around the country club.

Jerry Ray stated James Earl Ray does not want to go to a Federal prison because Justice Department people will see that James Earl Ray is never heard of again.

Jerry Ray stated that Jerry Ray has been in contact with members of the House Committee on assassinations and that during the past few days he has talked to Walter Fanteroy. This has been since James Earl Ray's escape and recapture.

James Ray claimed that a business card was found in the car James Earl Ray drove in Memphis at the time of the assassination of King. This card belongs to an individual who also had the use of the car and it has been established

that this person was connected with Central Intelligence Agency. Jerry Ray claimed his brother, James Earl Ray, was set up concerning King's assassination and that there is a witness who was four blocks away at the time of King's death who can verify Ray could not have killed King.

Jerry Ray saw Jame s Earl Ray a few days before the escape and at that time James Earl Ray was very despondent so Jerry Ray was not surprised at the escape attempt.

Jerry Ray stated that definitely James Earl Ray does not want to go to the Federal Penitentiary at Marion, Illinois. He stated that at one time before, Federal authorities attempted to place James Earl Ray in the Federal hospital at Springfield, Missouri, in attempt to keep James Earl Ray from talking.

The Quincy Herald-Whig, Quincy, Illinois, dated June 21, 1977, contained the following article concerning an interview by Jerry Ray:

Brother says Ray saw escape as last hope

By PAUL COLGAN

James Earl Ray was despondent over reports the House Assessination Committee was to be disbanded when he tried to escape from a Tennessee prison eariler this month, his younger brother, Jerry, said in Quincy Monday.

Jerry, 41, who lost his job as a nightwatchman at a country club near Chicago last week because of the attention his brother's escape brought, was in Quincy to visit his sister at a nursing home.

Both Rays lived in Quincy for a time in their youth.

Jerry talked about his brother in a two-hour interview. The following is a portion of that interview.

Jerry Ray said his brother considered the Congressional investigation his last hope to be experated in connection with the 1967 Martin Luther King slaying.

Jerry Ray maintained that his brother was innocent of the killing and was "set-up" by others to take the blame.

"He was depressed because he knew they had a thing underway to discredit the assassination committee and try to abolish it," Jerry Ray explained.

Jerry had talked with James on the Sunday before June 10 when James and six fellow prisoners scaled the wall of the Brushy Mountain State Prison in Petros, Tenn.

"He told me 'that's the only hope I've got left,' "Jerry Ray explained. "He said 'if they abolish the committee, I'll just have to get out some other way."

"At the time it didn't hit me, what he meant," Jerry said. A New York Times article about trouble in the committee and

moves to abolish it published a couple of weeks before his escape was the cause of James' depression, according to Jerry Ray

"The New York Times article set him off," Jerry Ray said

James Earl Ray has exhausted nearly every legal avenue he had, including a review by the U. S. Supreme Court, in attempts to have his case retried. Ray had pleaded guilty to the killing in return for a life sentence instead of death in 1968 for the King killing.

Later, after he was sentenced, Ray began to talk of a conspiracy and that he had not acted alone in the killing.

Now his brother Jerry maintains that James had nothing to do with the killing but rather was used as a "set-up guy" to take the blame for the killing.

"He has witnesses to prove he was at a service station four blocks away," at the time of the assassination, Jerry claimed.

"The only evidence they could use against him was that he had his fingerprints on the rifle," Jerry Ray said. He claimed James bought the rifle but didn't shoot it.

A rifle found after the King shooting in Memphis, which is believed to be the murder weapon, had James Earl Ray's fingerprints on it.

Because he believes his brother innocent, Jerry said he feared for his brother during the escape, thinking that other involved in the conspiracy might have arranged the escape to kill him. "There was something strange about it" Jerry said.

"A lot of people would like to see him dead," Jerry added.

"I don't know it he was tricked out or if it was a legal escape." Jerry Ray explained. "The reason I thought he might have been tricked out was because so many guys vent and he never did operate that way before. Before every time he escaped it was by himself. And this time they had seven of them that took off so I figured there might have been some trickery going on."

Jerry Ray said he didn't believe his brother planned the escape.

"The guys he hung around with, they didn't escape with him."

Jerry said he has not talked with his brother since the escape because James is being held in solitary confinement for 30 days after the escape.

But prison officials contradict Jerry's version, saying it was a well-planned escape complete with a diversion to draw attention away from the secluded section of the walled prison where James Ray and his comrades used a pipe ladder to climb a wall and escape.

Ray was captured four days ilater hiding under a pile of leaves in the wooded mountains surrounding the prison.

Brushy Mountain was considered escape proof but Ray had always contended he could escape from any prison. He had been on the run from an escape from Jefferson City prison in Missouri when he became involved in the King assassination.

Also, Jerry Ray claims that the federal officials did not want a Congressional investigation into the King asiassination and that the FBI and CIA were trying to stop Ray from talking.

Jerry claimed the name of a

man on a card James had at the time of the assassination, and given him by the materious "Raoul" who Fay chims planned the assassination, has been traced to the CIA.

Jerry said that James believes the Congressional inquiry is his "last hope" in getting to the truth in the events surrounding the assassination of King.

Because of this, Jerry said James has been extremely cooperative with the panel giving them all the information he has, including the name on the card and some phone numbers given to him by "Raoul."

"He has given them every bit

"He has given them every bit of information he knows," Jerry said.

Jerry said he is constantly besieged by reporters and FBI men. "You just kind of live with it," he says.

He was working as a nightwatchman at a country club near Chicago for the last four years, but when the FBI and reporters came looking for him, the club asked him to leave.


