Until further notice from the Dureau, the foregoing policy should be followed. Any deviations must be only with Bureau approval. Meither King nor representatives for him should be advised of the information concerning the threats.

On August 13, 1966, at 9:30 PM Sergeant Kevin O'Malley, 20th District, Chicago Police Department, Chicago, Illinois, advised a representative of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) in Chicago that at approximately 8:30 PM on August 13, 1966, Alfred G. Schneider, a white male, age 54, who resides at 5054 North Leavitt Street, Chicago, Illinois, telephonically contacted the 20th District of the Chicago Police Department stating he will kill Martin Luther King, Jr., if King goes to Winnemac Park, Leavitt and Foster Streets, Chicago, Illinois. Sergeant O'Malley stated that Schneider told him he wanted to be on record should Martin Luther King, Jr., appear in Winnemac Park and be killed. Sergeant O'Malley stated that Schneider appeared to be sober and rational. Sergeant O'Malley advised that the Chicago Police Department is investigating this matter. Sergeant O'Malley further advised that he knows of no marches that have been held near Winnemac Park and he further understands that Martin Luther King, Jr., is not currently in the Chicago, Illinois, area.

Buxton, 3102 South Wallace, Chicago, Illinois, who stated that his telephone number is 222-7029, born Bockville, Ontario, Canada, age 49, four and a half years in Army as a commando, telephonically contacted the Chicago Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and stated "Martin Luther King is a man to be watched. Where is he getting that garbage. I'd blade him if he got in my way." When asked what he meant by blade him, Buxton stated, "I'd kill him if he got in my way, yes I am a threat to him. I'm not prejudiced. Have you got that written down? I'm sincere. I have no malice against the man. The man has agitated too long. I don't want a man like this. I hate spocks. He belongs home and has no right agitating."

Buxton gave the impression to the interviewing personnel of possibly being intoxicated and at times was incoherent. The telephone call was being made from his Chicago telephone according to Buxton.

This caller advised that he had learned that Dexter was aware of an individual who was currently reported to be offering \$10,000.00 for the assassination of Martin Luther King, Jr. if and when King returns to the Chicago area again. He advised, however, that if he subsequently learned any additional information, he would furnish same to Finley.



A Chicago source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, and who has knowledge of the NSWPP, advised that John Medizer became active in the affairs of the Chicago unit of the NSWPP in August, 1967. Medizer is described as a white male, 5'll", tight wavy blond hair, blue eyes, 28 years old, ruddy complexion, born in West Frankfort, Illinois, who has reportedly spent some time in past years working as a drummer in various Dallas. Texas night clubs.

This source, and a second Chicago source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, subsequently advised, Medizer took up residence in the Chicago unit headquarters of the NSWPP at 1314 West Ohio Street, Chicago, in September, 1967, and became active in the affairs of the NSWPP.

Medizer took part in a NSWPP sponsored counter-demonstration against certain Anti-Viet Nam peace demonstrators in Washington, D.C. on October 20, 21, 1967, according to these sources.

Sources have advised that Medizer remained active and resided at the NSWPP headquarters in Chicago unitl January, 1968, when this headquarters was vacated and the NSWPP members living here had to locate other residences.

The records of the Chicago Police Department, Records and Communications Section, as checked March 22, 1968, concerning Medizer were negative.

Geneva Jones, Supervisor, Driver's License Section, Secretary of State, Springfield, reflected only one record being issued to any John Medizer. Driver's License issued April 19, 1962, to one John C. Medizer, 3117 Sarah Street, Franklin Park, Illinois, described as 5'11". 145 pounds, blond hair, blue eyes, date of birth

On March 23, 1968, Vincent Burnell, Foreman, Roto Print Company, 4601 West Belmont Avenue. Chicago, advised that John Medizer, born Social Security Number residing 3208 North Sheffield, (Diplomat Hotel), was one of his shop workers. For several months, Medizer has been bragging to his co-workers about his activities in the Nazi Party in the United States. According to Burnell, Medizer has displayed photographs of himself with women whom Medizer claimed were the daughters of Eichmann and Himmler both of whom had been high party funtionaries in the Third Reich.

On March 20, 1968, Medizer advised Burnell that he was quitting his job at Roto Print to work for the Nazi Party in Argentina. He advised he would travel to Dallas, Texas, first, visit relatives, then travel to Argentina, reportedly on a "forged passport."

Burnell has subsequently advised that during his "bragging" to other employees he reportedly read letters from someone in Dallas connected with the American Nazi Party, that they were active in Dallas, and "having a ball." Medizer also mentioned in vague terms threats against Martin Luther King, and plans to "take care of him."

On March 29, 1968, Burnell advised Medizer picked up his last paycheck, passed out some NSWPP literature and stated that his present plans included a visit to St. Louis, Missouri, then a trip to the Washington, D. C. area where he would discuss his plans with Major Koehl at Arlington and do what ever "The Major" wanted. He indicated that his plans may not include a trip to Argentina depending on what "The Major" had to say.

He stated that he was sympathetic to the ideas practiced by the John Eirch Society, and Creamer denied any connection with the American Nazi Party.

Creamer was unable to furnish any other information stating that he was too frightened to recall and then stated that he had run out on the above described meeting by way of the back stairs.

Creamer was advised that the Federal Bureau of Investigation did not afford protection to individuals and was told that his information would be furnished to the Chicago Police Department.





DONALD STOUT

On September 7, 1966, Harry P. Stewart, Secret Service, Pittsburgh, Pa., furnished the following information which he had received this date from his nephew, Stewart Lindh, 2206 Greenwich, San Francisco, California.

Recently, Lindh and two others, Jeffrey Kronen, 58 Miller Road, Farmingdale, Long Island, New York, and Richard Larkey, care of Mrs. Schonberger, 2829 Highland Street, Allentown, Pa., were in San Francisco and answered an advertisement placed in the "San Francisco Chronicle" by Donald Stout, who was seeking paying passengers to accompany him on a trip from San Francisco to New York City in his car. An agreement was reached whereby each of the above paid Stout \$50 for the trip.

On September 5, 1966, Stout and his passengers arrived in Kansas City, Mo., and drove to a local YMCA. While the three passengers were checking in, Stout disappeared with his car and their personal effects, which included suitcases, clothes, books, records, and a guitar. Richard Larkey also then noted that two blank Wells Fargo checks were missing from his pocketbook. Lindh estimated that the missing items were worth about \$1,000.

Before arriving at Kansas City, Stout made it clear to his passengers that he was rabidly anti-Negro and he told them that he was going to shoot Martin Luther King. He furnished no further details.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

DONALD STOUT

Lindh advised Mr. Stewart that Donald Stout was a white male, 5'7" - 5'8", 210 pounds, had a stout build, medium complexion, and dark, greasy hair which had a small wave in front. Stout had told Lindh that he resided at 826 South Wabash, Chicago, Illinois, and was employed by the Zastern States Freight Lines, Terre Haute, Indiana. He drove a 1966 light green Chevrolet Impala with Massachusetts plates. Lindh was reasonably certain that the plate number was P83473, and said that the Kansas City Police Department was told of the incident.

There was no reasonable basis for assuming identity with the DONALD STOUT in this matter.

Chicago is conducting no further inquiry insofar as STOUT is concerned at the present time.

On February 21, 1954, Assistant Chief of Police RALPH JOHESON, Rapid City, Bouth Dahots, Police Department, contacted SA RomaRT. J. STEVING concurring the above captioned matter.

Jimes i stated that he had interviewed a discharged colored soldier by the name of ALFRE BATTUR concerning has transportation from Taccaa, Machington, to Rapid City, South Daketa, on February 22-23, 195h, and was of the opinion that the ear in which sATTUR had made this trip was a stolen automobile. He continued that this automobile had been driven by the conject to the radio center, Rapid City, South Poketa, for repairs on the car radio, and that the repair can had been emploises, had taken the license number which was Oregon 949-198, and had related this number to the state radio dispatcher in Rapid City for a check with Cregon officials. The Oregon authorities replied that this license on the Packard had been insued to a U. B. CALBRER of Portland, Oregon, who was an airline pilot for a Brive-Out of a new car from Tetroit, Hickigan. Oregon authorities stated they were unable to contact Mr. Calbrer as he was presently on a flight out of Oregon at that time.

JOHNS II stated that incomed as it was known that the subject had very little money at the time he left Rapid City that afternoon and the fact that their was a burglary of a cafe at Scenic, South Dakota, before 5:00 p.m. that date, it had caused a state-wide alert to be issued for the pickup of the subject driving this automobile. He stated, hexever, that the authorities had been unsuccessful in picking up this automobile before it left the state.

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BATTLE stated that he was discharged from the Army on February 22, 1954, at Fort Lewis, Weshington, and had proceeded to the train station at Tacona, washington, at approximately 10:00 a.m. that late to catch a train to his home in Washington, D.C. Before purchasing his ticket, he was approached by the subject, who asked him where he was headed. Then PARTIN said Tashington, U.C., the subject replied that he was a Merchant Murino who had been off his ship for approximately two weeks and was heaced for Haltimore, Peryland, through Chicago to catch his next chip. The subject stated to this pronts lived in Chicago and that he wanted to visit then for about thirty a nutes careate. The subject told ENTIE he had purchased the 1954 Packard approximately three weeks previously at a Packard cealer in Oregon, and was broke as a result of his purchase. The subject told larring that he would give him a rade to Washington, D.C., for \$70 which was 421 less than tra - fate, to which BATTEN agreed, and they left right then from Tacema, Washington. BATTLE stated that both men drove the automobile and as they came through the states of Ideho, Fontana and Wyoming, they only made short stops for food and gasoline. At one place they were having motor trouble and when they stopped to get it fixed, BATTLE mentioned to the Subject that he had only to produce the purchase papers on the new car and it would not cost has anything for repairs due to the guarantee. To this the subject reglied that the masers on the automobile were at here.

When they arrived in Rapid City, South Dakota, at approximately 2:30 p.m. on February 23, 1953, the radio in the automobile in the car was not working and the subject said that they would stop and have it repaired. They took the automobile to the Radio Center in Rapid City, where a repair man removed the radio and said the repairs would take approximately one and one-half hours. The subject and BATTIN then went to the T.M.C.A. to take a shower and the subject then took the car to a service station nearby to have it mashed and them he returned to the Y.M.C.A. where he took a shower. The subject then went to the barber shop and get his hair out and returned to the Y.M.C.A. and told (ATTIN) he was going to get the car and have the radio put back in and that he would return to the Y.M.C.A. and pick up BATTIN. Stated that he waited about two hours and then called a text cab and rode around town looking for the subject. He, subsequently stopped a police car and reported the incident and the fact that his bag and discharge papers were still in this missing car.

BATTLE stated that he had been in the trunk of the car and the subject had absolutely no lungage. The subject, however, showed HATTLE a paper from his wallet which listed his address as somewhere on the could side of Chicago, the exact address HATTLE could not recall. HATTLE stated that he had paid the subject the UTO, which was the agreed price, but he was quite sure the subject has spent almost all of it as the cor used a

When havill reported this incident to the Police Reportment, they immediately elected with the Radio Center, which was closed at that time, and discovered that the subject had left all of HATIL's clothing and papers at that place of business, saying that he would reuten to pick them up later.

THERENT MADAIL, Deputy Sheriff, Pennington County, South Dekota, advised that he had been the investigator at the turglary at the Scenic Cafe, Scenic, South Delote, on the efterneon of February 23, 1954, and there had been nothing in his investigation that would point to the subject as having been the burglar in this case.

Repeated attempts to ascertain whether or not this was a stolen automobile was hade through State Headquarters at Pierre, South Dakota, with negative results on February 24, and 25, 1954.

Captain CAVILLE NOATAN, State Highway Patrol, sevised CA STEWAS on February 26, 1954, that the wife of the sheriff at Pierre, South Dakets, has received a vire from authorities at Portland, Oregon, to the effect that the car in question had been reported as stolen. The sheriff's wife at that time notified the Portland authorities that either the Police Department or the Sh riff's Office at Rapid City, South Daketa, could give them more information in this matter.

Chief of Police LUMIS MURDBY, Rapid City Police Department, and GLEME BLOT, Sheriff, Pennington County, South Pakota, advised to date they have not been contacted by the authorities at Portland, (regon.

Mr. LEGIARD TIACIER, Radio Center, 723 Main Street, Rapid City, South Dakota, made available Repair Greer Number 30734 dated February 23, 1954, which reflected that DON STUIT, whose address was listed as 1635 Trement, Oceanside, California, signed a repair order on a Packard auto type radio, model h39279, Serial Number PT3522. This repair order reflected that a new transformer had been installed at a total charge of M12.09. This repair order was signed by the subject, using the name of DON L. STOUR. It is noted, however, that the last t in the spelling of the same STOUT was not croused and was made in such a manner that it could be taken as an L, which would make the spelling STOUL.

TIACHER advised that the subject first care to the Radio Center at approximately 2:00 p.m., on the afternoon of February 22, 1954, and said that he had gone to the Packard Garage and had been referred to the Radio
