



This is to record several phase calls between 7:45 AM and 8:45 AM today.

Supervisor LONG, Extension 513, called from the Bureau first to inquire as to the results of our inquiry at Firestone concerning the tires found on the Mustang recovered in Atlanta. He stated that the Legat from Mexico City communication had asked whether or not the tires were white sidewalls and did they bear the legend SIN CAMARA. Mr. LONG wanted to be called back immediately.

I called Supervisor HARDING in Atlanta who confirmed the fact that the information we obtained on 4-12-68 from Firestone and furnished to Atlanta had been incorporated in a teletype from Atlanta to the Bureau either on the evening of the 12th or early on the 13th, but in discussion with him I noted that the inquiry we had made before did not include the two questions LONG is now asking as to white sidewalls and the legend SIN CAMARA.

I called Mr. LONG back and told him that apparently the questions he has in front of him were not those sent to Cleveland before, but were additional questions the Legat is now asking and that they would be questions that Atlanta would have to answer. They can only be answered by someone who has the car and the tires in front of them.

After rechecking the communication in front of him, Mr. LONG agreed and stated that he would contact Atlanta and resolve the problem and we would have to do nothing further with Firestone, UAC.





Re memo of SA MICHAEL J. MAHANEY, JR. dated 4/9/68 at Cleveland.

This is to advise that on April 5, 1968, SEATON was advised by SA MAHANEY to make some inquiries throughout the ghetto areas in Cleveland, Ohio, in an effort by him, SEATON, to determine whether or not any racial disturbances were being planned in these areas, particularly Hough, Outhwaite and Cedar neighborhoods as a result of the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., which had occurred in Memphis, Tennessee on April 4, 1968.

On the same date, SEATON advised SA MAHANEY that he made his rounds throughout the ghetto areas in Cleveland as requested and that there was a lot to talk in the areas regarding the death of KING, however, things were relatively quiet and as best he could determine, no disturbances of any kind had been planned for those areas.

SEATON further advised SA MAHANEY that on the evening of April 4, 1968, the Mayor of Cleveland as well as other officials, athletes, social workers, were out in the streets in these areas advising the people to keep calm in this time of crisis.

In conclusion, SEATON advised SA MAHANEY that he would be alert for any information of value relative to any disturbances occurring in these areas and would contact SA MAHANEY as soon as he obtained any information relative to this matter,

On April 8 & 9, 1968, SEATON recontacted SA MAHANEY and advised that things were still quite in the ghetto areas of Cleveland and that he had heard of no rumbles in the streets relative to any racial disturbances occurring in the ghetto areas. Again SEATON reiterated that he would maintain contact in these areas and in the event any information should develop concerning any disturbances, he would immediately apprise SA MAHANEY of same:

Upon arrival in Akron, he was extremely tired and took a nap for two or three hours, and when he awoke he turned on the radio and heard that Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. had been shot.

MILLER stated he did not go through Memphis, Tennessee, and in fact has not been in Memphis for sometime.

Sergeant VICTOR KOVACIC, Scientific Identification Unit (SIU), Cleveland Police Department, advised that the Cleveland Police Department maintains a laundry mark file which is at the present time not completely up to date. He stated that the department started this file some time ago and tries to keep it up to date, but this is difficult. He stated that they send a simple preliminary form to the various police districts and then the zone cars take these forms to the various laundries. The laundries in turn cooperate by filling out the forms and then send them back to the Police Department.

He stated that experience had shown that some of the laundries are more diligent then others in answering these inquiries. He caused a search to be made of his files and located only one similar tag and coding to compare with a questioned item.

He stated that this was a thermosealing process tag, pink in color, 3/8" wide, 1" long and having the coding 2 B ll. He indicated that this code did not reflect a dash between the B and the 11. This coding is that used by the Moreland Cleaners at 12110 Woodlawn Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio, but is a laundry mark.

He stated that he did not know specifically at that time how many companies in the Cleveland area use a Thermo seal marking system.
