



Mrs. CHORTOS was interviewed on 4/26/68, at which time she stated that after she had thought about this matter and visualized the car she realized from her visualization that the car had not been blue at all but was green and further that the license plate number was PS 633 or PS 655 followed by an additional four digits. According to CHORTOS, this made the plate two letters and seven digits. She stated that there was a Missouri plate and that the color was white on green.



On April 18, 1968, DAVID H. FOSTER, Funeral Director, Spikers Funeral Home, 710 West Tuscarawas Street, Canton, Ohio, advised that on the previous evening he had met with his stock club at Dick Logan's Restaurant in Canton and at about 9:45 p.m., he and another member, Attorney DON STEINER, had proceeded to the Cabaret Bar located across the street from Logan's Restaurant. As they were sitting at the bar, another patron, whom he described as 36 to 38 years of age, white male, brown wavy hair, good looking, well dressed, wearing cuff links and a black onyx ring on his right hand and a wedding band on his left hand with neat appearing nails and hands, who was approximately 5 feet 10 inches 160 pounds, struck up a conversation with them and stated that he was a psychologist teaching at Kent State University (KSU), and further stated that he was from the Akron, Ohio, area and subsequently stated the Alliance, Ohio, area. Mr. FOSTER stated that the man introduced himself as Dr. ORDIN T. PILT or TILT (ph). He stated he noted the man was drinking VO and water and further commented that he had received his B.S. degree from Toledo University and his Doctor's degree from the University of Michigan.

FOSTER stated that the following morning he had observed a photograph in the newspaper of ERIE STARVO GALT and thought there was some similarity in the appearance of the photograph and the man he had seen in the bar.

Mr. FOSTER was questioned as to whether he noted any special peculiarity and he stated he did not, that the man's conversation indicated that he was probably a midwesterner or a native of that vicinity. He added that the barmaid, LINDA, had served this patron and also suggested that Mr. STEINER may have made some observation regarding this individual.

LINDA FARKAS, 1220 Wertz Avenue, SW, Canton, Ohio, was contacted at the Cabaret Bar and stated that she had had a telephone call from Mr. FOSTER regarding the patron who had been in the bar the previous night. She stated that she did not feel that he resembled the photograph she had seen of ERIC STARVO GALT which appeared on TV the previous night. She stated that she recalls the man had said his name was ORDWAY T. PELT (ph) and had insisted that he be called DOC. She said that he had asked her to dance; however, she had refused and he had also asked her for a date to go bowling, but she again refused. He inquired as to where "the action was in Canton", indicating that he was not familiar with the area, however, he also mentioned that he was from the Alliance and Akron. Ohio. areas. She said that she recalled that he drank VO and water and left after a short time in the bar. She described him as approximately 30 years of age, white male, light brown hair, blue eyes, 5 feet 8 inches, slight build, wearing a shirt open at the neck and a suit, wearing a wedding band, and she did not think that he appeared identical to the photograph of GALT.

On April 18, 1968, DONALD STEINER, Attorney, was contacted at his office in the Harter Bank Building and stated that he had been in telephonic contact with DAVID FOSTER, a member of his stock club, and they had discussed the individual they had seen at the Cabaret Bar the previous evening, and what resemblance he may have had to ERIC STARVO GALT. Mr. STEINER stated that he was embarrassed to have had Mr. FOSTER suggest that possibly the patron was identical with GALT inasmuch as he did not feel that the person was identical although there was some similarity in his appearance. He stated that during the conversation that this patron had introduced himself as Dr. PEEL (ph) and that he was a psychiatrist and teaching psychology at KSU. He stated he was in the presence of this man approximately 1/2 hour and described him as a white male, 40, dark hair, medium to slight build, 5 feet 10-11 inches, 170-175 pounds, and no noticeable rural accent to his speech. This patron indicated that he was familiar with the writings on psychiatry and Mr. STEINER questioned him about special writings and he acknowledged that he was familiar with them. He also
