Mexico Releases King Suspect

HERMOSILLO, Mexico — (UPI) — Police today released Daniel D. Kennedy, a bearded hitchhiker from Baltimore, whom they had arrested in their hunt for a suspect in the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King.

Kennedy was arrested yesterday in a cafe in Caborca, 80 miles southwest of

Nogales, Ariz., and brought in handcuffs to this Sonora state capital 120 miles to the south after police questioned him for 12 hours in his hotel room.

The hotel owner had told police he thought Kennedy looked like James E. Ray, who is sought by the FBI.

[REDACTED] were both working inside at Plant # 3 of the Molded Fiber Glass Body Co. on Ann Ave. when about 1:15 P.M. a white male came to an opening along the railroad tracks and asked what ~~City~~ he was in and in what direction the town or business section was. These two workers asked where he came from and he said a long way off and wouldn't tell them where. He talked with a southern accent. This white male was wearing a railroad engineers cap and a black and gold jacket with a crest on the left shoulder. This crest was of the Sigma Tau Nu Fraternity. This Fraternity is predominately a Southern one. This man was described as being in his early 40s, medium build, sandy thick hair, blue eyes

[REDACTED] thought this man looked similar to a sketch they saw on the news of the killer of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. They told their boss about it but he thought it far fetched so they had to wait until they finished work to report this. They were given description sheets to fill out and the cruisers on duty were given this information.

Ohio was contacted at plant No. 3, Molded Fiber Glass Body
works, Ann Ave. Ashtabula, Ohio.

He stated that a man walked up to the loading dock
of the plant from the area of the Rail Road tracks on 4/9/68.
He asked the name of the town then stated he just got off the
train and indicated that he must have taken the wrong train.
The only information he would give was that he came from a
long way away. He asked for directions to the city of
Ashtabula and left walking in the direction of the city.

He stated that he had observed a composit photo of
the suspect in this matter on the Huntley Brinkley Report
on Monday evening and believed this individual looked like
the suspect. He stated that since talking to the Police he
observed a photo of the suspect in the paper and decided that
the person observed by him differed from the suspect as
follows; His eyes were not as deep set; His nose did not have
the same distinctive point. He stated the receding hairline
and general shape of the face were similar to the suspect.

He left the area in the direction of the city of Ashtabula, Ohio. He stated that he has never observed a photo of the suspect in this case.

He advised that he would also attempt to determine the identity of any employee who would currently be layed off due to an injured arm.

[REDACTED] later called and advised that he had the employee records checked for the past year, and determined that there were no employees with the last name of RAY who had worked for the American Bridge of National Tube. He advised that there is no employee currently layed off ~~for a~~ due to a bad arm. He advised that there is an employee of American Bridge with the first name of RAYMOND, but that this individual is 50 years old, and has been with the Co. for 8-9 years, and bears no resemblance to JAMES EARL RAY, aka. He advised that this individual's name is [REDACTED], and is a native of Lorain.

By teletype dated 4-29-68, the Bureau has directed that all offices having law enforcement agencies in their territories which maintain unidentified latent fingerprints in connection with matters under their jurisdiction should immediately contact these agencies and request that the fingerprints of subject JAMES EARL RAY as set forth on the IO be compared with latents obtained since his escape from Missouri State Penitentiary on April 23, 1967.

This is for the purpose of possibly establishing RAY's past whereabouts and source of funds.

Each Resident Agent will see that all law enforcement agencies in his territory falling in the above category will be contacted, furnished with the above request, and insure that each department has subject's fingerprint classification in its files.

Each Agent who is assigned liaison with a police department will contact the department assigned to him, fulfill the above request and insure that the department has on file the fingerprint classification of subject.

It is requested that upon completion of above matter the initialed memorandum be returned setting forth the department and date of contact.

Each Senior Resident Agent is responsible for affirming the contacting of appropriate law enforcement agencies.

It is to be noted that the Bureau has stressed that all leads in this matter should be handled expeditiously within 24 hours and given top priority.

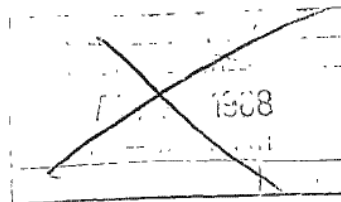

The following investigation was conducted by SAs MARTIN P. MC CANN, JR. and JOHN DAVIS ROBERSON on April 30, 1968 pursuant to Bureau instructions to contact hippy hangouts:

Captain EARL GORDON, Cleveland Heights Police Department, a recognized authority in this area, was contacted at which time he advised that there are no hippy hangouts in the Cleveland area that are comparable to the Haight-Ashbury section of San Francisco. He advised in Cleveland the persons tending in this direction are in the much younger age group, being mostly of college age and slightly older. He advised that they tend to frequent the areas close to Case Western Reserve University, and that in all instances, they are highly integrated groups. He stated that Adele's Bar at East 116th Street and Euclid Avenue has been such a hangout, but that it was recently burned and is not open for business at the present time.

Captain GORDON was apprised of the Bureau's interest in located RAY, and extra copies of IOs and wanted fliers were left with him. He stated that he would be alert for any information of interest to this office, and would instruct all of his officers and detectives concerning this matter. Captain GORDON could not suggest any other particular places that could be considered hippy hangouts except to state that they tend to congregate in areas near the university.

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Detective GEORGE WEBSTER of the University Circle Police Department was contacted on the same date and he substantiated the information already furnished by Captain GORDON, namely, that there are no hippy hangouts in the Cleveland area in RAY's age bracket, and that they are almost exclusively integrated and in the college and slightly older age group. He stated that RAY would stand out in this group and would not receive any support or sympathy. However, he volunteered to point out those areas that might be considered hippy hangouts.

Detective WEBSTER accompanied the Special Agents and indicated that the first block north of Euclid Avenue on East 116th Street, particularly the first red brick apartment building on the left, were inhabited by some hippies. He stated that he did not mean to imply that this block was populated solely by hippies, and in fact they were only present in a few of the apartments. He stated that the same thing was true on East 118th Street in the first block north of Euclid Avenue, and further, that this neighborhood might be described as a middle class Negro neighborhood.

WEBSTER indicated that apartment buildings 1715 and 1716 East 115th Street, north of Euclid, had a few hippies residing in them, and that possibly 1728 and 1730 East 115th Street, might have some as they are rooming houses. He advised that Hessler off of Ford Avenue, has many persons residing in the apartments that might be considered hippies, and that these are both Negro and white. Hessler is one block in length.

Detective WEBSTER pointed out a residence referred to as University House located at the corner of Euclid and Cornell, which he said is inhabited by a weird collection of everything including Black Nationalists.

He stated that University House is not connected with the university. He pointed out a

co-op rooming house at 2021 Cornell which he stated is connected with the university, but he doubted that anyone other than a student could obtain residence there.

He also advised that there were some persons who might be considered hippies living along Overlook Drive between Kenilworth and Edgehill, Cleveland Heights.

Detective WEBSTER also observed that many of these persons, who by his standards would be called hippies, are actually merely young persons who like to be extreme in their behavior and attire, and many of them are affiliated with the Well and the Coffee House, which are church-supported institutions to "bring church in touch with the people". He indicated that in his opinion, most of the people who frequent these places are a little weird and kooky.

With the above information SAs MARTIN P. MC CANN, JR. and JOHN DAVIS ROBERSON conducted spot inquiries in the vicinity of East 115th Street, East 116th Street, and East 118th Street, and Hessler, exhibiting photographs of subject RAY to the residents, and in practically all instances, the persons contacted, although unfriendly to police officers, stated that they have never seen RAY, but would notify the authorities if anything came to their attention. It was also observed that the persons in this area were much younger than RAY.

In view of the above, it does not appear that any further effort should be expended in this section. A large number of wanted fliers and IOs were left with Detective WEBSTER for distribution among the detectives and patrolmen of the University Circle Police Department.

[REDACTED], who is familiar with most of the Hippie element and their hangouts in Cleveland, was contacted relative to locations where these Hippies and their followers live, congregate and generally get together. He advised on 4/30/68 that at the present time there are no "crash pads" where Hippies live. He advised that the one bar where they got together, Adeles, located in the University Circle area on Euclid Ave. was burned out last night. Source advised that several Hippie hangouts and pads in the University Circle area have been burned out lately and the suspicion is that the young Italians from Mayfield Hill are responsible for the arsons due to their dislike for the Hippies.

[REDACTED] advised that the Hippies gather daily at the Public Square now that the weather is warmer. They also congregate on Sunday afternoons at the Art Museum and the Lagoons. Other than these locations there are no real Hippie hangouts at this time.

The earliest possible utilization of this material should be encouraged and special attention should be given to publications aimed at minority groups.

As previously set forth by teletype to Bureau and Richmond on April 26, 1968, [REDACTED] 3371 Milverton Road, Shaker Heights, Ohio, telephone [REDACTED] had advised that concerning the information he had furnished to the Cleveland FBI Office on May 26, 1961, he was unable to recall any specific information concerning this unknown individual.

[REDACTED] stated during this period of time in 1961, he frequented the Carnegie Hotel Bar on practically a daily basis. He advised he became acquainted with this white male, age at that time about mid-30's, and that this individual could best be described by him as a loner and pessimist.

[REDACTED] stated there were not many white males who frequented this bar inasmuch as it was mainly a Negro bar. He advised he never learned the name of this individual but thought he might possibly be connected with a transmission company located across the street from the Carnegie Bar.

[REDACTED] stated the only individual he knows who might recall this individual was a colored barmaid by the name of PAM who worked at the Carnegie Hotel.

On May 1, 1968, [REDACTED] part owner along with his brother, [REDACTED] of the Carnegie Hotel and Bar, advised he had been the owner for approximately the last two years. He stated there were no old-time employees located in the Carnegie Hotel and Bar, and that PAM was a barmaid who recently left the Carnegie Hotel and was now believed to be employed at the 79th Cafe, located on East 79th Street and Kinsman, Cleveland, Ohio.

On May 1, 1968, PAM was located at the 79th Cafe, East 79th Street and Kinsman, and she advised her true name is [REDACTED] home telephone [REDACTED] employment telephone number at the 79th Cafe, DI 1-6843.
