

The following investigation was conducted by SAs MARTIN P. MC CANN, JR. and JOHN DAVIS ROBERSON on April 30, 1968 pursuant to Bureau instructions to contact hippy hangouts:

Captain EARL GORDON, Cleveland Heights
Police Department, a recognized authority in this area,
was contacted at which time he advised that there are
no hippy hangouts in the Cleveland area that are
comparable to the Haight-Ashbury section of San
Francisco. He advised in Cleveland the persons tending
in this direction are in the much younger age group,
being mostly of college age and slightly older. He
advised that they tend to frequent the areas close to
Case Western Reserve University, and that in all instances, they are highly integrated groups. He stated
that Adele's Bar at East 116th Street and Euclid Avenue
has been such a hangout, but that it was recently burned
and is not open for business at the present time.

Captain GORDON was apprised of the Bureau's interest in located RAY, and extra copies of IOs and wanted fliers were left with him. He stated that he would be alert for any information of interest to this office, and would instruct all of his officers and detectives concerning this matter. Captain GORDON could not suggest any other particular places that could be considered hippy hangouts except to state that they tend to congregate in areas near the university.

Detective GEORGE WEBSTER of the University Circle Police Department was contacted on the same date and he substantiated the information already furnished by Captain GORDON, namely, that there are no hippy hangouts in the Cleveland area in RAY's age bracket, and that they are almost exclusively integrated and in the college and slightly older age group. He stated that RAY would stand out in this group and would not receive any support or sympathy. However, he volunteered to point out those areas that might be considered hippy hangouts.

Detective WEBSTER accompanied the Special Agents and indicated that the first block north of Euclid Avenue on East 116th Street, particularly the first red brick apartment building on the left, were inhabited by some hippies. He stated that he did not mean to imply that this block was populated soley by hippies, and in fact they were only present inaa few of the apartments. He stated that the same thing was true on East 118th Street in the first block north of Euclid Avenue, and further, that this neighborhood might be described as a middle class Negro neighborhood.

WEBSTER indicated that apartment buildings 1715 and 1716 East 115th Street, north of Euclid, had a few hippies residing in them, and that possibly 1728 and 1730 East 115th Street, might have some as they are rooming houses. He advised that Hessler off of Ford Avenue, has many persons residing in the apartments that might be considered hippies, and that these are both Negro and white. Hessler is one block in length.

Detective WEBSTER pointed out a residence referred to as University House located at the corner of Euclid and Cornell, which he said is inhabited by a weird collection of everything including Black Nationalists.

He stated that University House is not connected with the university. He pointed out a

co-op rooming house at 2021 Cornell which he stated is connected with the university, but he doubted that anyone other than a student could obtain residence there.

He also advised that there were some persons who might be considered hippies living along Overlook Drive between Kentlworth and Edgehill, Cleveland Heights.

Detective WEBSTER also observed that many of these persons, who by his standards would be called hippies, are actually merely young persons who like to be extreme in their behavior and attire, and many of them are affiliated with the Well and the Coffee House, which are church-supported institutions to "bring church in touch with the people". He indicated that in his opinion, most of the people who frequent these places are a little weird and kooky.

With the above information SAs MARTIN P. MC CANN, JR. and JOHN DAVIS ROBERSON conducted spot inquiries in the vicinity of East 115th Street, East 116th Street, and East 118th Street, and Hessler, exhibiting photographs of subject RAY to the residents, and in practically all instances, the persons contacted, although unfriendly to police officers, stated that they have never seen RAY, but would notify the authorities if anything came to their attention. It was also observed that the persons in this area were much younger than RAY.

In view of the above, it does not appear that any further effort should be expended in this section. A large number of wanted fliers and IOs were left with Detective WEESTER for distribution among the detectives and patrolmen of the University Circle Police Department.

advised that the Hippies gather daily at the Public Square now that the weather is warmer. They also congregate on Sunday afternoons at the Art Museum and the Lagoons. Other than these locations there are no real Hippie hangouts at this time.

The Bureau press release, copies of which are available in each office, along with a glossy photograph of this fugitive can be furnished. The earliest possible utilization of this material should be encouraged and special attention should be given to publications aimed at minority groups.
