The following investigation was conducted at Williamsburg, Va., by SA H. CURTISS BURRELL:

On 5/3/68 Mrs. WYOLENE POINTER, Superintendent's Office, Eastern State [REDACTED], Williamsburg, Va., furnished their file on FRANK HENRY NILES, [REDACTED]. A review of this file revealed the following information:

NILES was [REDACTED] Eastern State [REDACTED] on 1/17/68 under [REDACTED] by Special Justice DANIEL GRINNAN, City of Richmond, Richmond, Va.

He was [REDACTED]

He was allowed one pass, which was issued for the period of 4/24-26/68, when he listed his destination as being 6150 Wilson Boulevard, Arlington, Va. He has missed no scheduled roll calls at Eastern State [REDACTED].

Very little background information has been acquired by Eastern State [REDACTED]. On several occasions they have sent personal background questionnaires to Mrs. CECILIA HOPE LEWIS at 5099 Tinelawn Avenue, Chattanooga, Tennessee. They have received no replies from Mrs. LEWIS.

Their files revealed that NILES was [REDACTED] Lorain, Ohio, from 6/28/67 to 8/11/67.

NILES is described as a white male, born [REDACTED], 131 pounds, 5'9" tall, blue eyes, gray hair, with mustache. PII

The [REDACTED] was W. H. BATTE.

His [REDACTED] is Dr. MARTIN PALMAZ.

Interview of Dr. PALMAZ revealed that NILES is an alcoholic currently [REDACTED] Eastern State [REDACTED]. It is noted that this area is not secured at all times. Dr. PALMAZ advised that NILES is a definite racist but has had no violence exhibited toward any of his fellow Negro inmates. Dr. PALMAZ described his feelings as being merely a general prejudice. He is described as being very polite but in definite need of a great deal of activity to keep his mind occupied. Dr. PALMAZ advised that he has a very deep-seated hostility toward life in general and that things need to go his way at all times. Dr. PALMAZ considers him to have definite [REDACTED]. Dr. PALMAZ advised he has never heard NILES make any comments regarding any of the racial or Nazi leaders in the United States.

Dr. PALMAZ noted that NILES wrote a letter to the Social Security Administration recently in regard to his Social Security account, number [REDACTED] which he felt was delinquent. PII

It was noted that since March 30, 1968, NILES has been allowed to work at the Howard Johnson's Restaurant, off the Eastern State [REDACTED], in Williamsburg, Va. Since that time and to date, he has worked five and six days a week, 40 hours per week, and is paid \$58.

On 5/3/68 JAMES HAMILTON, Manager, Howard Johnson's Restaurant, Williamsburg, Va., was interviewed and advised that NILES was employed at his restaurant from 3/30/68 to the present time. He noted that he was at all times on duty during the period 4/3-6/68. His days off during the instant period were April 2 and 9, 1968. HAMILTON advised that NILES is very well liked and gets along well with all the Negro help.

It was noted that NILES returned to the Eastern State [REDACTED] after his work days during the instant period and at all times during his period of employment at the Howard Johnson's Restaurant. He has missed no roll calls at Eastern State [REDACTED].

No further investigation being conducted concerning NILES at Norfolk.

Chief of Police DONALD COWEN, NA, Alliance, Ohio Police Department, advised on 5/8/68, that he is very familiar with ROBERT COMROY, who has contacted his Department repeatedly ~~in~~ with solutions to Alliance police cases. COWEN indicates that COMROY is a "nut" on criminal cases and is constantly supplying police agencies with erroneous information.

Mr. ELMER HUDSON, Pharmacist, Turner Drug Store, Alliance, Ohio, advised on 5/8/68, that he recalled a stranger coming into his drug store at approximately 8:30 P.M., on 5/7/68 and looking over the magazine rack. Since business was slow, he watched the stranger for several minutes and was of the opinion that this man was definitely not JAMES EARL RAY. HUDSON stated that he had seen RAY's picture in the local papers as well as on television and was positive that the man in his drug store was not identical to RAY.

Mrs. Norton described this man as husky, crew cut, scar on top of head with bald area around this scar, appeared to have had a broken nose at one time as nose not straight, ~~7'0"~~ 7'0" seven feet, 280 lbs. Stated she was about seven feet tall this is how she determined approximate height of seven feet. Stated her boy friend is about 280 lbs. and this man is built much like her boy friend.

Cleveland sources have advised that photographs of JAMES EARL RAY have been made available to them via wire service. It is to be further noted that widespread publicity has been given to the JAMES EARL RAY story concerning the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, as well as various photographs of RAY appearing in the papers in the Cleveland Division.

In view of this, it is believed that in order to insure continued widespread publicity in this matter, the mats made available by the Bureau will be set up to be made available to the various newspapers on June 6, 1968.

It is felt that by distributing the mats at that time to the various news agencies this will help to continue the publicity concerning this case since it is felt that a distribution of the mats at this time to the papers in the Cleveland Division will be of little use since they are already according it a great deal of publicity in the way of stories and photographs.

CI advised that he had never heard of SHARON ANN PICETTI or any of her aliases, nor had ever heard of a pimp by the name of LAWRENCE. He was shown photographs of both victims SHERRY PICETTI and LAWRENCE and advised he has never seen these individuals.

NUMBERS ACTIVITY, CITY of LIMA

CI advised that ROBERT BARKLEY continued to be the big numbers operator in this area and said that a Negro by the name of GRANT continued to be pick up man for BARKLEY. He advised that he though perhaps GRANT may have lived at Grandview Homes, but he was not sure about his present residence. He stated GRANT did drive a 1965 white Pontiac car. CI advised that another pick up man for BARKLEY was BOB CAMPBELL and the big pick up man who did most of the picking up was a man called LT who CI believed worked at the Ohio Steel Foundry.

MURKIN

At the contact of April 25, 1968, CI was shown a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY, O.O. 4182, and advised he had never seen this individual and had never heard of him. He stated that in addition, he had never heard of an ERIC STALVO GALT.

CRIMINAL CONDITIONS, CLEVELAND DIVISION

CI advised that pimps and prostitutes continue to hang around the Waldo Hotel, Lima Public Square and to work out of the streets of Lima, Ohio and at WILLIE RIGHT'S night club. CI advised that BOB CHAPLIN, Clerk at the Waldo Hotel reportedly got \$4 out of every \$10 trick from the prostitutes who obtained dates at the hotel. CI advised that WILLIE BEE CALVIN, prostitute, lives at 148 South Pine Street, Lima, Ohio, and that she works the streets with DOROTHY BROWN also known as RITA. CI advised further that a prostitute TONI MARKS works the streets and that the pimp for TONI MARKS is HOWARD FOOTIE WILLIAMS. CI advised that he did not know of WILLIE BEE CALVIN and DOROTHY BROWN aka RITA having a pimp.

CI advised that there has been gambling at the

CV 137-454

Rendezvous Club on East Wayne Street which is operated by NINA and BOB BEACHUM. He stated that the gambling consisted mainly of craps.

CI advised that LITTLE JAMES THOMPSON who is a gambler has a spot directly across from the exit and entrance to the Sohio Refinery on South Metcalf Street. He stated that liquor is sold here and gambling takes place.

CI advised that in connection with betting at Lima, Ohio, one bets the same as one does at the track, either to win, place or show. He said it is possible to bet a "win parley", or a "place parley", or a "show parley". He said that it is possible to bet two or three horses in any one of the parleys, or for that matter four horses. He advised that if you, for example, bet three horses on a place parley and horses finish either winning or placing, you would therefore win the parley.

The CI advised that the dice is played in Lima, Ohio, and one of the expressions which is used around this area is "7 out", and this refers to the rolling of a seven before you make your point. CI also advised that another expression is, "bet to pass" or "7-11 in the door". "In the Door" refers to the first roll of the dice.

CI said that you can bet to pass on the following numbers:

4, 5, 6, 8, 9 and 10

If you do bet to pass with one of those numbers and you make your point, such as 4, 5, 6, 8, 9 or 10 before seven, then the roller wins. You can also bet to "don't pass". If you bet to "don't pass" and you roll 4, 5, 6, 8, 9 and 10 you lose. If you come out with a 7 on the roll, you also lose. If the dice, however, comes out with two 1s or a one and a two or two 6s, which brings up a total of 2, 3 or 12, you win if you roll this "in the door", meaning that you win on the first roll.

CI said that poker is played around Lima, but there is nothing unusual in the jargon or the playing of the poker to his knowledge.

On April 28, 1968, GEORGE W. CLINARD was telephonically contacted at his residence, the Waver Hotel, Bucyrus, Ohio, by SA LA VERN C. STOVER. He was unable to furnish any information of value not included in referenced memo of SPC BRICE A. WESTHOVEN.

On April 29, 1968, he was shown 10442-A and glossy photographs of subject JAMES EARLY RAY. He advised that photographs of RAY taken in 1960 bore no resemblance to the individual he observed at the Plaza Cafe approximately two weeks before, but stated that the photographs of the subject taken in 1968 contained facial features that very definitely are similar to those of this individual. He noted that GLORIA ELLIS, who also resides at the Waver Hotel was attending bar at the Plaza Cafe when he observed this individual.

After previous attempts of contact, GLORIA ELLIS was contacted at the Waver Hotel, Bucyrus, Ohio, on May 3, 1968. She stated she recalls CLINARD, approximately three weeks previous, pointed out an individual who he thought resembled JAMES EARLY RAY. After viewing photographs of RAY, Mrs. ELLIS advised that, in her mind, there was absolutely no resemblance between RAY and the individual CLINARD pointed out to her at the Plaza Bar and that she told CLINARD the same at the time he observed this individual. ELLIS added that in her opinion, CLINARD is "some kind of nut" who is using the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING to draw attention to himself.

In connection with the captioned case there has been speculation that James Earl Ray concocted the alias of Eric Starvo Galt by combining the names of characters from books by Ian Fleming and from a book "Atlas Shrugged" by Ayn Rand. This speculation is based on the fact that in the James Bond books by Ian Fleming there is a character named Ernst Stavro Blofield and in "Atlas Shrugged" there is a character named John Galt, as well as one named Eric Starnes. Ernst Stavro Blofield is a formidable person, John Galt is a "social drop out" and Eric Starnes is described in the book as a "whiner" from a low-class family.

In view of the above and in order that Agents handling this investigation can be alert to the possibility of Ray's utilizing an alias based on characters in Fleming's books, there is set out as an attachment to this airtel a list of various characters in those books for your assistance.
