In order to cover the possibility that subject may have died since commission of the crime, the U. S. Census Bureau and Department of Health, Education and Welfare were contacted and they advised that no central records of unidentified deceased are maintained by those agencies. It was suggested that each state may maintain such a record in their Bureau of Vital Statistics or similar agency.

There is no known Federal law requiring the maintenance of such information; and it is possible that if any record of unidentified dead is maintained, it would only be maintained at local police departments, morgues, medical facilities, or the like.

Each office covering state capitals should check to ascertain if such records are maintained, and if so, should check records for the period from 4-5-68, to date, for any information which might possibly identify subject Ray with unidentified deceased person over that period.

If there is no central record repository maintained in the various states or nationally in the case of Mexico and Canada, you should, in connection with your contacts with law enforcement agencies on this case or other Bureau matters, make appropriate inquiries relative to

unidentified dead for the period beginning 4-5-68; and if fingerprints on such dead are maintained, they should be compared with those on the Identification Order on Ray in order to effect identification or nonidentification. This should be handled in the normal course of business and only reasonable investigation should be pursued along these lines.

The Identification Division has placed an appropriate stop on unidentified deceased inquiries it may receive. If feasible, appropriate offices and Legats, Mexico City and Ottawa should place similar stops with appropriate state, local or national agencies in your territories.

On 5/9/68, Mr. ROBERT T. CONROY, 815 Parkway Avenue, Alliance, Ohio, was contacted. CONROY indicated he had telephoned the FBI in Washington, after he had seen a man who resembled RAY, coming out of Turner's Drugstore, Alliance, Ohio. CONROY stated that he was downtown, driving in his own car when he observed this individual, who appeared to be, or at least resembled RAY. He stated he went around the dock, came back and copied a license number after he observed this man enter an old green vehicle which he believed to be a Chrysler product. This license was copied down by himself and he then telephoned the FBI in Washington giving them the details as he recalled same. In regards to distance, CONROY said that he was on the opposite side of the street when this man left the drugstore and he again observed him after driving around the block from a distance of 30 or so feet, but did not get a good view, since the man was in the car. CONROY was not absolutely sure that this individual was RAY, however, indicated he wished to aide the FBI in any conceivable way possible, therefore, had immediately or soon thereafter telephoned Washington. CONROY had no additional information to add to the above facts or elaborate on the information furnished Washington.

On April 25, 1968, PCI was shown a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY, IO. #4182 and advised she could not recognize this person and she stated she knew noone by this name and had never heard of anybody in the Lima area using the name ERIC STARVO GALT.

RICHARD COSTELLO

PCI advised that she had not seen RICHARD COSTELLO in the Lima, Ohio area and assumed that he was living and probably working at Key Largo, Florida. She advised that approximately three weeks ago LEONARD FAUROT described him as a wealthy man in the Lima, Ohio area had been in her bar, but that he had merely visited in Lima, Ohio and she believed he had returned to Key Largo, Florida. She stated that she knew that LEONARD FAUROT owned a bar or restaurant across from a spot operated by NICK GRISBY at Key Largo. PCI advised she had no information relative to the reported wife of COSTELLO, name "PEG" and she had no information that COSTELLO had transported PEG for immoral purposes or for the purposes of prostitution.

CRIMINAL CONDITIONS, CLEVELAND DIVISION

PCI advised that a young red-headed woman had patronized the bar about a week ago but had been put out by the police. She stated she did not know this person and that apparently this girl had tried to pick up dates at the bar. She stated that she had no idea who this red head was and no idea where she was from.

PCI stated that as far as she knew, the regular local prostitutes hung around WILLIE WRIGHT's cafe or night club and also the Waldo Hotel. PCI stated that a reported boyfriend or son of EDDIE DODGE also known as EDDIE SEATON was supposed to have been involved in an armed robbery with EDDIE SEATON and this young person had lived at the Waldo Hotel. She advised that EDDIE SEATON had been arrested for armed robbery by the local police and was presently awaiting trial on a local armed robbery charge.

RACIAL MATTERS, LIMA, OHIO RA

PCI advised that she had not heard of any im-

pending violence from a racial standpoint. She advised that she did not have very much Negro trade and had had no trouble at her particular bar which is known as "The office bar". PCI advised she understood there had been a young group of Negroes involved in an organization called the Lima Youth Committee, but that she heard very little about it during the past weeks.

The Cleveland Auto Bureau was checked concerning a license #AE 2551 registered to EDMUND M. TRISNAR, 16244 Edgewood, Maple Heights, Ohio, a 1965 Pontiac convertible coupe, and 1968 Ohio license #AE 5221, registered to NANCY HUGHES, 927 Archer, Bedford, Ohio, a 1961 Buick, four-door sedan.

After numerous attempts to contact any individuals at 16244 Edgewood on May 13, 1968, EDMUND M. TRISNAR was contacted at the above address. He advised and pointed out a 1965 Pontiac convertible coupe, blue in color, bearing license #AE 2551. Mr. TRISNAR advised that he works for Fuller Division of Dracco at 116th and Harvard, for the past 14 years. He advised that he is in the Shipping and Receiving Department. He stated he was born on [redacted] Cleveland, Ohio. He is married, wife's name is ANNA MAE, and he has three children. Mr. TRISNAR is a white male, 5' 8", brown wavy hair, 150 pounds, medium build, fair complexion.

Inasmuch as Mr. TRISNAR owned a blue automobile bearing one of the Ohio licenses mentioned in the above referenced memo, and due to the fact that he lives in Maple Heights, it is presumed that this is the car and the individual referred to in the above referenced memo. It was established that this individual is not identical to JAMES EARL RAY after comparing with the photograph.

This date at approx. 7:35 PM, Sherman Sellars, 302 Mantle rd., Painesville, Ohio phone 354-3148, telephonically contacted the CV office and advised on 5-15-68 he believes he saw Ray at Laird Home Restaurant 13 south State st., Painesville, Ohio. At best he could recall he saw Ray between 10:30 PM and 11:00 PM eating at this restaurant accompanied by a W/M.

Sellars described man believed to be Ray as; W/M, dark brown hair, 5'9"-10", 170-175 lbs, mid to late 20's, and an odd nose (could not explain why his nose odd.).

Sellars described other W/M as about same age 160 lbs, about same height, brown hair.

Sellars further stated when these two men left the restaurant they drove away in a 1966 or 1967 dark blue Plymouth Barracuda bearing 1968 Ohio license R Q being the only part of the license Sellars could give. Sellars stated he wanted credit and reward if Ray apprehended from the above info he furnished. Stated he had spoken to SA Corbett some years ago concerning another matter.

When Sellars was asked why he had waited so long to give this info. he stuttered ~~xxx~~ and said he forgot.

On May 8, 1968, SA ROBERT A. QUAINANCE displayed to Mr. ARTHUR LARIMER, Postmaster, U. S. Post Office, Sandusky, Ohio, the unsigned printed note and envelopes addressed to "Chief of Police, Memphis, Tenn.", and "Postmaster, Pelee Island, Ontario".

Mr. LARIMER advised that although the identity of the author was unknown to him he noted the apparent shaky printing, and suggested that it might be the effort of an elderly person. He suggested an inquiry at the old Soldiers and Sailors Home, Sandusky, might be productive.

On May 9, 1968, SA ROBERT A. QUAINANCE contacted Mr. MICHAEL KRESTEL, Assistant Reeve, Pelee Island, Ontario, Canada, in the absence of the Reeve, Mr. CHARLES WALLACE, and the Constable, Mr. ZANE HOOKER. Mr. KRESTEL questioned the Postmaster, Mr. DONALD GOW, who advised that instant note, .35 change, and cover envelopes, were received at the post office on approximately April 24, 1968. He said that he opened the envelope addressed to him. He discovered the inner envelope already opened, which he believes may have been done accidentally by him in opening the outer envelope. He recalled the change and note, however, were lying loose in the outer envelope. He said he did not know what disposition to make of the contents and finally asked Mr. WALLACE, the Reeve, for advice. He stated it was the suggestion of Mr. WALLACE that these items be mailed to the FBI, Federal Building, Sandusky. He was unable to suggest any suspect as the author of instant note.

On May 9, 1968, Mr. ROBERT BORDERS, Registrar, Old Soldiers and Sailors Home, Columbus Avenue, Sandusky, examined instant note and envelopes and advised SA ROBERT A. QUAINANCE he suspected them to be the work of a resident,

CHARLES MANN WITZLER. He said WITZLER is a prolific letter writer and a chronic complainer who frequently writes to the Governor and various agencies complaining about conditions at the home.

He advised that records indicate WITZLER was born on [redacted] at Perrysburg, Ohio, served in the U. S. Army, Quartermaster Corps., from July 29, 1942, until November 6, 1944, when he received an honorable discharge at Fort Hayes, Columbus, Ohio, as a private, ASN [redacted]. He furnished WITZLER's V A Claim Number as 17-306-751, and his Social Security Number as [redacted]. He said WITZLER arrived at the Home on July 19, 1962. He added that WITZLER would not be available for interview until May 10, 1968.

On May 10, 1968, SA ROBERT A. QUAINANCE confronted CHARLES MANN WITZLER with instant note and envelopes. He admitted being the author. He said he could offer no logical reason for his writing the note and said he could only suggest that he must have been drinking at the time. He stated it was not his intention to burden or harass the Memphis, Tennessee Police Department, FBI, or any other law enforcement agency by his action.

He said his reason for enclosing \$.35 with the note was to include \$.10 for air mail postage from Pelee Island to Memphis, Tennessee; he said he visits Pelee Island a few times each summer and has bought postage at the post office there. He said he sent his note via Pelee Island simply to give the postmaster a little business.

He was admonished by SA QUAINANCE for the consequences of his action, the wasted time and money that could have been spent on other matters. He was also admonished by Mr. BORDERS, and threatened with possible expulsion if he should repeat this misconduct.

Mr. WITZLER apologized for his action and promised to refrain from any such conduct in the future.

He admitted his note intended reference to the slaying of MARTIN LUTHER KING, however, he denied sympathy for the assassination. He said he has no knowledge of JAMES EARL RAY or his whereabouts.

Enclosed is a letter and envelope addressed to Rev. HAL LLOYD, United Presbyterian Church, Germantown, Pa., dated 4/17/68, bearing the return address of Cloud 13, Pueblo, N. Korea, signed ERIC S. GALT, and bearing the postmark of Mansfield, Ohio, p.m. 4/23/68.

On Easter Sunday, 4/14/68 Rev. HAL B. LLOYD, Pastor, Germantown Presbyterian Community Church, Green and Tulpehocken Streets, Philadelphia, Pa., made a sermon which was televised to several states. Since that time LLOYD has received numerous letters in response to his sermon, some of which were complimentary and some of which were uncomplimentary. These letters concern the present conditions of the Negroes in this country.

HARMON was reviewing some of these letters for LLOYD and noticed that one of the letters was signed ERIC S. GALT.

ARDEN HUGHES, POB #28, Leroy, Ohio, advised on 5/20/68 as follows:

He was in Baltimore, Md., on 4/5/68 on business, having flown there on that date from the Cleveland - Hopkins Airport, CV, O. He was returning to CV on the evening of that date, and arrived back at the Baltimore ~~Friendship~~ Friendship Airport around 5:30pm from downtown Baltimore, had a beer in the airport bar, and purchased a newspaper. He seated himself accross from the newstand at the airport, in a lounge chair.

While reading the account of the murder of Dr. M.L. KING in Memphis, Tenn., on the previous day, he observed a white, male, wearing a "white suit" pass him enroute to the terminal's main entrance-exit, along the passageway which contains shops, and the bar. Upon closer examination of this man, HUGHES determined the man's "white suit" was actually light brown in color, with dark brown stripes. He wore a white shirt, open at the collar, but did not have on a necktie. He had a day's growth of beard, his suit was wrinkled, and his hair needed combing. He did not fit in with the regular airport patron, and had no luggage of any type.

HUGHES described him as being 5'10" to 6', in his early /30s, slender build, dark brown hair, and medium complexion. This man was in no hurry, and left the terminal by the main entrance-exit. He was alone, and carried no packages. HUGHES said that since that time, he has given the above matter considerable thought, and decided that possibly the man he saw at the airport might have been connected with the slaying of Dr. KING in some way.

HUGHES was shown photographs of JAMES EARL RAY, and decided that the sideview photograph of RAY, taken in 1960, resembled to some degree the man he observed in Baltimore on 4/5/68, but was not definite in his identification. He claimed the man he observed had an abundance of very dark brown hair, while the photo selected showed RAY with short hair. HUGHES mentioned he only had a side view of the man as he walked from the terminal.

It is requested that each Agent bear the above in mind in all contacts with police and continued efforts should be maintained in an effort to develop any possible information concerning JAMES EARL RAY.

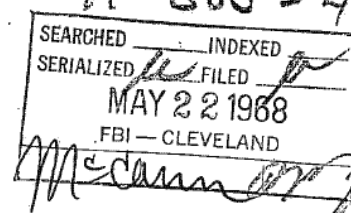

The knowledge of the existence of the substantial rewards available in the Murkin case could possibly prove of value in the solution of this major investigation.

Mr. JAMES BENDER, Bender Realty Company, 23826 Lorain Road, North Olmsted, Ohio, was personally interviewed at approximately 6:45 P.M. at his place of employment by SA's JOHN J. JUREY and ROBERSON.

BENDER related that at approximately 5:20 P.M. that evening he was having a sandwich at Saxon's Sandwich Shop on Lorain Road when he observed a white male enter the shop. He stated that he had first thought this person was a former customer of his and that upon further observation determined that it was not, and upon still further reflection after returning to his office, concluded that it was possibly subject RAY, whose picture he had seen in the paper a week or two previous. He stated that he had only a brief glimpse of this individual full face, and a slightly longer observation of his profile. He stated that he did not pay too much attention to this individual at the time because it did not occur to him until later that there was a resemblance to subject RAY. He described this individual as follows:

Hair:	Light brown, crew cut
