was told it would be an expensive trip he told the driver not to worry about the money and displayed a large roll of twenty dollar bills. He was assisted into the cab and left.

While waiting for the cab the man talked with SUMMERVILIE and at one point made the comment that it was too bad that MARTIN LUTHER KING had been killed.

When the first photographs of the subect appeared in the newspaper SUMMERVILLE noted that the photo bore a strong resemblance to the man who had been in room 212. He was shown additional photographs of JAMES RAY MARK and he said he still believes the man in 212 might be RAY.

He described the man he saw as a W/M, about 39-41 years, 5'10", 170 lbs, medium build, believes hair may have been sandy colored, had funny look to his eyes.

On 4/24/68 Mrs. EVELYN YARBOROUGH, Secretæry to the Manager, Sands Motel, produced the records of that motel which revealed that a person registered for room 212 on 4/5/68 at 11:15 pm using the name JIM SWAYZE, 1809 Rosewood, Abilene, Texas. There is a notation of the registration card that he was in a plymouth with license KPZ 642. There is no notation as to the time he checked out but it must have been before 7 am 4/6/68 because he was checked out by MARY ERMLER, the night clerk who works from 11 pm to 7 am. He paid an \$8.00 room bill.

On 4/24/68 the Texas Highway Partol advised that current Texas license KPZ 642 was issued to E.A. ADAMS, 2417 Salerno, Dallas on a 1964 four door Ford.

Mr. E.A. ADAMS, 2417 Salerno, advised on 4/24/68 he is the owner of a 1964 Ford which bears license KPZ 642. He has has never been to the Sands Motel and does not even know where it is. He said noone has used his car at any time. He stated there must have been an error in recording the license number since his car could not have been at the Sands Motel on the night of 4/5/68.

Abilene, at Abilene, contact JIM SWAYZE, 1809 Rosewood, determine if he was at Sands Motel on evening 4/5/68 and whether identical with JAMES EARL MAY.



The following investigation was conducted by SA Del D. Drake, Jr. and SA David R. Hill:

at Paris, Texas

On 4-22-68 Radio Dispatcher, Clifford Pope, Paris, Texas PD received a telephone call from a Lorothy Barr, Megro female, who advised that she understood that Eric Galt or a person who looked like him, was staying at the gibralter Hotel, Paris, Texas. She said that she did not see this individual herslf but that the person who told her had seen and talked to him.

Immediate check at the Gibralter Hotel with Charlie Booker, Negro desk clerk and head porter, who has been known to SA Drake for years, reflected that he had seen no one who resembled the suspect in this matter. Booker stated that the photograph of James Early Ray did not resemble arryone who had stayed at the hotel. It will also be noted that this old hotel is also now being used as a rest home for the elderly and Booker stated that during the past hour no one had made any call from the Hotel other that himself and some of the other employees. None of the guests and made any calls since all calls had to go through the switchboard which he also operates.

A check with other porters failed to reflect anyone who had seen anyone resembling the photograph of Ray.

Upon interview Dorothy Barr, 609 East Tudor St., advised that she had received her information from Edna Embry who is employed as a maid at the Gibralter Hotel. Barr said that Embry had said that she had talked to this guest who resembled Ray or Galt and that she had seen the picture in the newspaper and that was what she thought. Barr said that she had seen the person who Embry described.

Edna Embry was interviewed at the Gibralter Hotel and she said that the person she had reference to had stayed in Room %51.0 at the Hotel for a couple of days and that she thought she had seen him about Wednesday 4-17-68 for the first time. She said she talked to him on 4-18-68 while she was cleaning his room. She said that upon observing the WF of Ray that perhaps the individual she refferred to was older than Ray but she thought it could be the same person.

Upon contact of Bill Whitner, Manager of the Gibralter Hotel, and a complete review of the records it was ascertained that room #510 had been rented to George M. Eckel. 903 East Enfanta St., Norman, Oklahoma on L-17-68 and that Eckel. had stated he represented the Farm Labor Lepartment, Equitable Life Canadas.

whitner said that Eckel had jumped his bill at the hotel on 4-19-68 and that it amounted to \$20.55 which included a telephone call on 4-18-68 to area Code 405 Number 534-9146 which he believed was either Norman or Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Whitner said that in no way did Eckel resemble Ray or Galt. He said that Eckel was about 6-0 tall, 165 lbs., with graying hair and was no less than 55 years of age nad more probably 65 years of age. He stated that Eckel looked very much like Lloyd Davis a known Paris business man who is also known to SA Drake. (If this is the case there is no resemblance to Ray).

Whitner also said that Eckel had left to cheap brief cases at the hotel and that one of these cases contained papers which turned out to be a large quanitity of airline brochures for practically every airline in the country. However among these papers it was noted that Eckel possible resided at one time at 121½ west Main. Nroman Oklahoma and that on 4-8-68 he had received a letter from the mincipal Court, Oklahoma City informing that a \$14.00 check he had given the court had been returned as insufficient. Notes in the brief case also reflected that Eckel may have styed at the Holiday Inn, Paris, Texas as well as other Holiday Inns in various coties in Oklahoma and Texas. Whitner said that he did not think that Eckel had had any other baggage and if he did he did not see it around the hotel.

On L-22-68 Jack Kothe, Manager, Holiday Inn, advised that Eckel has stayed at his motel on the nights of 17, 18, and 19 of April, or at least he had been registered for those nights and then he had jumped his bill. He stated that Eckel had written him a note from Hugo, Oslahoma which stated that Eckel had had to change his business plans and if Kothe would mail his bill to him in Norman, Oslahoma he would tender a check. Kothe said that Eckel did not even resemble Ray.

Both Kothe and Whitner were advised that the Detective Division of the Paris PD would be advised of the actions of Eckel and that officers would be checking with them.

On 4-23-68 O. A. Broussard, manager, City Airport, Paris, Texas advised that when he had seen SA Drake in front of the Police Department in Paris on 4-17-68 that he had called SA Drake's attention to a white man who was walking past the station a companied by a crippled Negro. SA Drake recalled this individual and Broussard had mentioned that this individual had been the one that Broussard had said had just come into Cox Field on Brontier Airline and had attempted to rent a car from Broussard and Broussard had refuesed because he felt that this man was a "con-man". Broussard said that he had then given this individual a ride into Paris and had let him out of the car at the Holiday Inn. The identity of this man is that of Eckel and from observation this inflividual did not in any way resemble Ray.

For the information of all concerned Detectiev Charles Whitely has contacted both the Hobiday Inn and the Gibralter Hotel and is in the process of identifying Eckel. He is also contacting the Negro who was with this individual on 4-17-68 since this Negro's identify is known to Whitley.

Recommended Action: Route to SA Holliman after indexing Eckel. No further action deemed necessary since Eckel has been eliminated as being identical with Ray or Galt.

Fort Worth police early Wednesday morning broadcast a wanted bulletin on James Earl Ray, alias Eric Starvo Galt, in connection with the April 4 assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King in Memphis.

Ray was added to the Federal Bureau of Investigation's list of 10 most wanted men Saturday, stretching the list to 11 for the first time.

When Ray's name was added, an FBI spokesman said alaw enforcement agencies would be contacted.

Re Albany airtels 4/10/68 and 4/11/68, setting forth concerns who purchased Thermo-Seal marking machines, and Bureau teletype to Memphis, 4/12/68.

The FBI Laboratory advised that pillowcase and bed sheet were found in trunk of 1966 white Mustang registered to ERIC STARVO GALT, which was located at Atlanta 4/11/68. These items contain Thermo-Seal laundry tapes of approximately same size as tapes on items previously recovered, but are yellow in color and contain code, "20R-3." In opinion of Textile Marking Machine Company, Syracuse, New York, the tapes were produced by a different machine than previous tapes since the first three characters are 15 point type and the last two characters are 18 point type.

The Textile Marking Machine Company suggests the twenty in above code would be the lot number, the R may mean that this was a return of a batch of laundry, and the three is the bundle number.



She stated related that BAXTON BRYANT, ex Methodist Preacher, Dallas ( several yygars/ago), was involved in some way in both the assassination of Dr. King and the Assassination of KENNEDY in 1963.

She pointed out that tonight on Channel 5, BRYANT was interviewed in his front yard in Memphis, and stated he had heard a conversation between businessmen in Tennessee. One of the businessmen stated, "You kill that S. O. B. oin the balcony.", or words to that effect.

The anonymous call stated that BRYANTS involvement in both assassinations was more than coincidental and she felt sfurther inquiry should be made.into

Enclosed for the Bureau are three pieces of cloth containing sample tapes from three Thermo-Seal machines.

On 4/24/68, WARREN TYSON, Manager, White Star Laundry and Dry Cleaners, 4535 Cole, Dallas, Texas, furnished the enclosed sample laundry marks from the three Thermo-Seal marking machines operated by his concern. He advised the "20" is a lot number, the "R" is the week, and the "3" is the customer invoice. He uses eight colors of Thermo-Seal tape each week and a light yellow color is therefore used 1/8 (approximately) of each week.

The enclosed samples are gold colored tape as opposed to the light yellow color he uses. Gold is used exclusively for one day specials. He stated he would put tape markers on sheets and pillow cases only when they are brought in for one day special service. He does not use any marker on normal flat work such as sheets and pillow cases, handling that by the bundle.

TYSON advised he makes records of the identity of customers only if they have a charge account. Almost all, if not all, of his one day service is done on a cash basis.

He advised a search of his records failed to disclose any record of identity for a customer #3, Lot 20, yellow tape series and from this, he assumes the customer must have been a cash customer. The first week was in June, 1967 and the second week was from February 26 to March 2, 1968.

TYSON advised machines 2 and 3 are used constantly and the ink ribbons on them must be changed at least once every ten days. Machine #3 temporarily has the "R" symbol broken off. Machine #1 is used only for overflow work and would be used only a fraction of each week.

An exhaustive FBI fingerprint search, comparing latent fingerprints uncovered in the Dr. King case against fingerprints of over 53,000 persons on whom FBI wanted notices have been posted determined that Galt and Ray are identical.

A Federal warrant, issued at Birmingham, Alabama, on April 17, 1968, charges Ray, under the alias Eric Starvo Galt, with conspiring to interfere with a Constitutional Right of a United States citizen. Ray, who escaped on April 23, 1967, from the Missouri State Penitentiary, is also sought for unlawful interstate flight to avoid confinement after conviction for armed robbery.


Possessing an arrest record dating back to 1949, Ray has been convicted of burglary, armed robbery and forging United States Postal Money Orders.

A 40-year-old white male, reportedly born in Illinois on March 10, 1928, Ray is approximately 5'10" tall, weighs from 163 to 174 pounds, has blue eyes and short brown hair. He has a nervous habit of tugging at an ear lobe and his left ear protrudes noticeably.

Described as a "loner and "drifter," with a "rural" quality in his speech, Ray has worked as a baker, laborer and color matcher. He has taken dancing lessons and completed a course at a school of bartending.

In September, 1966, while serving the sentence, he was confined for a time in the maximum security ward at the State Hospital, Fulton, Missouri. He was reported missing from the Missouri State Penitentiary since April 23, 1967.

Ray, who has an arrest record dating back to 1949 and has been convicted of burglary, armed robbery and forging United States Postal Money Orders, has also been confined in the Los Angeles County Jail, the Joliet and Pontiac, Illinois, State Prisons and the United States Penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas.

He served in the Army between February, 1946, and December, 1948, received a three-month sentence at hard labor for being drunk and breaking arrest and was given a General Discharge due to ineptness and lack of adaptability for military service.
