WEBB advised he is a Sergeant in the U. S. Marine Corps, Serial # 2139929, assigned to Schools Company, Schools Battalion, TVR, Camp Del Mar, Camp Pendleton, California.

He advised he was on leave from on or about December 15, or December 16, 1967, until about the first of January, 1968, the exact dates unknown. 





The suspect was serving a sentence for armed robbery at the time, said Swafford, and was a student in his class when he escaped from prison.

Swafford, who noted that he had no direct contact with Ray other than as a student, served as a chaplain in the Jefferson City prison for a short time after leaving Denison.

The minister pointed out that he could recall nothing to distinguish Ray from the other inmates who attended the class.

He was advised by SA HOLLOMAN of his right to have an attorney present during interview and his rights as appear on the Rights and Waiver form which he read, acknowledged he understood but declined to sign.

BASS stated he does not know any present or former inmate of the Washington State Penitentiary. He does not know anyone who has escaped from that institution. He denied giving anyone any amount of money to have MARTIN LUTHER KING killed. He said he has been almost destitute himself for many months and has had to resort to writing bad checks and petty thefts to sustain himself. He denied that he has any knowledge of any conspiracy to kill KING or has ever made any statement to anyone concerning having KING killed. He stated he does not own a meat packing company but has worked as a meat cutter and delivery man for meat packers in the Dallas area. He is presently employed as a meat cutter for Acers Meat Company, 1737 Levy Street, Dallas.


