more commonly referred to as "LU" worked as a waitress at

DAVID McDONALD, Supervisor, National Airlines Ticket Office, Hobby Airport, Houston, Texas, furnished following additional information today:

Last evening while watching the FBI Story on television he observed a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and was immediately reminded of a passenger whom he checked through on either National Airlines Flight 23 or National Airlines Flight 47 at approximately noon, 4/21/68. He described the person as about 6'1", with brown hair and a neatly trimmed goatee approximately 1" long covering the bottom lip and chin area only. He was wearing a light colored cowboy type straw hat, a beige Levi type jacket, and black horn rim sun glasses. He, while being checked by McDONALD, removed his sun glasses and stared intently at McDONALD. McDONALD stated the general configuration and look of this man's eyes appeared to be practically identical with the eyes in the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY. He said the passenger's nose and general shape of his face and mouth also resemble the photograph of RAY. The passenger checked through with no luggage and was carrying a small two-handle type flight bag. He said he was unable to determine whether or not the passenger was identical with RAY but that he felt there was a good possibility that they might be identical.

National Airlines Flight 23 departed Houston at the above described time en route for Las Vegas with final destination San Francisco. National Airlines Flight 47 departed Houston at the above described time en route non-stop to Los Angeles.

On 4/18/68, Mrs. ITASKA WEINSTEIN, 5503 Yacht Cluo Drive, Dickinson, Texas (home phone 534-4747), and operator of the ITASKA DanceStudio, Highway #3, about 1/4 mile South of Highway #517, League City, Texas (932-9960), stated she wanted no publicity whatever, and advised as follows:

After having been contacted on two separate occasions by agents of the FBI regarding this matter, she happened to see a photograph shown on TV last night of ERIC GALT and stated he looked familiar. Accordingly, she researched her records and located a 3 x 5 card bearing the name of JOHN WILLARD, no address or description. This was written by herself and merely shows that this man appeared for four lessons, three times on Wednesday and once on a Friday. No dates are recorded but she knows these lessons were before her annual recital held in May, and her best guess is that this man took the lessons during the month of April, 1967. She has no other record pertaining to WILLARD and has located nothing which bears his signature or handwriting.

Her overall impression of this man is that he was not neat, had no personality, and was an extremely poor dancer. He was very quiet, and hard to teach because he had poor equilibrium. She knows nothing about him other than what she observed and what he said about himself. No one else at this studio at present knew him; it is probable that SHIRLEY CARROLL, formerly the bookkeeper here, did know him from contacts when he came for lessons, and probably entered into conversation with him. She now lives at an address in care of J.L. HOECK, at Patton Road, Box 81A, Forest Hill, Maryland 21050, telephone 301-692-6746.

Shown the photographs of ERIC GALT on his wanted flyer, she commented that the photograph of GALT with his eyes closed most closely resembles him. The eyes drawn into the photograph do not resemble those of the man she knew. In addition, the hair of the man she knew was not as dark as that in the photograph, and his complexion was olive, not fair.

During their very limited conversations, WILLARD stated he worked "at NASA", and did not get off from work until about 5:30p.m.. He also was called back to work overtime on occasion. He did not appear to be a highly educated man, definitely not the "engineer type". He said he went from work to his apartment, or room, took a shower, changed clothes, then came for his lesson. He usually wore a white shirt and dark pants, but once or twice wore a suit. She never did observe a badge or identification tag with his photograph on it, as she has seen many people wear who are employed by NASA.

On one occasion he told her he had gone dancing at a place named the "Breeze _____", possibly the Breezeway, located on the Gulf Freeway between League City and Houston. He commented that he did not dance very well.

He owned a record player, and once borrowed one of her records, apparently to take home and practice dancing. Once he brought in a record of Fred Astaire dancing instructions, which he said he had purchased at the Nassau Bay shopping center.

She, Mrs. WEINSTEIN, had told him that she would not dance with him as his partner while teaching him ballroom dancing, it being against her policy. On at least two occasions, therefore, this man brought with him a woman who acted as his partner while he took lessons. This woman she described as follows:

Name: "LOU"
Age: In her 40's, definitely older than Willard
Height: 5'4"
Build: Average
Dress: Wore ordinary cotton dresses, not slacks

Hair: Dark, with reddish cast
Miscellaneous: No personality

This woman supposedly worked as a waitress, place unknown, and WILLARD told her, Mrs: WEINSTEIN, he would not be able to bring this woman back with him because she worked too late and she wanted him to pick her up after work.

She is confident that WILLARD drove an automobile, but she is completely unable to describe it, other than it must have been an "older" car.

Perhaps the last time she gave this man a lesson, he told her he was going to "visit his mother". She does not believe he told her any more about where his mother lived, and cannot now remember if he did.

Mrs. WEINSTEIN furnished the following descriptive data concerning this man:

Sex:	Male
Race:	"white
Height:	"Not tall", perhaps 5'9"-10"
Age:	In his 30's
Hair:	Brown, "ordinary" color and haircut, combed straight back
Eyes:	Either grey or brown; definitely not blue; did not wear glasses
Build:	Stocky, not fat or heavy
Complexion:	Olive, not smooth-skinned, although not rough.
Teeth:	Must have been normal, did not notice them
Carriage:	Posture not good, slouched, not that of a "polished man"
Speech:	That of average working man, no accent noticed
Jewelry:	Believes, but is not certain, wore ring and wrist watch, no details recalled
Shoes:	Black, rounded toe, not alligator, feet of average size (always notices size of feet)
Hands:	Fingers were not unusually long
Habits:	Cannot remember if he smoked; does not remember habit of pulling ear, but finds many students have this or other nervous habit

On 4/22/68, AUSA RONALD J. BLASK, SDT, Houston, furnished the following information which he received from a friend who desires to remain anonymous:

In May, 1967, a billboard at the intersection of Hillcroft and the Southwest Freeway had an advertisement "Who is John Galt?"

The Houston Poster Advertising Company located on Buffalo Speedway rented this billboard to W. R. STEVENSON, an artist who operates Stevenson Studio, 2502 North Boulevard. STEVENSON obtained the advertisement described above in the name of Objectivists Society and/or NATHANIAL BRANDON, 120 East 34th Street, New York City.
