The Wittnauer factory should be able to advise as to the significance, if any, of these markings. The possibility of tracing the retail sale of specimen Q383 appears remote. No foreign material was located on or in the watch which could assist in tracing the wrist watch.

On 6/21/68 ANTHUR J. HANNES and his son, who practices law with him, visited where they saw a whore they saw a weekled an interview with RAY and was told he could not see him. He was asked the source of his fee and replied that he expected to collect his fee from RAY. IAN COLVIN has advised that the organization in Brussels known as CAYSP, which is mentioned in COLVIN's previously submitted statement, is a research organization that attempts to keep track of mercenaries in Africa. 
