

TORNADO ALLEY — High winds and tornadoes struck several Mid-South areas last night, with widespread damage near Poplarville between Memphis and St. Louis and north of Crawfordville near the Vincennes community in Arkansas. Another hit north of Memphis near Millington. Areas near Corinth also were hit.

Tornado Strikes Near Millington; At Least 30 Hurt

An estimated 35 to 40 persons were injured when a tornado slammed through the Shady Lane Trailer Court at 7800 Raleigh-Millington Road, near the climax of a night in which violent weather left persons dead in Arkansas and Tennessee.

Two persons were reported dead at Atkins, Tenn., 35 miles northeast of Memphis, late last night and seven were known down after an earlier tornado which ripped from the St. City, Ark., area before dissipating around daylight.

Eleven persons went to Crittendon Memorial Hospital in West Memphis, Ark., after deputies and Arkansas State Police freed them from the rubble of houses which were blown away in Vincennes, Ark., and four others were taken there after a house trailer was overturned at Jones Mill.

Shirley County Sheriff Will W. Smith said he and his wife and his child were the only persons seriously injured when the storm hit the trailer park south of Millington. He said the trailer park was hit by a flying television set.

Residents in the trailer court said they had almost no warning of the storm which hit around 10 p.m.

"We were here in our back bedroom and we had just went to bed," said Mrs. Michael D. Smith. "I told my husband that it was going to be a bad storm."

Robert M. Jones, a 38-year-old man who lives at the trailer park, said he was in the kitchen when the storm hit. He said he was hit by a flying television set.

Refugees from the park and its trailer court were taken to a nearby hospital. The hospital is a 100-bed facility and is located in the city of Millington.

King Challenges Court Restraint, Vows To March

But US Attorney Says Ban To Be Enforced, Even If Troops Needed

Attorneys representing Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. go before United States Dist. Judge Bailey Brown at 8:30 this morning to challenge a temporary restraining order against any mass march here.

Dr. King and others planning a Monday march in support of striking sanitation workers yesterday appeared headed toward a possible clash with the order — if it remains in force.

"We are not going to be stopped by a court order," said Dr. King.

But United States Atty. Thomas Robinson said the temporary order will be enforced even if it means calling in federal troops.

Dr. King's attorneys, Louis Lukan, Walter Bailey and Louis Harris, asked Judge Brown to set aside the order.

Dr. King said he was not planning to march until he had a chance to talk to the federal government.

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BJ Going To Hawaii Today To Consult On Peace Moves, Set Stage For Red Meeting

US Wary Of Bid To Talk Of Peace On Enemy Terms

WASHINGTON, April 3 — The administration is eager to talk to North Vietnam about Hanoi's latest peace proposal, but it is frankly suspicious that it is merely being invited to talk about ending the war on the enemy's terms.

The fear in official quarters here is that the Hanoi government has misjudged the recent political convulsion in the United States, and may be acting on the illusion that the departure of former Secretary of Defense Robert McNamara, the replacement of Gen. William Westmoreland, and the forthcoming retirement of President Johnson mean that the administration is prepared to accept Hanoi's four-point peace plan.

This, of course, the Johnson administration is not prepared to do. It still regards the Hanoi proposal as an invitation to surrender, and is standing by to review the situation if it is not accepted.

Nevertheless, the administration is following up the latest proposal in the hope that the preliminary talks will lead to a wider agenda, and possibly, to some kind of armistice, to limit military activity on both sides while the talks proceed.

The purpose of Johnson's trip to Hawaii Thursday night is reportedly to review the strategy and diplomatic situation in the light of the recent Hanoi proposal.

It is also important to define with the greatest precision the instructions to be given to the envoy who will contact Hanoi's officials, and if possible to get agreement to the negotiating instructions from the South Vietnamese government.

What minutes after Judge Brown signed the restraining order, the Hanoi government said it was ready to accept the order.

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HANOI OFFER OF TALKS ACCEPTED BY JOHNSON

WASHINGTON, April 3 — (UPI) — The United States and North Vietnam took a small but extremely significant step Wednesday toward preliminary diplomatic discussions that could lead to an end of the Vietnam War.

First, the Hanoi government declared in a radio broadcast its willingness to meet with American representatives to discuss "the unconditional cessation of the United States bombing raids and all other acts of war against the Democratic Republic of Vietnam so that talks may start."

Then President Johnson told newsmen he was accepting Hanoi's offer.

He announced the United States "will establish contact with the representatives of North Vietnam. Consultations with the government of South Vietnam and other allies are now taking place."

The President also said he would fly to Honolulu, Hawaii, late Thursday evening for a long weekend of conferences with American officials from South Vietnam.

Johnson did not say how contact would be made with North Vietnam, or what it would be.

Gaeta, Switzerland, was considered a likely site. The President already has said his prime negotiator in the event North Vietnam comes to respond to his challenge of this bombing raids would be Ambassador-at-Large W. Averell Harriman and Llewellyn H. Thompson, ambassador to the Soviet Union.

There was no word from Moscow or any other world capital Wednesday to shed light on the President's plans. But it was obvious that Johnson, after a full and hectic week, would be in a position to defend the peace initiative to the Senate.

The President had a lengthy afternoon meeting with leading advisers and then went to a White House dinner before a battery of cameras.

He read a statement quoting from an official United States government transcript of an English-language broadcast of the Hanoi offer.

He said the United States was ready to accept the offer.
