

Party Leaders Back Ellington As Favorite Son

Two Shelby County Democratic leaders yesterday re-acted "a tremendous response" in the proposal that Gov. Billie Ellington go to the party's national convention in Tennessee's favorite son contest.

There is reason to believe that support for Governor Ellington will spread to neighboring states, said John P. Canale and James Irwin.

The governor meets April 11 of the executive committee with other Democratic governor and Mr. Irwin is former congressman in St. Louis to discuss the presidential campaign, and their efforts were seen as a

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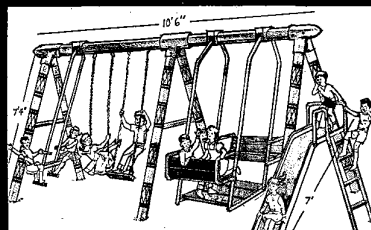

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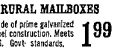
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Hanoi's Dubious Terms

PRESIDENT JOHNSON'S dramatic peace offer to North Vietnam has drawn an answer within three days — a response stating "readiness" to talk to the United States. And within less than a day Johnson has agreed to an American meeting with North Vietnamese representatives. The President will hurry to Hawaii tonight to make preparations.

Again, as he did in his Sunday night speech, President Johnson is calling all bluffs.

The aura of optimism, however, must be restrained.

Read the entire Hanoi statement and the optimism therein. President Ho Chi Minh has said that talks are possible. In the face of Mr. Johnson's cut-back in bombing of North Vietnam, and challenge to Hanoi to talk about anything, Hanoi had to indicate some willingness.

But keep the Hanoi response in context.

The bulk of the North Vietnamese statement bristled with references to the United States as barbaric, aggressive, cruel, perfidious, imperialistic, neo-colonialistic, while the Viet Cong were the "valiant" defenders of all Vietnam.

"US defeat is obvious," said Hanoi. The demand for complete withdrawal of all American and allied troops from South Vietnam was repeated.

Johnson's offer for a meeting and limitation of the bombing of North Vietnam to the supply areas feeding into South Vietnam was dismissed as "sneaky talk" intended only to placate public opinion.

March Control Is Essential

MEMPHIS is confronted by the threat of massive civil disobedience. Martin Luther King and followers have put off their planned midtown march until Monday in the hope of bringing in outsiders. None of them involved in the core issue which is the sanitation strike against the city of Memphis, a labor rather than a racial matter.

City strategy has been to seek a federal court restraining order against the march. This was granted temporarily by Judge Bailey Brown, with the understanding that he or Federal Judge Robert McRae could alter or reverse the order.

Winning and Losing At Nashville

TENNESSEE'S legislature has provided protection for the little man who borrows from small loan shops.

The General Assembly in its final hours set up a constitutional amendment which can produce major changes in assessment of real estate and building for taxation, with protection against annual changes in the formula at the hands of the legislature, county or city council. The convention is forbidden to establish a state income tax, which apparently also rules out city taxation by means of payroll taxes, service fees or other methods of reaching the suburban dweller who works in the city.

The same convention call, with little public discussion, allows establishment of a judicial system to replace the patchwork establishment of courts for local purposes.

The convention also may consider lowering the voting age to 18.

But the eventual action depends on approval by the people in statewide referendum, as well as programs of men elected as delegates to the convention, and on what the convention agrees upon in 1971.

The legislature also agreed on allowing counties and cities to hold referendums on adding a half-cent to the local sales tax. Mayor and county court chairmen are strongly in favor but the people in each locality have still to speak on whether the one-cent local sales tax should be increased. The state now collects three per cent.

There is a realistic change in interest rates, expected to end the flight of investment capital from the state, and encourage a return to financing of residences, and a surge of jobs in the home-building industry.

correctly and fully responded" to North Vietnam demands for "peace."

"However..."

With that word, Ho introduced the sentence which is being interpreted as a major break in Hanoi's intransigence.

"However, on its part, the DRV (Democratic Republic of Vietnam, or North Vietnam) government declares its readiness to send its representatives to make contact with US representatives to decide with the US side the unconditional cessation of bombing and all other war acts by the United States against the DRV so that talks could be begun."

However, that language and what you have is a thin and fragile thread on which to hang any optimism.

Hanoi is willing to discuss with the United States an unconditional and total cessation of bombing of North Vietnam, by including "all other acts of war," presumably Ho means the defense of South Vietnam must come to a halt, since he considers all Vietnam as one.

If America agrees to that step (no mention of any de-escalation on the part of North Vietnam is made), Hanoi then will talk about peace.

DIPLOMATS and decoders of such international gobbledegoo may discern a glimmer of hope in the willingness of Hanoi to talk, even with impossible qualifications.

But Hanoi has made less than a meaningful gesture, and America certainly cannot accept Hanoi's terms. President Johnson has made a counter-offer.

Check to Hanoi again.

But the Vice President does have political strength, especially with his reputation as a laborer, when Kennedy is relatively weak — and his office has and will continue to give him wide national exposure.

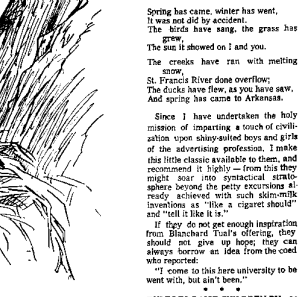
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Lame Duck President Creates Problems

WASHINGTON — Former Vice President Richard Nixon's first reaction to the retirement of President Johnson was to note that both Truman and Eisenhower were able to get much done in their final years. The fact was negative at best. Truman could not settle the Korean War nor prevent the great steel strike. Eisenhower, after the 1961 12 incident, was never able to recover the initiative on foreign policy.

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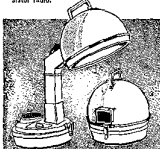
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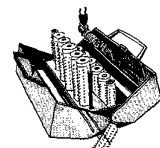

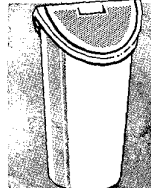
