Legat, London, has forwarded to the Eureau photocopies of numerous documents octaining to James Larl May which were obtained from anthorities on a confidential basis. The exact nature of these documents is set forth in a memorandum dated July 23, 1988, from Hr. Hosen to Hr. Debotch. In general, these items are letters sent under the name-lamon George Sneyd to Hr. J. B. Stoner, Attorney at Law, Envannah, Georgia; Hr. Arthur J. Hanes, subject May's attorney; the Attorney General; John May, subject's brother and Mr. Edward death, of the House of Commons. Also included in the material submitted was a letter from John May to the subject and observations of prison persentel concerning the subject's activities during his incarceration.

It was determined from an examination that the questioned bandwriting and hand printing appearing on the items which emanated from hamon George Sneyd were prepared by the subject JAMES TARL MAY, FBI #408942G.

Legat, London has forwarded a photocopy of a page of the guest book of the Heathfield Heuse Hotel, London, England, which bears the signature Ramon George Sneyd and indicates that this individual registered at this hotel on May 17, 1968.

Handwriting characteristics noted indicate that the Sneyd signature on the above described page was probably prepared by subject JAMES EARL RAY, FBI #405942G, but because of the indistinctness of the photocopy submitted a definite opinion could not be reached.

Various London communications have set forth that sources were unable to determine RAY's whereabouts from 5/17/63 when he arrived in England from Lisbon, and 5/20/60 when he checked into the New Earls Court Hotel.

As a result of conferences at the it was strongly suggested to them that PAY must have stayed at a small hotel in the Mensington area near the West London Air Torminal. The agreed to do a recheck of all hotels in this area, as a result of which it has been determined PAY checked into the Heathfield House Hotel, 181-183 Cronwell Road, London, S.W. 5, on 5/17 and checked out on 5/23, which is the date he checked into the New Earls Court Motel.

Enclosed are two copies each of statement made by the proprietress of the Heathfield House Hotel, pertinent page of the hotel's guest book showing RAY's signature, and the hotel's copy of the receipt given to RAY.

With the foregoing information we have now accounted for RAY's imidence in England for the period 5/17/68 to 6/8/63, when he was apprehended.

STILL ON VICIN

In addition to the information set forth in the enclosed statement, Mrs. VECTWOOD advised that some time after MAY checked out on 5/23/03 her husband deposited three \$10 American Empress checks to their account at the bank. Neither she nor her husband can fully recall, but believe there is a possibility these travelers checks could have been received from RAY.

It is not known whether it is possible for American Express, New York, to check for any checks issued to RAY under the name SREYD without the check numbers. Investigation re these checks being left to discretion of the Eureau.

confidence that on 5/27/68 at 5:20 P.M. a lone man with a small gun valked into a jeweler's shop in Paddington area of London, pointed the gun at the jeweler, and said, "This is a stick-up, give me the money in the till." The jeweler hesitated and the map panicked and ran out of the shop and did not obtain any loot. When shown ten photographs of different men, the jeweler without hesitation picked out RAY as the hold-up man. The only confusing point is that the jeweler claims the man were a hat. As far as can be determined RAY was hatless during his period in England, and did not have a hat in his possession. If he is the man involved he could, of course, have disposed of the hat.

points out that in the morning of June 4, 1988, he asked the clerk at the New Earls Court Notel how much his bill wouldbe, and when told he reportedly said, "I'll have to go to my bank and make a withdrawal." The Fulham Bank (Lonairtel 7/3/68) was robbed the afternoon of June 4th.

On 5/27/68 he asked the clerk at the Heathfield House Hotel how much his bill would be, and when told reportedly he made a similar statement about makir a withdrawal from his bank.

has the theory that if RAY is the man involved in the jewelry shop attempt, since he did not get any money then he must have committed a successful job between 5:20 P.M. on 5/27/63 and the morning of 5/28/68 in order to be able to pay his bill at Heathfield House.

is not going to conduct any investigation to prove this theory. They are entremely fearful that if information re the jewelry shop job and information implicating RAY in any other jobs leaks to the press, that RAY's solicitor will insist RAY be charged in order to clear him of any or all jobs he allegedly committed.

Foregoing information, plus copies of enclosures, may be furnished the Department of Justice, with the understanding that the jewelry shop information should not be revealed to the press or public sources at this time.

In addition, a TWA message slip was submitted for latent fingerprint examination. The Identification Division has advised that two latent fingerprints of value were developed on the slip but are not identical with fingerprints of James Earl Ray. This slip bears handwritten message addressed to "Mr. Yarum Chandra Dutt" as follows: "Mr. Ray to meet you at T. W. A. ticket deak." It has been determined that this writing was not prepared by James Earl Ray.

The test bullets and cartridge cases from the subject's revolver are being expeditiously forwarded to Legat, Ottawa, for appropriate RCMP comparison. All other submitted items mentioned are being expeditiously returned to Legat, London, for return to Scotland Yard.

In the transistor radio in the possession of RAY at the time of his arrest was a torn piece of paper janmed against the battery, apparently to hold the battery right. This paper has parts of notations, apparently in BAY's bandwriting, as follows: "Consul for ", "Then Weit" "Portuguese knew about" "MERIUND". It would appear likely that these notes partain to RAY's efforts to go to Africa as a merconary. has determined that "MERIUND" is meaningless to IAN COLVIN and Major VICHS.

that the IAN COLVIN has advised organization in Brussels known as CHISP, which is mentioned in COLVIN's previously submitted statement, is a research organization that attempts to keep track of moreonaries in Africa. COLVIN'S mention to RAY of CHISP and M. JEAN GIRARD-LIEDONS, who is connected with CRESP, was in the context of suggesting a possible means of locating NAY's brother whom RAY had alleged was a mercenary in Angola and missing. In this regard it is noted that COLVER did not provide RAY with the address of the above individual or organization.

It was alleged that when RAY left the Pax Hotel on the morning of his arrest he carried a small flight bag over his shoulder and no other luggage. When arrested he had no luggage, baving already checked one suitease to Brussels. This suitease was recovered by and is a square, plaid, fabric zipper bag semewhat larger than the usual "two-suiter".

baggage reems and lockers in London without locating any luggage identifiable with RAY. All indications are that at the time of his arrest RAY was on his way to Brussels for the purpose of making the necessary contacts to go to Africa as a mercenary and it would therefore seem unlikely the he was leaving anything of value behind.

An examination of RAY's airline tickets down that the number of pieces and weight of luggage was not aftered on the ticket for the flight from Torento to London. From London to Lisbon he checked one piece weighing 12 kilos (3.46 pounds). On the return flight from Lisbon to London he checked one piece weighing 15 kilos (33.07 pounds); and on the intended flight to Brusnels he checked one piece veighing 13 kilos (23.66 pounds). has advised that his bag in its present condition weighs 28 pounds and 12 ounces. A raincest he was carrying when arrested weighs an additional two pounds. Articles removed from his bag for his use in prison, not counting what he actually wears, consist of a suit, a shirt, a pair of socks, an undershirt and a pair of shorts, having a total estimated weight of 3 pounds.

has advised that airline employees often fail to take time to precisely weigh luggage unless overweight charges are involved (the allowance is 20 kilos) and they often estimate the weight while the scale is fluctuating. This could readily account for an error of one or two kilos. It is noted that his raincoat may have been in the suitcase on the flight from Lisben to London; therefore it is not apparent that any of his personal effects are missing.

The Atlantic edition of "TIME" Magazine, 6/21/08, has been withdrawn from sale in England because of an article on Pages 22-28 captioned "MAY's Odd Odyssey." This article includes details of the subject's prior criminal activities as well as a detailed summary of this case and his activities since July, 1967. Publication of such material concerning a defendant under pending charges is strictly prohibited by British law.

In removing outdated messages from their bulletin board at Meathrow Interpational Airport, London, TWA noted that one of their message ferror, dated 5/28/68, at 8:00 AM, was addressed to Mr. YANGE CHANDRA DATE, Flight 700 on 5/27/68, advising DUCT that "Mr. MAY will meet you at TWA ticket desk." believes that the message is in the handwriting of a TWA employee but all TWA employees have been contacted without identifying the person taking the message and without developing any information concerning DUTT, "Mr. RAY" or the subject.

TWA Flight 700 is from Kennedy Airport, New York, to London. The name DUFT does not appear on the passenger list of Flight 700 on 5/27/68 and no record could be found of DUTT's arrival in London.

New York should check with TWA for any information regarding DUTT and determine if he has any connection with the subject. As has been set forth in detail in prior memoranda the have located a passport application in Toronto in the name "Ramon George Sneyd" dated April 18, 1888. There is a photograph of "Encyd" taken April 11, althou to certain of the papers and the photograph strongly resembles subject James Earl Ray. We have compared, with known writing of James Larl Ray, the hand printing on a letter directed by "Encyd" to a travel agency in Toronto together with the signatures appearing on the three documents cummitted in connection with passport application and have found that these were prepared by subject Ray. The General Investigative Division has been advised and a teletype is being sent to Legat Ottawa, Tremphis and to Lumble.

In addition, a portrait parle commarison has been made between the passport photograph of "Encyd" and known photograph of the subject and although there are not enough individual characteristics to make a positive identification, the many similarities found strongly suggest that passport photograph of "Encyd" is actually a photograph of subject Ray.

The Bureau has received an anonymous religious greeting card the envelope of which bears the postmark Hoboken, New Jersey, and is dated May 17, 1968. Attached to the greeting card is a "Miraculous" religious medal and a message on this card implies that subject James Karl Ray could be located at an address in Memphis, Tennessee.

The handwriting and hand printing appearing on the envelope and greeting card were searched in the Anonymous Letter File but could not be identified with any prior submissions to this file, and no identifying features were noted on these two items which might indicate their immediate source.

The writings appearing on the envelope and greeting card were compared with the writings which have been submitted in connection with the MURKIN case but nothing of significance was noted.

The greeting card and envelope will be forwarded to the Latent Fingerprint Section for appropriate examination.

Department of State, in an effort to identify a possible passport application that may have been made by the subject in a name other than his own or known aliases he has used. Such a review would involve examinations of photographs appearing on the applications, typewriting, possibly hand printing and the amount of script involved in the applicant's signature. Such a program involves literally thousands of documents. General Investigative Division has approved this program.

WFO has requested the Laboratory's assistance in preparing a packet of writings, typewriting and photograph suitable for issue to each Agent participating in the survey that would facilitate the search. This material has been prepared along with a chart pointing out the more unusual characteristics involved in the handwriting, hand printing and typewriting attributed to the subject. In addition, Supervisor James H. Mortimer has met with members of the squad distributed the requested material, described and explained the characteristics they should look for and answered questions posed by them. WFO has been instructed that any applications selected by virtue of this screening should be promptly submitted to the Laboratory for an examination by our experts. Attached is one set of photographs depicting the material furnished to WFO Agents.

The Bureau has received an anonymous hand printed letter and envelope postmarked in Arlington, Virginia on April 26, 1968. The anonymous letter states "Dr. King's assassin is working with a group down in New Orleans, Louisiana and the blond haired woman that the assassin or his brother had the date with in California is the leader of the group, and is a communist."

Differences were noted between the hand printing on the anonymous letter and envelope when compared with the known hand printing of James Earl Ray and other similar anonymous communications which have been received in connection with this investigation; however, the distorted nature of the hand printing on these two items referred to above prevented a definite conclusion from being reached.

The anonymous letter and envelope were searched in the Anonymous Letter File but could not be identified with any prior submissions to this file and no identifying characteristics were noted on these items which might indicate their immediate source.

The anonymous letter and envelope have been forwarded to the Latent Fingerprint Section for appropriate examination.


