On 4/18/68, Mrs. VIRGINIA GUY, a photographer and journalist with Flair News Service, 1028 Connecticut Avenue, NW, telephonically advised WFO that while covering the funeral of MARTIN LUTHER KING in Atlanta, Georgia, she took pictures during the procession from the church to Morehouse College. Among these pictures were 3 of a group of people standing on an overpass above the procession. It was her impression that one of these individuals in the photographs resembled the FBI poster photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT.

She had furnished the above information to JERRY O'LEARY of the "Evening Star," who suggested that she contact the FBI.

On 4/19/68, Mrs. GUY appeared at WFO with her attorney, PHILIP HIRSCHCOP, 110 North Royal, Alexandria, Virginia. Mrs. GUY brought with her the above-mentioned

photographs, which she stated were taken approximately ten minutes prior to the funeral procession passing the point in the photograph. Mrs. GUY pointed out one individual whom she believed may be identified as ERIK STARVO GALT. She also had blown-up shots of this individual.

Mrs. GUY's attorney was of the opinion that the individual mentioned by GUY was a much younger man than GALT. SAs JOHN J. CREAMER and JOHN BLAZEK observed these photographs and determined they did not resemble GALT's photograph as it appears on the wanted poster. Mrs. GUY advised that she did not wish to release her photographs, but stated they would be available in the future if a better likeness was obtained and appears to be the same as the individual in her picture.

WFO is taking no further action concerning photographs taken by Mrs. GUY of the unidentified individual, UACB.

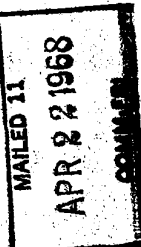

Results of examination:

Numerous hairs were found on the Q164 and Q165 bed sheets. The hairs include brown to black head, pubic and limb hairs of Caucasian origin. Also, one dark brown head hair of Negroid origin was found on Q165. The range of characteristics exhibited by the Caucasian hairs suggests that they are from more than one person. Some of the hairs are deteriorated and dirty, similar to hairs from floor debris.

A few of the Caucasian head hairs from Q164 and Q165 are similar in some microscopic characteristics to hairs previously found on items from the Mustang and Memphis scene but do not match in all microscopic characteristics. The possibility that these hairs originated from the same source could not be eliminated.

No fibers were found on Q164 or Q165 that could be associated with the Q13 bedspread or with other cloth items previously submitted from the Memphis scene or from the Mustang.

The Q171 keyhole saw is old. The brand or source of Q171 could not be determined.

Some similarities were noted between the handwritten word "florida" and other variations of this word appearing on Q167 when compared with available writings attributable to Eric S. Galt. The limited nature of the writings on Q167 precluded a more definite opinion.

The hand printing on Q170 (Jimmy Owen) is upper- and lower-case, while previous hand printing on items received has been upper-case letters. For this reason, it could not be determined whether this name was prepared by Galt; however, differences were noted.

The printed words "P^ETTED" and either "PUNCH" or "BUNCH" were faintly inscribed on the newspaper designated Q169. Any significance of this is not known.

No previous road maps similar to Q166 have been received.

Specimens Q166 through Q170 and Q172 were all examined for indented impressions and other markings, but except for the above, nothing of significance was noted.
