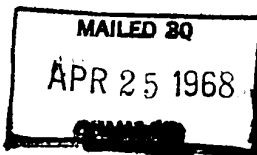

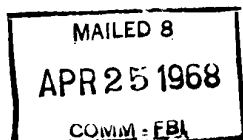

JAMES RIORDAN, Hotel Frances, Room 316, Atlanta, Georgia, former tenant of 113 Fourteenth Street, NE, during the time subject as ERIC S. GALT resided at 113 Fourteenth Street, NE, previously interviewed in this matter.

On April 20, 1968, he came to the FBI Office and explained that at the time of prior interview he was under sedation and was somewhat groggy.

After the interview he recalled that while at 107 Fourteenth Street, NE, between the dates of March 24 and March 30, 1968, he made photographs with his Geiss camera. He took two photographs from the rear of 107 and 113 Fourteenth Street, NE, where he recalled seeing a white Mustang. He said while no persons were photographed in these photographs he felt they might include photographs of automobiles which might be pertinent and of assistance. He made available three rolls of unexposed film and stated that at least three photographs in this group may be pertinent. He has another roll of film in the camera at the present time which might include pertinent photographs if not included in these three rolls of film.

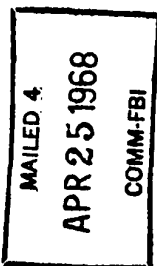

If interviewed in the past he must be reinterviewed concerning the above allegation and full details obtained about that statement by him. 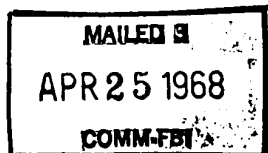

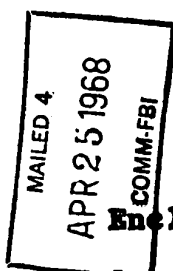

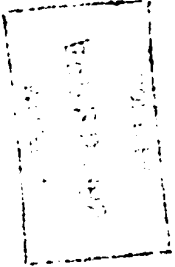
