Differences were noted between the "Harvey Lowmyer" signature on Q72 when compared with the known handwriting of JOHN RAY, K196, but the limited questioned signature and the lack of comparable material precluded a definite opinion from being reached.

It was concluded that the other questioned writings submitted in this case were not prepared by JOHN RAY, K196.

Result of examination:

The size and style of the numerals and letters on K172 through K175, as well as those appearing on some other known specimens received, are the same as corresponding portions of the laundry tapes appearing on the Q97 sheet and the Q99 pillow case.

Because of the lack of identifying features on which to base a definite opinion, it could not be established that one of the machines used to prepare K172 through K175 was used to prepare the questioned laundry marks. Of these known specimens, only K175 has the letters "O" and "R" spaced the same as on the Q97 and Q99 tags. There are an insufficient number of known specimens available imprinted "2OR-3" to assess the significance of this feature; however, prior examinations indicate this factor alone is not sufficient to identify a laundry tag with a particular machine.

K172 through K177 have been retained.

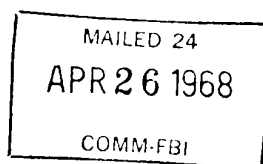

RE: BEDSPREAD

In referenced Memphis airtel, a lead was set forth for the Charlotte Office to contact all textile manufacturers in an effort to determine the source or manufacturer of the bedspread abandoned at Memphis by the subject.

For the information of the Bureau, there are 45 textile manufacturers in the city of Charlotte alone, and over 100 textile manufacturers in Gastonia, N. C. Throughout the state of North Carolina, there are hundreds of textile manufacturers.

On 4/19/68, JIM OAKLEY (former SA), Security Officer of Beaunit Mills, Gastonia, N. C., advised that it would be extremely helpful if a swatch of the material in the bedspread could be made available for examination by experts in the textile field in determining the manufacturer.

In the event the Bureau desires that this lead be pursued, even though JAMES EARL RAY has been identified as the subject, it is requested that a swatch of the bedspread be furnished Charlotte for display to textile manufacturers.

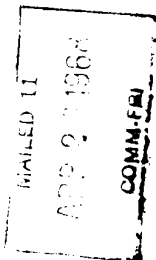

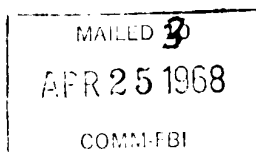

On 4/22/68, Mrs. MARY GROOMS, 159 Burkedale Crescent, Rochester, New York, furnished a letter which she received on 4/19/68. The letter was contained in an envelope postmarked "Rochester, NY, PM, 17 April 1968." The letter reads as follows:

"Mrs. Grooms -

"I read your column regularly they are good and factual, with lots of common sense. The King plot was hatched recently in Detroit by Black Nationalists, Muslims, and Commies (I was there). The job was done by a hired professional killer. The Commies paid for the job. The authorities will eventually find out.

"An anonymous black man"

Mrs. GROOMS, who writes a weekly column for the Rochester "Times Union," a daily Rochester newspaper, was unable to furnish any additional information.

The letter is being obtained and forwarded to the Laboratory.

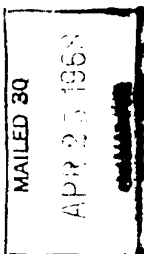

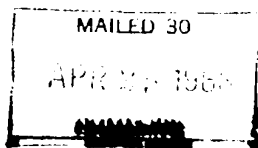
