HE FELT IT WAS ALMOST CERTAIN THAT CHICAGO WOULD HAVE FURTHER DIFFICULTY WHEN SUMMER CAME. ANOTHER PERSON TOOK EXCEPTION TO O'NEILL'S REMARKS, AND A FIVE DOLLAR WAGER WAS MADE WITH O'NEILL TAKING THE POSITION THAT CHICAGO WOULD BE BOTHERED BY RIOTS DURING THE COMING SUMMER. LATER THAT EVENING, ROULSTON INDICATED HE FELT THE RACIAL SITUATION WAS DETERIORATING AND STATED MARTIN LUTHER KING WOULD BE KILLED BEFORE MAY ONE NEXT. O'NEILL TOOK EXCEPTION TO THIS REMARK AND BET ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS THAT KING WOULD NOT BE KILLED BEFORE MAY ONE NEXT.

UPON HEARING OF KING'S DEATH, O'NEILL AT NASHVILLE, TENN., SENT A HUNDRED DOLLAR CHECK TO ROULSTON AT WASHINGTON, D.C. ROULSTON TORE UP THE CHECK AND NOTIFIED O'NEILL THAT HE FELT IT WAS "BAD BET" AND HE FELT BADLY ABOUT HAVING SUGGESTED SUCH A WAGER. O'NEILL INTERVIEWED AT NASHVILLE, TENN., AND INDICATED NEITHER HE NOR ROULSTON HAS ANY INFORMATION REGARDING SUBJECT OR THE MURDER OF KING.

On 4/26/68, Mrs. DONOVAN D. (NORMAN A.) WOODSIDE, 309 Elmwood Drive, Edmond, Oklahoma, was reinterviewed and IO 4182 displayed to her. Mrs. WOODSIDE said the individual she saw on American Airlines Flight 338 from Dallas, Texas, to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on 4/6/68, very strongly resembled RAY and she believes him to be identical with RAY. She stated she first noticed this individual in the Love Field Terminal, American Airlines, Waiting Area, a few moments prior to boarding this flight. Mrs. WOODSIDE said she could not locate her ticket stub, but believes she occupied seat 14-C, an aisle seat on the left side of the plane, in the tourist section, and that the above individual occupied the aisle seat one row up on the right.

Mrs. WOODSIDE said this individual did not get off the plane when it landed at Friendship Airport in Baltimore, Md., did not converse with anyone on the plane, and carried no luggage.

She informed he deplaned at Philadelphia, Pa., and she lost sight of him when her husband met her at the airport. Mrs. WOODSIDE related her husband is employed by RCA International Service Company, Camden, New Jersey, as Area Manager. He is presently on an assignment in the Azores, but at the time was working out of Camden, N. J. Mrs. WOODSIDE said she made the trip to spend Easter with her husband, and returned to Edmond, Oklahoma, on 4/16/68. Mrs. WOODSIDE stated she did not know any of the people on Flight 338.

Mrs. WOODSIDE said she has made so many trips by air that she now spends her time watching other passengers. She noticed that the above individual was visibly nervous, pulled at both of his ears and his nose and would rub the back of his neck, going from one to the other almost in one motion. She also noticed he had bitten his fingernails up to the quick. He spent some time listening to the radio, using the headset in the seat pocket in front of him and often removed these from his ears only to replace them in a few moments. While waiting for the plane to depart Dallas, he nervously directed his gaze out the window as if looking for someone. Mrs. WOODSIDE said at the time she thought he was afraid to fly, which resulted in his nervous manifestations. He appeared so nervous, Mrs. WOODSIDE said, that she thought he might "pass out."
