On April 17, 1968, Doris Hill, an employee of Stoyas Drugs, 1145 Bryn Mawr, Chicago, Illinois, telephonically advised that an individual had come into the drugstore around 11:40 p.m., April 16, 1968, and stated that he was the person who shot Dr. Martin Luther King. He stated he had fired the shot that would start the third world war and would finish it May 1, 1968, by causing a holocaust in Chicago, Illinois, that would make Hiroshima and Nagasaki look like child's play.

The individual described as a white male, age 35, height, 5' 9½", 180 pounds, placed two long distance calls from a pay phone at the drugstore. The calls were made to Dr. David Horton, in Mobile, Alabama, who was believed to live on St. Dominick Street, in Mobile.

Other patrons of the drugstore advised Hill that this individual had earlier been in Teddy's Lounge, at Bryn Mawr and Kenmore Streets. This individual had never been in the drugstore before. He did not appear to be intoxicated, but was quite irrational.

On April 18, 1968, Dr. David Horton, University of South Alabama, Mobile, advised that on April 15, 1968, his wife's brother, Tom Glamore of 9726 Franklin Avenue, Franklin Park, Illinois, called from Chicago, Illinois, and requested Dr. Horton to send him money to buy a television set. Dr. Horton advised this was the first contact with Glamore since 1966, when he, Glamore, ran away from St. Louis, Missouri, believing the Hortons planned to commit him to a mental institution. He stated Glamore raved and was very incoherent. Glamore called again collect on Tuesday, April 16, 1968. Dr. Horton accepted the first call, but as Glamore was extremely belligerent and raved on the phone in an incoherent

manner, Mrs. Horton hung up on him. When he later called collect, they refused to accept the call.

Dr. Horton advised Glamore is about 47 years of age, a veteran of World War II and is extremely mentally ill. Dr. Horton advised he felt Glamore should be committed, but hospitals keep releasing him as not being a violent type. Dr. Horton advised Glamore has an obsession that the Mafia is after him and Glamore also told him that Stan Musial killed Dr. Martin Luther King. Glamore has been hospitalized numerous times in the past, according to Dr. Horton with one hospitalization in Downey Veterans Administration Hospital, near Chicago, but he did not know when Glamore had last been in a mental hospital. As a result of his mental condition, Glamore is unable to hold a job and Dr. Horton was unable to furnish any additional information concerning his present condition.

One copy each of this letterhead memorandum is being furnished the United States Attorney, Chicago, the United States Secret Service, Chicago, and Region I, 113th MI Group, Evanston, Illinois.

Sergeant Burns of the Intelligence Unit, Chicago Police Department, and Detective John Rubino of the Franklin Park Police Department, were orally advised of the aforementioned information.

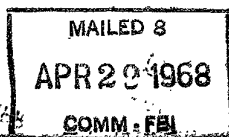

The lead cores of the bullets in the five cartridges, Q4 through Q8, were found to vary in composition even though they were all from the same manufacturer.

The core portion of the Q64 bullet fragment from the victim's body is similar in composition to the lead core of the bullet in the cartridge designated Q4 and could have come from a source such as represented by the lead core of the bullet in Q4.

The bullet jacket portion of specimen Q64 is similar in composition to the metal of the jackets of the bullets in the Q4 through Q8 cartridges and could have come from the source represented by these bullets.

Result of examination:

It was concluded that the typewriting on Q290 and Q291 is not identical with typewriting appearing on questioned items previously received in this case in the Galt name. Due to the presence of distortion in the questioned writing on Q290, and because of the lack of comparable material, a definite conclusion could not be reached whether JAMES EARL RAY, FBI# 4059426, prepared the questioned handwriting and hand printing on Q290. Significant handwriting differences were noted in the handwriting and hand printing on Q290 when compared with material submitted in this case attributable to RAY.

Q290 and Q291 were searched in the Anonymous Letter File without effecting an identification. Copies have been added to this file for future reference. The typewriting on these specimens most closely corresponds to a standard for Royal pica style of type, spaced ten letters to the inch. Q290 and Q291 were examined for watermarks and indented writing with negative results. Q290 and Q291 have been photographed and are being returned to Atlanta separately.

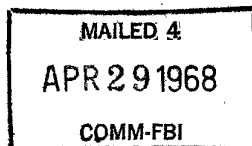

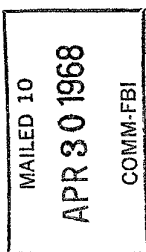
