Gentlemen:

Re: Dr. King murder

In response to David Lawrence's column in the Evening Star,
April 28, 1968, I offer this information for what it is worth.

I realize there must be a lot of salts in the U.S. However, I am
familiar with Ayn Rand's book "Atlas Shrugged" and the name John
Salt would ring a bell in my mind.

During the period December 1964 through June 1966, I worked
for Mars Leasing Corporation as an assistant bookkeeper. This
business is a furniture rental business. I believe, the name has
now been changed to Republic Leasing. It is located on Monroe St. in
Baltimore, Maryland. It is still under the same management so I've
been told.

One of my duties involved accepting and refunding security deposits on
the furniture rentals. Most people who rent furniture do so for
only short periods of time, therefore, transients in this area.

I recall handling a security deposit for a John Salt in the Metropolitan
Area of Virginia, either as a refund or forfeit. If so, there would be
information on the card (dead file) showing where the refund was mailed.
In the furniture unit files, there should also be the application
with personal information. I believe that a Mrs. Helen Grey is still
employed with them and could help you locate either file. The dead file
of deposits would in all probability be under the name of Salt.

During this period that I worked for Mars Leasing, I was usually the
only person who made and filed these cards and this was the first
time I ever recalled seeing the name John Salt other than in Ayn
Rand's book.

I realize this is a weak tip but you may wish to check it out.

On 4/24/68, RICHARD PARDI, Comptroller, Computing Technology, Inc., 26 Park Place, Paramus, New Jersey, telephone 265-4040 telephonically contacted NYO and provided information concerning an electronic scanning device utilizing computers for ballistic examinations. He offered to make this procedure available to the FBI for ballistic examination of the bullet and gun used in the assassination in captioned civil rights matter.

Mr. PARDI said he understood through newspapers that ballistic tests to date were not conclusive. His company has developed a procedure whereby a computer optical scanner, using numerical systems programmed into computers is so sensitive that all surface changes are noted. He is of the opinion that tests with such equipment would be conclusive where other methods have failed.

He explained that with the computer system it is not necessary to depend on the human eye, nor light nor

microscopes. The computer system examination has been conducted by a very capable program man within his organization.

According to PARDI this procedure has been demonstrated to the NYCPD and published in one of the scientific journals. He said the NYCPD is attempting to obtain sufficient funds with which to procure and utilize this procedure.

PARDI stated that by letter he previously offered the use of this system to the FBI in Washington, D.C.

An information copy of this airtel is being furnished to Newark in the event it is deemed advisable by the Bureau to have PARDI contacted in Paramus, New Jersey for additional information.

PARDI said his company has expended thousands of dollars in developing this procedure but at the present time it is not being utilized. He said he is not seeking any publicity for his company in offering to make it available to the FBI.

SWORN STATEMENT

I, **Henry Johnson McADEN**, WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH:

I became acquainted with Captain Wilborn RAY (then 2d LT) sometime in August 1962, when I was assigned to the 13th Psy War Bn at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. Later, when I became the S-4, RAY worked for me as Battalion Maintenance Officer. I lived at this time in government quarters at 514 Mondragon Street. I had daily contact with RAY while he worked for me. RAY visited me and my family in my quarters rather frequently. On Saturdays during the football season we would watch ball games in my quarters. To my knowledge RAY got out of the Army sometime in 1964 and went back to Johnson City, Tennessee to take care of his mother. I left Bragg in 1964 to go to Vietnam.

I was surprised to meet RAY again at Fort Eustis, Virginia when I reported to duty there some time in August 1966. RAY had one of the Student Companies. During my stay at Eustis I had little contact with RAY. I was assigned to 714th Rail Battalion as S-3 and the job kept me pretty busy. I saw RAY three or four times during this period and had him once for dinner at my quarters at 122 Roston Drive, Wardick, Virginia. I left Fort Eustis in May of 1967 to go to Fort Benjamin Harrison, and later I was transferred to Fort Shafter, Hawaii.

Q. MAJ McADEN, do you remember any discussions with RAY involving racial issues?
A. No. We may have discussed some of the demonstrations which were taking place in the country, but racial discussions were never a definite topic.

Q. Do you remember discussing Dr Martin Luther KING with RAY?
A. The name was probably mentioned in some of our conversations.

Q. Did RAY ever tell you that he had the ability to predict future events?
A. No, he never did.

Q. MAJ McADEN, RAY claims that on two occasions, once in September 1966, and again in January or February 1967, he told you that he knew that Dr KING would be assassinated if he ever came to Memphis, Tennessee, and gave you the details of the assassination and the name of the murderer. Do you remember such conversations?

A. No. I am sure that if such conversations had taken place, the events surrounding the assassination of Dr KING would have brought about a recollection. It seems to me that I remember meeting him at the Officers Club at Fort Eustis around the time during which this alleged conversation took place, but this was a very short meeting and the conversation unimportant.

- Q. If you were RAY's rater, how would you describe him?
- A. Above average, very intelligent, competent, trustworthy and friendly.
- Q. Did you have any indication, during your association with RAY, that he was mentally disturbed or that he could be a subject of a mental breakdown?
- A. No. During my stay in Fort Bragg RAY was a happy-go-lucky fellow, who liked people. He was somewhat changed when I met him again in Fort Eustis. He became more serious, sober and mature. He was very attached to his mother.
- Q. Would you describe this attachment as above normal?
- A. Yes. I would say that if his mother would die, this would produce a grave shock to him, much, much stronger than to another individual under similar circumstances.
- Q. Do you know of any close friends of Captain RAY?
- A. I cannot think of anyone, with possible exception of Captain Roy TAYLOR, Transportation Corps, who was stationed in Fort Eustis at the same time.
- Q. Would you like to add anything to this statement?
- A. Yes. In reference to RAY's attachment to his mother I heard that RAY changed his marriage plans because he felt that it may impair his ability to take care of her. I would also like to emphasize that RAY is an extremely intelligent and well-read man, with a tremendous amount of interest in medicine. He apparently idolizes a doctor from his home town.
