O'DONNELL advised that BILLY (LNU) told him that he was in Philadelphia to visit some friends with whom he had been in the service, but that when he went into a movie, his wallet was stolen and he did not know how to get in touch with these individuals.

O'DONNELL advised this individual said he had come from the State of Alabama and spoke with a Southern accent. He advised he appeared to be slightly illiterate and a bigot. He advised this BILLY (LNU) made reference to the killing of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING and said he believed the individual who did the killing would get a lot of money.

O'DONNELL stated this individual wore a dark blue sportshirt, with long sleeves; dark blue trousers; white sox; and black shoes, without any outer clothing in spite of the cold weather.

O'DONNELL advised that BILLY (LNU) had slightly stooped shoulders, pock marks on the back of his neck and shoulders, but he did not recall any scar on his forehead.

O'DONNELL furnished a gin bottle which he indicated BILLY (LNU) had handled on four or five occasions. He stated that he and BILLY (LNU) were the only ones who had handled this gin bottle and he stated he felt that his and BILLY's fingerprints could be obtained from this bottle to determine definitely if this individual were identical to RAY.

He advised he knew of no additional pertinent information relative to BILLY (LNU) which would be helpful in locating him.

The Identification Division is requested to compare the latent fingerprints developed from the enclosed empty bottle of Gilbey's Gin with the known fingerprints of RAY and advise the Philadelphia Office. PH 44-1368

During April his days off were Wednesday and Thursday, although MURRAY could not be sure that CRAMER took his days off since employees sometimes work on their day off or trade the day off with other employees for personal reasons.

THOMAS CRANER was interviewed at the White Front Department Store, Burion, Vashington, on 5/2/63. He stated he has been in Scattle continuously since early March, 1988 with the exception of a few short trips to the nearby rural areas for fishing. CRANER advised that while employed at the Stuart Warner Corporation, 1826 West Diversy Street, Chicage, Illinois, in 1986, he had occasion to fire a Negro girl under his supervision. Shortly thereafter a series of what he described as retaliatory measures took place, among them a personal assault on CRAMER accompanied by the theft of his automobile and threats to He family. When his automobile was recovered, it was found to have sugar in the gas tank and other damage which appeared to have been deliberately caused.

CRAMER stated that shortly after the above incidents, two detectives from the Damon Avenue Station of the Chicago Police Department approached him at his home and furnished him with information re HELEMA_KAUFIEN, such as that set forth in re Chicago tel. He advised the detectives at that time that he believed this to be another retaliatory measure, by members of the "Deacons For Defense", a Negro organization whom CRAMER believes is responsible for the attacks on his person and property in retaliation for his firing of the Magro girl, above. He felt at that time that this matter had been settled to the satisfaction of the Chicago Police. CRAMER stated that his supervisor at that time was one MITCH TSCHAIKOWSKY (PH) whom he claimed would verify the above information. He stated that TSCHAIKOWSKY would also be in a position to furnish information regarding a bomb threat which was received at Stuart Warner Corporation around the same time as the above incidents and which CRAMER believes probably was connected with the Deacons for Defense.

CRAMER advised he was born at Lima, Ohio, and currently resides at 6762 - 34th Avenue, White Center, Seattle, Washington. He operates a 1962 Oldsmobile. He claims to have been arrested on two occasions in Chicago as a result of fights.

On May 2, 1968, LOUIS FEE, the Bush Hotel, Seattle,

March, 1888. They came to Scattle together and lived, until recently, together at the Bush Hotel. FEE stated that, to the best of his knowledge, CRAMER has been in Scattle continuously since they arrived. He stated that he also worked at the White Front Department Store with CRAMER and knows that CRAMER was also continuously employed at that store since March, 1888. FEE specifically recalled telling CRAMER during the early part of April, 1988, of the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., and pointed out that FEE was the first one to mention this to CRAMER. He recalled that this was either during the afternoon or early evening on the day KING was shot.

In view of the above, UAC, no further investigation is being conducted regarding CRAMER at Scattle.

Pictures of James Earl Ray, suspect in the killing of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., has gone up all over Meramec Caverns, on U.S. 66, Stanton, Missouri.

The cave wants to prevent Ray, who once escaped from the Missouri State Prison, from getting an idea to emulate another much wanted Missouri criminal, Jesse James, who used the cave as a hide-out during the 1870's.

Life-size posters of the much sought after Ray is on display throughout the five-story cave.

For many years, through the cooperation of J. Edgar Hoover, director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the cave has been posting pictures of the FBI's "10 Most Wanted Men," in case any of them got any ideas from Jesse James. However, this is the first time that a wanted man's picture has been posted all around the underground emporium, according to Lester B. Dill, cave director.

HAROLD EDWARD NICHOLS, commonly known as HAL NICHOLS, was interviewed at his apartment, #33 Los Palmas Apartments, 15375 Tropic Court, San Leandro, California. After proper identification, he was advised that investigation was being conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation concerning a violation of Federal Law in connection with the murder of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. Further, that an allegation had been received that Mr. NICHOLS might have information pertinent to this matter on the basis of remarks NICHOLS is reported to have made concerning such matters in the presence of others.

Mr. NICHOLS advised that he has no information concerning the murder, and except for his personal opinion as to who might be responsible, has no specific information concerning the murder. He said he had absolutely no objection to discussion of the matter.

Mr. NICHOLS advised that he is extremely active in the political field at the present time and in the recent past. He is a member of an eight man board in charge of promoting candidates for the American Independent Party (AIP) in California, and particularly in behalf of the candidacy of former Governor GEORGE WALLACE of Alabama for President. He stated that most persons not familiar with the AIP program and objectives, seem to assume that those favoring AIP are what is sometimes termed "negro-baiters. He denied that this is true, and said that from the view point of promoting the AIP, the murder of Dr. KING under such circumstances was a set back to the AIP who might have favored their principles.

He said that no one knowledgeable in affairs of the AIP would have caused or participated in a situation or action such as this in that it would be certain to make a "Martyr" of Dr. KING, which would hurt the AIP.

However, since persons generally seem to associate AIP members with 'negro-baiters,' he is frequently kidded' along such lines by certain persons with whom he regularly comes into contact.
