INTENSIVE INVESTIGATION TO LEARN INFORMATION REGARDING "COOLEYS ORGANIZATION" IN THE MISSOURI STATE PENITENTIARY (MSP) UNSUCCESSFUL TO DATE, INTERVIEWS AT PRISON CONTINUE.

LAUNDRY AND DRY CLEANING ESTABLISHMENTS IN LOWER CLASS ROOMING HOUSE AREA BEING CONTACTED. INVESTIGATION UNDERWAY TO IDENTIFY AND INTERVIEW FULL-BLOODED INDIAN BARBER REPORTED TO BE ASSOCIATE OF RAY AT THE MSP. SUBSCRIBER TO TELEPHONE NUMBER NINE ONE THREE NINE EIGHT NINE FOUR FOUR SIX EIGHT IS MRS. FLOYD NONTZ, RT. ONE, WATHENA, KS. SHE AND HER SON A HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT ARE THE ONLY RESIDENTS AT THAT ADDRESS. BOTH ADVISED THAT TELEPHONE IN THEIR NAME SINCE MAY SIXTYSEVEN AND RECALL NO CALLS FROM THE STATE OF TEXAS AT ANY TIME. PHOTOGRAPH OR NAME OF SUBJECT UNKNOWN TO THEM.

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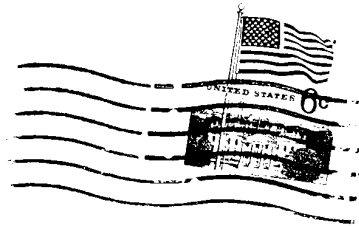

This is the matter involving the murder of Martin Luther King, Jr.

Louis E. Lomax has now released his final news article. It is a vicious and unwarranted attack against the Bureau and is replete with misstatements of fact and ridiculous conclusions.

1. LOMAX STATES: The Director deeply disliked King and once referred to him as a notorious liar; therefore, few black people will believe the Bureau will work overtime to find King's slayer.

FACTS: The total facilities of the FBI have been fully committed to this case from the outset. Investigation has proceeded around-the-clock on a top priority basis throughout the United States and in various foreign countries. Thousands of interviews have been conducted and hundreds of suspects have been processed. A tremendous number of examinations have been conducted by the Laboratory and Identification Division. Every logical investigative approach is being vigorously pursued and there will be no let up until Ray is apprehended.

2. LOMAX STATES: The FBI is inept or its bungling is intentional.

FACTS: The Bureau's record in this case is one of substantial achievement. Starting with an unknown subject, the man known as Eric Galt was identified as a prime suspect within five days. Within another week we had obtained a photograph of the subject and the Attorney General considered sufficient evidence had been developed to

warrant Federal process. Three days later, as a result of a project to check latent fingerprints against the fingerprints of more than 53,000 fugitives, Ray was determined to be identical with Galt.

3. LOMAX STATES: Somebody managed to circulate wrong fingerprints for Ray and if he had been arrested when he abandoned his car in Atlanta (4/5/68) he would not have been identified as Ray.

FACTS: The FBI has issued only one set of fingerprints and these are the actual fingerprints of Ray. When Ray escaped from prison in April, 1967, Missouri authorities issued a wanted notice that bore the wrong fingerprints; however, the warden immediately issued a corrected wanted notice bearing the correct fingerprints. We had nothing to do with these wanted notices issued by Missouri almost a year before King was killed.

4. LOMAX STATES: The FBI has pre-empted local police from the case by declaring the King murder a conspiracy.

FACTS: We have closely cooperated with the Memphis Police who obtained a murder warrant immediately after Federal process was obtained. All evidence has been turned over to the police together with the results of Laboratory and fingerprint examinations and we have offered local authorities whatever assistance may be needed in presenting the case to a local grand jury.

5. LOMAX STATES: The FBI has yet to ask the cooperation of the Los Angeles Police.

FACTS: Our relations with the Los Angeles Police in this case have been excellent. We have checked their records on the subject and various other individuals and on 5/3/68 when the police received a letter to the "Los Angeles Times" purportedly written by the subject, it was immediately made available to the Los Angeles Office.

6. LOMAX STATES: Ray made at least three trips from Los Angeles to New Orleans.

FACTS: Ray is only known to have made two trips from Los Angeles to New Orleans, in December, 1967, and in March, 1968.

7. LOMAX STATES: The FBI confiscated telephone company records listing calls made from Los Angeles telephone booths used by Ray and only the FBI knows what these records show.

FACTS: We have not confiscated any records. We have obtained information from the telephone company regarding calls made from all pay telephones in the St. Francis Hotel, Los Angeles. It would appear that Lomax has been unsuccessful in his efforts to obtain similar information from the telephone company.

8. LOMAX STATES: America's blacks never have trusted either the Director or the FBI.

FACTS: We have long enjoyed the confidence of responsible Negro leaders and the responsible Negro press. This confidence has been gained by the Bureau's continuing success in handling Civil Rights cases such as the murder of three civil rights workers in Mississippi, the murder of Lt. Colonel Lemuel Penn in Georgia, the murder of Viola Liuzzo in Alabama, investigations concerning discrimination in voting, education, and many similar investigative accomplishments.

9. LOMAX STATES: The FBI leaked a story to the press suggesting a Negro was behind King's murder.

FACTS: This is absolutely false.

10. LOMAX STATES: The Director should publicly admit his dislike for King and then "share the hunt" with a less prejudiced agency; the cause of justice would be better served if the investigation were under a Warren-type, biracial commission.

FACTS: This is unworthy of comment.

11. LOMAX STATES: It is certain powerful men in American society were part of the deed.

FACTS: We have developed no evidence to indicate this is true nor does Lomax document this statement in any way.

In his prior articles Louis Lomax made reference to a "mysterious blond" named Jerri who he alleged had been involved with Ray at Los Angeles and later went to Milwaukee where Lomax said she had disappeared. Jerri has been identified as Dyrell Dennis, a prostitute and narcotics addict whose relationship with Ray appears to have been limited to a single meeting in a bar followed by a brief visit to his room.

Edgar John Pendleton, Los Angeles, with whom Lomax has also been in contact, has made available a letter he received from Dyrell Dennis, postmarked 4/19/68 at Milwaukee. This letter states in part, "Have you seen Ray? I hope he is OK." Pendleton denies any knowledge of the subject and states the Ray mentioned by Dennis is Ray Selma, a Mexican-American who formerly resided at the St. Francis Hotel. It is noted Dennis has stated she knew the subject only as Eric.

Local authorities are scheduled to present this matter to a grand jury at Memphis, 5/7/68, to seek a murder indictment against Ray. At the present time it does not appear that Bureau personnel will be required to testify, but the Special Agent in Charge will be available if he is needed.

ACTION:

Vigorous investigation is continuing on a top priority basis.

On May 6, 1968, Mrs. RUTH HARNEY, 601 East Adams Street, Muncie, Indiana, advised as follows:

All the information which she has furnished by letter to FBI Headquarters, Washington, D.C., was obtained by her and her daughter, Mrs. BARBARA WALLEN, St. Johns Street, at Daleville Road, Daleville, Indiana, by use of a ouija board, a device which mystically spells out words when questions are asked of it. Also, she stated that at about the time of the Pueblo incident, she began hearing signals over her television set which sounded like Morse Code being transmitted, and she thought the Russians were doing this.

Mrs. HARNEY's letter to the Bureau was orally acknowledged and she was asked not to furnish additional letters to the Bureau based on information she obtains from her ouija board.

In view of the foregoing, ^{no} further investigation should be conducted concerning information furnished by Mrs. HARNEY.

In connection with the Martin Luther King case, there has been some speculation that James Earl Ray concocted the alias of Eric Starvo Galt by combining the names of characters from Ian Fleming books and from the book "Atlas Shrugged" by Ayn Rand. This speculation is based upon the fact that in Ian Fleming's series of James Bond books, an individual named Ernst Stavro Blofeld is one of the most formidable adversaries who confronts James Bond. Ernst Stavro Blofeld, for example, appears in "Thunderball," "On her Majesty's Secret Service" and elsewhere in the James Bond series. It will be noted, however, that there is a significant difference between Eric Starvo Galt and Ernst Stavro Blofeld.

Ayn Rand's book "Atlas Shrugged" was published in 1957 and is more than 1,100 pages long. The book begins on page 1 with the question, "Who is John Galt?" (Galt is characterized in this book as a

social "drop-out"--a person who has withdrawn from society because he resents the "leeches" who habitually take from, but do not contribute to, the body politic.) It is interesting to note that a person named Eric Starnes also is mentioned in "Atlas Shrugged." On 321 of this book, a chief of police in Louisiana is quoted as stating as follows about the Starnes family:

"There's all sorts of human beings to see in the world, there's murderers and criminal maniacs--but, somehow, I think these Starnes persons are what decent people shouldn't have to see. They're a bad sort.... Yes, they're still here in town--two of them, that is. The third one is dead. Suicide. That was four years ago. Its an ugly story. He was the youngest of the three, Eric Starnes. He was one of those chronic young men who go around whining about their sensitive feelings, when they're well past forty...."

The name Eric Starnes--appearing in a book which starts off with the question "Who is John Galt?"--could prompt some persons to say that James Earl Ray concocted the name Eric Starvo Galt after reading Ayn Rand's "Atlas Shrugged", and that this alias has nothing to do with any of the characters in Ian Fleming's books. Furthermore, these persons could say similarities do exist between James Earl Ray's family and the family of Eric Starnes as described on page 321 of "Atlas Shrugged." Confronted with the above-cited quotation from "Atlas Shrugged," some of these same persons undoubtedly would insist that FBI fugitive James Earl Ray (like Eric Starnes) has committed suicide. (On the other hand, significant differences can be pointed out between Eric Starnes and James Ray. For example, Eric Starnes is described as the youngest of the Starnes; whereas, James Earl Ray was the oldest child in his family.

Attached are lists of the names which appear in 14 of the 18 Ian Fleming books. The other four Ian Fleming books ("Thrilling Cities," "Octopussy," "More Gilt-Edged Bonds" and "Chitty-Chitty-Bang-Bang") are not available in Washington book stores, including stores dealing in paperback books. If desired, we will ask the New York Office to attempt to run down copies of these four books in that city.

By informal memorandum dated May 3, 1968, I furnished you lists of the names which appear in 14 of the 18 books written by Ian Fleming. My informal memorandum noted that we were unable to obtain copies of four of Fleming's books ("Thrilling Cities," "Octopussy," "More Gilt-Edged Bonds" and "Chitty Chitty Bang Bang") here in Washington--but that we would ask the New York Office to attempt to run down copies of them, if desired.

Pursuant to Mr. DeLoach's instructions, the New York Office was instructed on Saturday, May 4th, to attempt to find copies of the four Ian Fleming books cited above. The New York Office was able to locate three of these four books on Saturday, and they have been forwarded to the Bureau. The New York Office is still attempting to locate the fourth book ("More Gilt-Edged Bonds").

Attached are lists of the names which appear in Ian Fleming's books entitled "Thrilling Cities," "Octopussy," and "Chitty Chitty Bang Bang." A list of names appearing in "More Gilt-Edged Bonds" will be prepared as soon as the book is available.
