COMEY, Room 402, County smilding, Peoria, Illinois, a former United States Commissioner of the Southern District of Illinois, advised he, his wife, and daughter, age twelve, vacationed in New Orleans, Louisiana, during December, 1067, and were registered guests of the Provincial Motel, 1024 Chartres Street, New Orleans, Louisiana, for an eighted period between December 17 and December 24, 1967. He stated they are breakfast at the motel dining room but otherwise spent the remainder of the days sight-seeing in New Orleans, Louisiana. He selected the motel, which he described as a very sedate and quiet place, at the suggestion of the Chicago Motor Club, Peoria, Illinois.

Magistrate CONEY observed photographs of JAMES EARL RAY, FBI Number 405 942G, then stated he could recall nothing relating to this individual.

Mrs. ROBERT A. CONNY, 533 West Forrest Hill Avenue, Peoria, Illinois, viewed photographs of JAMES EARL RAY, FBI Number 405 9429, and she was questioned regarding her observation while a guest at the Provincial Notel, 1024 Chartres, New Orleans, Louisiana.

She could not identify the above photographs of RAY as any person she had observed while in the New Orleans, Louisiana, area during December, 1967.

She related her observations while a guest at the above motel between December 17-24, 1967. She recalled seeing a white sports automobile parked at the archway area of the motel which she stated was used for loading and unloading purposes only. She first observed this automobile about the time of her arrival at the motel between 3:00 and 5:00 P.M., Sunday, December 17, 1967.

Mrs. CONEY related this white automobile could have been a Mustang model car. She stated the automobile was definitely an American-made car. She recalled the auto because it was parked in the motel archway area on three or maybe four occasions, and she had to walk around the automobile to cross the archway area to the restaurant. She noted this car was a late model car that appeared to be waxed and extremely clean in appearance.

Mrs. CONEY stated her impressions of the activity in the area are vague; however, she associated three males and two females and two small children with the above automobile. She observed the occupants were neatly dressed in sports clothing and the adults appeared to be between thirty and forty years of age.

The two children appeared to be under ten years of age and she believed both to be girls. The women wore light colored slacks. The men and women both were neat in appearance and attractive. She paid particular attention

Enclosed for the Bureau are .380 bullet fired from a .380 Remington UMC Automatic, SN PA18949, and a .380 cartridge case fired from the same weapon.

The Bureau is requested to compare bullet with bullet forwarded by Atlanta in relet, which had been taken from the body of ROBERT JOSEPH DUNAWAY, FBI No. 841 310C.

The .380 Remington weapon was obtained by an official of the Atlanta Police Department (APD), from SAM BOMMARITO, Kingston, Tennessee. BOMMARITO claimed this weapon was registered in Michigan. BOMMARITO, when interviewed by Police officials of the APD, admitted ROBERT JOSEPH DUNAWAY had stayed at his home from approximately April 6, until approximately April 28, 1968. BOMMARITO claimed he had met DUNAWAY approximately one year before when DUNAWAY came to Kingston, Tennessee, and picked up SAM AGOSTA. AGOSTA at that time was evading service of a subpoena to testify before a State Grand Jury in Detroit concerning LCN activities.

The Bureau is also requested to compare bullet and cartridge with any bullets and cartridges in unsolved LCN murders on file.

The Director's Office advised General In estigative Division Duty Agent at 6:30 p.m., 5-16-68, that Mr. John M. Bowney, 2745 29th Street, Northwest, Apartment 216, telephone number Ap2-7945, had called and asked for the Director. Mr. Downey stated that he was a personal friend of the Director and Mr. Tolson. He was advised of the

Director's absence, at which time he furnished the following information.

Mr. Downey stated that while in the Town & Country Lounge of the Mayflower Hotel about five or six months ago a man sat next to him with his back to a post. Downey began talking to this person who identified himself as Fred Gable (phonetic). They had a couple of drinks and during the course of their conversation, Gable told him that he had just been released from prison. Downey then asked Gable how much money he had and Gable replied - \$20.00. Downey then asked why Gable was spending \$1.00 per drink if he only had \$20.00. Gable stated that he wanted to know how bartenders mixed drinks in high-class bars.

Downey continued, stating that he felt Gable had paid his debt to society and offered to buy him a meal and Gable accepted. After leaving the hotel, they stopped at a cafe on 16th and M Streets, bought two cups of coffee and for no reason at all, Gable said to Downey, "you're a copper" and said that he (Gable) had a gun in his pocket and if he (Downey) followed him, Gable would shoot him. Downey did not report the incident to the Metropolitan Police Department. Downey stated that he was thankful that he was not shot and has hesitated to tell anyone about this, thinking no one would believe him.

Mr. Downey stated that the purpose of the call was to advise the Director that he believes Gable is identical to the photographs of James Earl Ray and feels that Ray may possibly come back to Washington.
