A call was placed from Houston, Texas, to Bakersfield, California, number 805-323-2660, on 12/16/67.

Above number was disconnected on 2/15/68, and was formerly listed to C. E. HUGHETT, 3209 Dartmouth, Bakersfield.

On 5/16/68, Mrs. DON HUGHETT, 431 Highland, Oildale, California, advised that during December, 1967, 3209 Dartmouth, was occupied by FRANCINE METROVICH and that her brother-in-law C. E. HUGHETT was staying with FRANCINE during 1967, and allowed her to obtain a telephone in his name.

Mrs. HUGHETT indicated that C. E. HUGHETT was actually living with METROVICH out of wedlock and that METROVICH's character was very questionable.

Attempts to contact METROVICH, 3209 Dartmouth, Bakersfield, California, on 5/16/68, were negative.

On 5/16/68, C. E. HUGHETT, telephone number 325-2950 advised that he dated FRANCINE METROVICH during the latter part of 1967, and allowed her to obtain a telephone in his name. On May 8, 1968, SA ROBERT A. QUAINANCE displayed to Mr. ARTHUR LARIMER, Postmaster, U. S. Post Office, Sandusky, Ohio, the unsigned printed note and envelopes addressed to "Chief of Police, Memphis, Tenn.", and "Postmaster, Pelee Island, Ontario".

Mr. LARIMER advised that although the identity of the author was unknown to him he noted the apparent shaky printing, and suggested that it might be the effort of an elderly person. He suggested an inquiry at the old Soldiers and Sailors Home, Sandusky, might be productive.

On May 9, 1968, SA ROBERT A. QUAINANCE contacted Mr. MICHAEL KRESTEL, Assistant Reeve, Pelee Island, Ontario, Canada, in the absence of the Reeve, Mr. CHARLES WALLACE, and the Constable, Mr. ZANE HOOKER. Mr. KRESTEL questioned the Postmaster, Mr. DONALD GOW, who advised that instant note, .35 change, and cover envelopes, were received at the post office on approximately April 24, 1968. He said that he opened the envelope addressed to him. He discovered the inner envelope already opened, which he believes may have been done accidentally by him in opening the outer envelope. He recalled the change and note, however, were lying loose in the outer envelope. He said he did not know what disposition to make of the contents and finally asked Mr. WALLACE, the Reeve, for advice. He stated it was the suggestion of Mr. WALLACE that these items be mailed to the FBI, Federal Building, Sandusky. He was unable to suggest any suspect as the author of instant note.

On May 9, 1968, Mr. ROBERT BORDERS, Registrar, Old Soldiers and Sailors Home, Columbus Avenue, Sandusky, examined instant note and envelopes and advised SA ROBERT A. QUAINANCE he suspected them to be the work of a resident,

CHARLES MANN WITZLER: He said WITZLER is a prolific letter writer and a chronic complainer who frequently writes to the Governor and various agencies complaining about conditions at the home.

He advised that records indicate WITZLER was born on [redacted] at Perrysburg, Ohio, served in the U. S. Army, Quartermaster Corps., from July 29, 1942, until November 6, 1944, when he received an honorable discharge at Fort Hayes, Columbus, Ohio, as a private, ASN 35333648. He furnished WITZLER's V A Claim Number as 17-306-751, and his Social Security Number as [redacted]. He said WITZLER arrived at the Home on July 19, 1962. He added that WITZLER would not be available for interview until May 10, 1968.

On May 10, 1968, SA ROBERT A. QUAINANCE confronted CHARLES MANN WITZLER with instant note and envelopes. He admitted being the author. He said he could offer no logical reason for his writing the note and said he could only suggest that he must have been drinking at the time. He stated it was not his intention to burden or harass the Memphis, Tennessee Police Department, FBI, or any other law enforcement agency by his action.

He said his reason for enclosing \$.35 with the note was to include \$.10 for air mail postage from Pelee Island to Memphis, Tennessee; he said he visits Pelee Island a few times each summer and has bought postage at the post office there. He said he sent his note via Pelee Island simply to give the postmaster a little business.

He was admonished by SA QUAINANCE for the consequences of his action, the wasted time and money that could have been spent on other matters. He was also admonished by Mr. BORDERS, and threatened with possible expulsion if he should repeat this misconduct.

Mr. WITZLER apologized for his action and promised to refrain from any such conduct in the future.

He admitted his note intended reference to the slaying of MARTIN LUTHER KING, however, he denied sympathy for the assassination. He said he has no knowledge of JAMES EARL RAY or his whereabouts.
