This case involves the murder of Martin Luther King, Jr.

Local Judge John C. Casey, St. Louis sentenced Ray to 20 years in 1959 for armed robbery. A motion to set aside the conviction was filed before Ray's escape and is still pending. Judge Casey believes in view of recent Supreme Court decisions Ray would stand a good chance of reversing his conviction and contemplates filing order on 5/24/68 for Ray to appear by 6/3/68 or his action will be dismissed.

Judge Casey has asked Bureau advice as to whether he should delay until after Poor Peoples Campaign as he feels publicity of his order could cause widespread disorder. Casey is being advised we cannot advise him but if he feels publicizing his order could cause disturbance he should take necessary steps to alert law enforcement agencies after his order is entered and before it is publicized. Department being advised.

BRADLEY MAY HAVE RELATIONS IN TULSA. BRADLEY INDICATED MIGHT BE PASSING THROUGH DENVER SOMETIME IN NEAR FUTURE. ASKED BASINGER IF BASINGER SAW HIM ON CBS [✓]TV AND INDICATED THAT HE WAS ONE OF THOSE INDICTED BY DISTRICT ATTORNEY GARRISON, NEW ORLEANS, INVOLVED IN KENNEDY ASSASSINATION CONSPIRACY. COMMENTED TO BASINGER "WE FAMOUS PEOPLE RUN TOGETHER," AND STATED THAT HE HAD BEEN LIVING IN TULSA WITH ERIC GALT FOR ABOUT A WEEK. BASINGER ASKED WHO GALT WAS AND BRADLEY ASKED BASINGER IF HE HAD HEARD OF JAMES RAY. WHEN BASINGER STATED HE HAD NOT BRADLEY SAID THAT HE WAS THE ONE WHO "KNOCKED OVER KING, JR." ASSASSINATION OF MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

Markin

On May 8, 1968, the body of an unknown deceased was found partially buried in a grave near Mahanoy City, Pennsylvania. A powder believed to be lime was also in the grave. The body was clothed only in shorts and an undershirt. The examining pathologist found three bullet holes in the chest cavity, body was in advanced state of decay, and pathologist stated in his opinion the body had been in the grave for six months.

On May 17, 1968, Dr. Wilton M. Krogman, archeologist, University of Pennsylvania, examined the body and stated that in his opinion the body had been in the grave only from four to six weeks and is of the opinion that the body is that of a middle-aged white male, five feet nine inches to six feet one inch in height, muscular build, weighing about 200 pounds, and descendant of Northern Italy or Central Europe.

According to the examination, there is no possibility of fingerprints being obtained, teeth in the upper jaw are missing or dislodged, but teeth in the lower jaw are intact and contain several fillings. Certain remains of the body are presently in possession of Pennsylvania State Police, Reading, Pennsylvania.

Although there is no indication that this unknown body is that of subject James Earl Ray, a comparison of the dental charts of Ray with the remains of the deceased is presently being conducted by the Pennsylvania State authorities.

On 5-8-68, a body of an unknown deceased clothed only in shorts and an undershirt was found partially buried in a grave near Mahanoy City, Pennsylvania. A powder believed to be lime was also found in the grave. The examining pathologist found three bullet holes in chest cavity and body in advanced state of decay. No possibility of fingerprints being obtained and pathologist stated he is of opinion body had been in grave for six months.

On 5-17-68, Dr. Wilton M. Krogman, archeologist, University of Pennsylvania, examined the body and stated he is of the opinion body in grave only four to six weeks and is also of the opinion the body is that of a middle-aged white male, five feet nine inches to six feet one inches in height, muscular build, 200 pounds, descendant of Northern Italy or Central Europe. The teeth in upper jaw missing or dislodged but teeth in lower jaw intact and contain several fillings. The lower jaw is in possession of Pennsylvania State Police who are retaining. Our Philadelphia Office suggested that the teeth of this unknown deceased be compared with dental record of James Earl Ray, the subject in the King assassination. Dental records as well as photographs of cavities of the skull concerning James Earl Ray, were obtained from the Missouri State Penitentiary and have been forwarded to our Philadelphia Office. Philadelphia has turned these records over to the Pennsylvania State Police and they are in the process of comparing these records with the remains of the unknown deceased. It is anticipated that it will take several days to complete the examination.

This letter is prepared in accordance with instructions of Mr. DeLoach, Assistant to the Director, as a result of his conference with the Attorney General on May 24, 1968. The Attorney General made inquiry concerning the unknown body recently recovered in Pennsylvania, and he was advised that the information would be forwarded to him.
