COMPARISON OF FINGERPRINTS
OF JAMES EARL RAY WITH
UNIDENTIFIED LATENT FINGERPRINTS
BY LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES

On April 30, 1968, the below-listed individuals advised that they would compare the fingerprints of JAMES EARL RAY with the unidentified latent fingerprints maintained in the files of their respective offices in an effort to ascertain if any of the unidentified latent fingerprints belonged to JAMES EARL RAY:

Detective V. R. FRANCO, Identification Division, El Paso Police Department, El Paso, Texas, contacted by SA HARREL LEON DAVIS.

Lieutenant ROGER MEURER, Midland Police Department, Midland, Texas, contacted by SA JOHN J. GORMAN.

Captain BYRON HAWTHORNE, Odessa Police Department, Odessa, Texas, contacted by SA PAUL D. SJODAL.

On April 30, 1968, Detective V. R. FRANCO, El Paso Police Department, supra, and on May 3, 1968, Lieutenant ROGER MEURER, Midland Police Department, and Captain BYRON HAWTHORNE, Odessa Police Department, both supra, advised the contacting agents that the comparison of the fingerprints of JAMES EARL RAY with unidentified latent fingerprints maintained in their respective files had been completed and that they had been unable to match RAY's prints with any of these unidentified latent fingerprints.

J. R. KELLER, REPORTED ASSOCIATE OF JAMES EARL RAY AT LEAVENWORTH

AT ANTHONY, TEXAS

On April 30, 1968, Mr. W. R. BEASLEY, Supervisor, La Tuna Federal Correctional Institution, advised SA DUANE THOMAS STEWART as follows:

Two individuals by the name of JOHN R. KELLER have been released from the Federal Correctional Institution in Florence, Arizona, in the past and he did not know which one was identical with J. R. KELLER, Leavenworth Prison Number 72614-L. JOHN R. KELLER, Florence Correctional Institution Number 7574, was released from Florence in about 1962 and his record was sent to the Federal Records Center, Denver, Colorado, in Agency Container Number 12.

JOHN R. KELLER, Florence Correctional Institution Number 4977, was released from Morence in 1957 and his record was transferred in 1963 to the Federal Records Center, Bell, California, Container Number 83449, Agency Container Number 5, Accession Number 64-A-61. ROBERT DALE PORTER, ACQUAINTANCE OF JAMES EARL RAY AT THE MISSOURI STATE PENITENTIARY

AT VAN HORN, TEXAS

On April 30, 1968, Sheriff ORVAL CAPEHARY, Culberson County Sheriff's Office, telephonically advised SA RICHARD H. PICKEN as follows:

He checked the records of the Clark Hotel, Van Horn, on April 30, 1968, at which time it was determined that one ROBERT DALE PCRTER, white, male, American, age about 40, height about 6', weight about 175 pounds, arrived on foot at the Clark Hotel at about 7:00 p.m. on April 3, 1968. PORTER rented Room 7, paid \$2 for the room, and stated to the clerk at the Clark Hotel that \$2 was all the money that he had. PORTER spent the night in Room 7, listing the address of 1032 East Balmer, Waverly, Iowa. was not known to have made any telephone calls while at the Clark Hotel, and did not inquire as to where he could make a telephone call away from the hotel. PORTER was alone and had no visitors while at the hotel. PORTER left the hotel at about 10:00 a.m. on April 4, 1968, was on foot, but his direction of departure was not known by the employees of the hotel.

FRANK BRICKLEY, CHATTANOOGA, TENNESSEE, ALLEGEDLY INVOLVED WITH JAMES EARL RAY

AT EL PASO, TEXAS

On May 21, 1938, Mr. G. A. LICON, Operations Supervisor, Greyhound Bus Lines, 212 San Francisco Street, was furnished a photograph of FRANK WILLIAM BRICKLEY, FBI Number 197796C, by SA DAVID J. REID, at which time he advised that the photograph would be displayed to the employees at the bus depot in an effort to ascertain if any of the employees recalled seeing FRANK WILLIAM BRICKLEY at the bus depot on about April 8 or 9, 1968.

On May 22, 1968, Mr. L. I. DAVIS, Cashier, Greyhound Bus Lines, 212 San Francisco Street, advised SA REID that the photograph of FRANK WILLIAM BRICKLEY had been displayed to the employees of the bus depot and that none of the employees recalled having seen FRANK WILLIAM BRICKLEY at the bus depot on about April 8 or 9, 1968, or at any time in the past.

SUSPECT - UNIDENTIFIED MAN OBSERVED ON HIGHWAY NEAR EL PASO, TEXAS, ON APRIL 9, 1968, WHO RESEMBLED SKETCH OF THE UNKNOWN SUBJECT

AT CLINT, TEXAS

On April 9, 1968, at approximately 6:00 p.m., Mrs. RUTH RETZOLKA, Route 80, telephonically advised Security Patrol Clerk LEROY M. TEITSWORTH that she had seen a man on Interstate Highway 10 on the outskirts of El Paso who resembled the sketch of the unknown subject.

The following investigation was conducted by SA FRANCIS J. PRASEK in an effort to locate and interview Mrs. RETZOLKA, supra:

On April 11, 1968, the telephone directories for Clint, Fabens, and El Paso, all Texas, were reviewed and no listing was located for anyone by the name of RETZOLKA.

The names on the mailboxes along Highway 80 en route from El Paso to Clint and Fabens, Texas, were checked and no mailbox was located under the name of RETZOLKA.

Additional inquiries were made in Clint and Fabens, Texas, but no information was developed regarding the whereabouts of Mrs. RETZOLKA.

SUSPECT - UNIDENTIFIED MAN OBSERVED ON HIGHWAY HEADED FOR NEW MEXICO ON APRIL 18, 1968, WHO STRONGLY RESEMBLED ERIC STARVO GALT

AT EL PASO, TEXAS

On April 18, 1968, at about 1:30 p.m., Mr. MOSE MATHEWS, 1113 Cuba Street, telephonically advised ASAC JAY COCHRAN, Jr., as follows:

MATHEWS had just seen a red Chevrolet convertible, 1963 or 1964, bearing Alabama license plates number 19-96, which was proceeding west on Interstate Highway 10 toward New Mexico. MATHEWS followed this automobile for some distance in El Paso and observed that it was occupied by two men, the driver of which "strongly resembled" suspect ERIC STARVO GALT. MATHEWS had seen the photograph of GALT in the "El Paso Times" newspaper that morning along with a description of GALT and the press release issued by the Federal Bureau of Investigation. He based his identification of the individual in the above-mentioned automobile as strongly resembling GALT on the information which had appeared in the newspaper. MATHEWS was unable to obtain the complete license number of the automobile.

SUSPECT - UNIDENTIFIED MAN AT THE PARADISE LOUNGE, EL PASO, TEXAS, APRIL 21, 1968, WHO RESEMBLED THE PHOTOGRAPH OF JAMES EARL RAY

AT EL PASO, TEXAS

On April 21, 1968, at 8:20 p.m., Security Patrol Clerk RICHARD P. CALHOUN received an anonymous telephone call at the Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The caller advised that there was a man at the Paradise Lounge, Mesa and Doniphan Streets, El Paso, at that time who resembled the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY.

On April 21, 1968, at 8:40 p.m., SA's FRANCIS J. PRASEK and DAVID J. REID entered the Paradise Lounge, supra and observed the persons in the lounge. No one was seen in the lounge between 8:40 p.m. and 9:45 p.m. who resembled JAMES EARL RAY.

SUSPECT - UNIDENTIFIED MAN IN THE AZTEC BAR, EL PASO, TEXAS, ON APRIL 23, 1968, WHO RESEMBLED ERIC STARVO GALT

AT EL PASO, TEXAS

On April 23, 1968, at approximately 8:00 a.m., Assistant Chief Clerk WESLEY P. SHAVER received a telephone call from an individual who identified himself as "PHILLIP WHITE". This individual stated that about a half hour before a man resembling ERIC STARVO GALT had been in the Aztec Bar, 500 South Stanton Street, El Paso.

On April 23, 1968, ROSA ONTIVEROS, Barmaid, Aztec Bar, supra, advised SA's FRANCIS J. PRASEK and WALLACE A. CROSSMON that she was alone in the bar, that no customers had been in the bar that morning, that no one had used the pay telephone in the bar, and that she did not know anyone by the name of PHILLIP WHITE.

After viewing a photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT, she said that the individual in the photograph did not resemble anyone whomshe knew.

SUSPECT - LON R. HUMMEL

AT EL PASO, TEXAS

On April 23, 1968, Mrs. DORRIS SHINNAUT, El Paso County Tax Office, made available to SA WALLACE A. CROSSMON the records regarding the 1968 Texas licenses on file in her office. It was ascertained that the 1968 Texas license CLB 94 was registered to LON R. HUMMEL, 5939 Falcon Street, El Paso, Texas.

The 1967 El Paso City Directory reflected that the Crown Plastic Products, Inc., was located at 5939 Falcon Street, El Paso.

On April 24, 1968, Mrs. LEE NOLAN, President, Crown Plastic Products, Inc., advised SA DAVID J. REID as follows:

LON R. HUMMEL, son of a former college classmate of Mrs. NOLAN in Iowa, was employed by Crown Plastic Products, Inc., from March, 1967, to April 3, 1968. HUMMEL departed from El Paso, Texas, on April 6, 1968, en route to Winslow, Arizona, where he planned to contact JOHN TATE, Jr., 113 Elm Street, Apartment B, Winslow. HUMMEL planned to find work with TATE in the lumber business. HUMMEL was driving his white Ford Bronco with 1968 Texas license plates when he departed from El Paso.

HUMMEL did not resemble JAMES EARL RAY, according to Mrs. NOLAN, who described HUMMEL as follows:

Mrs. NOLAN had no reason to believe that anything had happened to LON R. HUMMEL, and had no reason to believe that anyone had taken his automobile or his identification papers away from him.

SUSPECT - ERIC RAY, ALSO KNOWN AS EARL RAY, FRIEND OF SHELBY GEAN BALDRIDGE

AT EL PASO, TEXAS

On April 25, 1968, Sergeant ELBERT BALDRIDGE, 4808 Tetons Street, telephonically advised SA DAVID J. REID as follows:

BALDRIDGE had not heard from his wife, SHELBY GEAN BALDRIDGE, since she advised him by telephone on March 31, 1968, that she was leaving Fayetteville, North Carolina, on April 1, 1968, with their two children and would arrive in El Paso, Texas, on April 3, 1968. BALDRIDGE had arranged a reconciliation with his wife, who had been living apart from him since November, 1967, and his wife had agreed to return to him with their two children. BALDRIDGE had maintained continuous contact with his in-laws, namely Mr. and Mrs. BILLY FAUCETT, Box 240, Route 1, Clarksville, Virginia, and had been advised by them that they had not seen BALDRIDGE's wife and children. BALDRIDGE received a letter from his wife on April 25, 1968, wherein she stated that she was staying with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. FAUCETT, and wanted BALDRIDGE to send her money in care of her aunt, RUTH JAMES, Calhoun, Georgia. The letter was postmarked April 22, 1968, at Saltville, Virginia. BALDRIDGE just learned that his wife had lived with another man while BALDRIDGE was in Viet Nam in 1966 and 1967, and BALDRIDGE planned to divorce his wife. BALDRIDGE was of the opinion that his wife probably went off with some man. BALDRIDGE recalled that he and his wife planned a trip to Tampa, Florida, in 1964, which was called off due to his transfer overseas. SHELBY GEAN BALDRIDGE told Sergeant BALDRIDGE

at that time that she might have a chance to see a friend named EARL if they went to Florida. BALDRIDGE subsequently questioned his wife more thoroughly regarding this, at which time his wife said that, after graduating from high school in 1957, she and her cousin, PATSY, made a trip to Florida, at which time she met one ERIC RAY, whom she called EARL. She claimed that EARL was much older than sing.

SHELBY GEAN BALDRIDGE was not known to have ever corresponded with EARL. BALDRIDGE wondered if his wife was possibly in contact with JAMES EARL RAY, who was possibly identical with the ERIC RAY she met in Florida.

On April 26, 1968, Sergeant ELBERT BALDRIDGE, supra, advised SA REID as follows:

BALDRIDGE had no way of determining if the information furnished him by his wife regarding ERIC RAY, also known as EARL RAY, had any basis in fact. BALDRIDGE never discussed this matter with anyone other than his wife, and he had no confirming information regarding ERIC RAY or his wife's contact with ERIC RAY. His wife never said anything to him about ERIC RAY prior to their planned trip to Florida in 1964, and gave no indication that she had ever corresponded or maintained contact with ERIC RAY subsequent to 1957. If this were the case, his wife would have no way of knowing if ERIC RAY was still residing in Florida as of 1964.

On May 10, 1968, Sergeant BALDRIDGE advised SA REID as follows:

His wife, SHELBY GEAN BALDRIDGE, was in El Paso from May 3 to May 6, 1968, and then departed for the home of the parents of DANIEL C. COLLEY, Airman Third Class, United States Air Force, in Bristol, Tennessee, where she planned to reside. COLLEY is the man his wife lived with

while BALDRIDGE was in Viet Nam, and his wife is now four months pregnant by COLLEY. COLLEY is currently stationed at Pope Air Force Base, Fayetteville, North Carolina. BALDRIDGE had few words with his wife during the period from May 3 through 6, 1968, when she was in El Paso, and he did not question her regarding ERIC RAY, mentioned above.

SUSPECT - PASSENGER RESEMBLING JAMES EARL RAY ON AMERICAN AIRLINES FLIGHT 338

AT EL PASO, TEXAS

The following investigation was conducted by SA WALLACE A. CROSSMON on May 1, 1968, in an effort to identify a passenger by the hame of Mr. LAW, Area Code 915, telephone number 568-4975:

It was determined that the above-mentioned telephone number was that of the United States Army Base, Fort Bliss, Texas, and that "Mr. LAW" was Specialist Fourth Class DOUGLAS L. LAW, RA 13 650 795, who was attached to Medical Company 3414, William Beaumont General Hospital, Fort Bliss, Texas.

On May 1, 1968, Specialist Fourth Class LAW advised that he had traveled from Dallas, Texas, to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on April 6, 1968, aboard American Airlines Flight Number 338. He sat in the rear of the airplane on the left side in a seat on the aisle.

After viewing a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY, LAW stated that he did not recall seeing JAMES EARL RAY or anyone who looked like RAY while he was aboard American Airlines Flight 338. LAW noted that he was under the weather" during the flight and, therefore, was not too alert.

The following investigation was conducted by SA CROSSMON on May 1, 1963, in an effort to identify a passenger by the name of Mr. REID, Area Code 915, telephone number 568-1146:

It was determined that telephone number 568-1146 was the telephone number of the Airlines Traffic Office at Fort Bliss, Texas.

Mrs. JODY FARMER, Ticket Salesman, Airlines Traffic Office, Fort Bliss, made available the records of her office having to do with passengers who purchased tickets at that office for use on April 6, 1968. These records contained the information that one Private P. I. REID had traveled on American Airlines Flight Number 82 from El Paso, Texas, to Dallas, Texas, and on American Airlines Flight Number 338 from Dallas, Texas, to Baltimore, Maryland, on April 6, 1968.

Mrs. ANN CAMERANO, Base Locator Section, Army Training Command, Fort Bliss, advised that Private PAUL I. REID, RA 16 997 675, had been transferred from Fort Bliss, Texas, to the Aberdeen Proving Grounds, Baltimore, Maryland, and was due to arrive there on April 7, 1968. She said that Private REID was assigned to the USAOC&S, Aberdeen Proving Grounds.

The following investigation was conducted by SA FREDERICK A. JOHNS in an effort to identify a passenger by the name of Mrs. MORRISON, Area Code 915, telephone number 678-1738:

On May 1, 1968, the above-mentioned telephone number was dialed, at which time Mr. D. A. DepuE answered the telephone and advised SA JOHNS as follows:

This telephone number was that of the Family Housing Management of White Sands Missile Range, New Mexico. This office handles some 800 housing units at White Sands Missile Range, and takes care of rental, repair, and maintenance matters for these housing units.

SUSPECT - CARL RAY, ALLEGEDLY OF PECOS, TEXAS

AT PECOS, TEXAS

On May 3, 1968, Deputy Sheriff ROBERT PHELPS, Reeves County Sheriff's Office, advised SA RICHARD H. PICKEN as follows:

There are no Rural Routes cut of Pecos, and there is no such Post Office box as 868, Pecos. No record is located in the files of the Pecos Police Department or the Reeves County Sheriff's Office, as well as the Retail Merchants Credit Bureau, regarding anyone by the name of CARL RAY or the Ray Land and Cattle Company. The Pecos Telephone Directory and Pecos City Directory were checked for Pecos and the small towns surrounding Pecos, and no record was located for anyone by the name C. RAY, CARL RAY, or the Ray Land and Cattle Company.

SUSPECT - WILLIAM A. MARSHALL

AT EL PASO, TEXAS

On May 16, 1968, Miss SARAH BROWN, Identification Division, El Paso Police Department, and Deputy Sheriff PAUL SORTOR, El Paso County Sheriff's Office, were both advised by SA DAVID J. REID, that UNKNOWN SUBJECT, also known as WILLIAM A. MARSHALL, described as white, male, American, age 40 to 45, height 5'9", 165 to 180 pounds, dark hair, fair to medium complexion, driving 1967 Plymouth Fury III, convertible, gold in color with black top, California license UTW 102, Vehicle Identification Number PM 27 F 74238208, was wanted for questioning by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and that no warrant had been issued for the arrest of this individual.

Miss BROWN advised that an All Points Bulletin would be issued for this individual and that the All Points Bulletin would be received by the Texas Department of Public Safety in El Paso for relay to its various units.

On May 28, 1968, the below-listed individuals were advised by SA DAVID J. REID that WILLIAM A. MARSHALL was no longer wanted for questioning by the Federal Bureau of Investigation:

AT EL PASO, TEXAS

On May 16, 1968, MARY LOU CAULLER and ROSE MARY SCHIFFINO, Tellers, El Paso Federal Savings and Loan Association, 517 North Kansas Street, were displayed photographs of JAMES EARL RAY by SA ROBERT R. FOLTZ. These two individuals advised that RAY was not identical with the unknown subject who robbed the El Paso Federal Savings and Loan Association in El Paso on September 1, 1967.

STOPS PLACED REGARDING JAMES EARL RAY, ALSO KNOWN AS.

On April 11, 1968, the below-listed individuals were advised that ERIC STARVO GALT was wanted for questioning by the Federal Bureau of Investigation:

William A. Marshall is a Ray look-alike suspect. He obtained a 1967 Plymouth on 5/14/68 and this vehicle was recovered on 5/28/68 Covina, California. Car was involved in accident with one Allen Krause, Azzusa, California, who stated driver of Plymouth identified himself as W. L. DeLuca and had given check to re-emburse him for damages. This check was found to have been stolen at Huntington Beach, California. Krause was shown photograph of Ray and stated driver of Plymouth not identical. It is not known whether DeLuca's description approximates Marshall's and Los Angeles being instructed to run out loose ends.

Allen Thompson, Manager of St. Francis Hotel in Los Angeles, which was former residence of subject, advised an unnamed individual recently inquired about the relationship between Ray and one James Hardin. Thompson recalls during period 3/1-17/68, while operating switchboard, an individual called Ray and left message to call James C. Hardin collect. Calls were subsequently received from this individual reportedly from Atlanta and New Orleans. Later a person identifying himself as James C. Hardin came to hotel during period 3/1-17/68.

Thompson advised that the individual who brought Hardin to his attention does not wish to identify himself as he may be subject of an outstanding warrant. Thompson refuses to identify this individual. Los Angeles advises that Thompson drinks to excess and Los Angeles believes he should be brought before a Federal Grand Jury in Los Angeles to ascertain identity of person who prompted his memory.

Los Angeles being requested to further pursue this through intense interview and other investigative avenues of approach.
