WILHOIT stated his department searches and files the drivers license applications or renewals received from all of the 120 counties in the state as they are received in Frankfort. At the present time all of the April, 1968, applications and renewals have been filed and the department is working on the group received in the Bureau as late as May 17, 1968. WILHOIT also stated that the applications for new drivers licenses are not filed separate from the renewals and there is a standard card utilized through the service with check marks appearing thereon where the applicant for a driver's license checks whether his request is for a new license or for a renewal. It was only WILHOIT's estimate, but he stated that applicants for new licenses in the state total approximately 5,000 monthly.

WILHOIT added that it would be a physical impossibility to check these drivers license records during a usual work day because of other commitments in the department, that his office is presently understaffed and if the work was to be done, in searching these 2 million records, it would have to be done after hours and time and a half overtime would have to be paid all of the employees. WILHOIT stated that it was only a rough estimate, but he believed the cost of searching these records would run about four cents a file. There is no state appropriation to meet this expense. With regard to a team of FBI Agents searching these records, WILHOIT stated that it would not be desirable to have any outsiders to go through the Bureau's records, no matter how responsible they might be. He pointed out that the Department of Public Safety has a responsibility to the public in reporting to the different examining stations prior traffic offenses for drivers license applicants and if one of these files on an offender was misplaced or misfiled and the offender was issued a legitimate driver's license and then became involved in a serious accident, the State of Kentucky would be liable from a civil standpoint for not identifying the applicant as a prior offender.

WILHOIT advised that when any applicant for a new license in the State of Kentucky makes an application, he would do so through any of the 120 counties in the state and would be required to take a written examination and even a driver's test regardless of whether he was licensed in another state. WILHOIT stated that these driver's tests are administered by examiners of the Kentucky State Police assigned to each of the counties in the state and as a practical manner in attempting to locate subject, JAMES EARL RAY, the individual license examinars Gould be contacted and shown the available photographs

of RAY to determine if he applied for a driver's license in the state.

In view of the above, UACB, the Louisville Office will contact each individual drivers license examiner in each of the 120 counties displaying and leaving wanted flyers on the subject with these examiners requesting that they be on the alert for any information indicating possible application for driver's license on the part of RAY. Efforts will be made at the same time to determine if anyone answering the description of RAY has made application during April and May of this year.

William A Marshall, who is a James Earl Ray look-a-like suspect, signed an escrow contract to purchase a home at Bonita, California, on 5-14-68, for \$51,000. He gave a promisory-type check for \$5,000 and indicated he had a \$65,000 certified check in his hotel room. Marshall claimed to be employed by International Harvester Company, Bloomington, Illinois, and recently transferred to the San Diego area. On 5-14-68, he attempted to purchase a 1967 Plymouth at Chula Vista, California, displaying the escrow contract. An automobile salesman gave the keys of the vehicle to Marshall who then drove off in the car. Marshall did not return the vehicle and as a result thereof, a description of the vehicle and of Marshall was placed in an all-points bulletin by California authorities. Investigation indicated that the financial claims and maneuvers were fictitious and fraudulent.

On 5-28-68, the Covina, California, Police Department advised our Los Angeles Office that the Plymouth stolen in Chula Vista, California, had been recovered abandoned in Covina on 5-28-68, and had apparently been abandoned for several days. The Covina Police Department reported that the 1967 Plymouth had been involved in an accident with a car driven by one Allen Krause, Azusa, California, who stated the driver of the Plymouth identified himself as W. L. DeLuca and had given a check to reimburse him for damages. This check was found to have been stolen at Huntington Beach, California. Krause was shown a photograph of subject Ray and he stated that the driver of the Plymouth was not identical with Ray.

The Covina, California, Police Department suspects that William A. Marshall is responsible for five armed robberies of real-estate agents in the Chula Vista area. Person of Marshall's description had contacted reads estate agents about home purchase as pretext before robbing them.

Memorandum to Mr. DeLoach RE: MURKIN

Mrs. William Lawrence DeLuca, Huntington Beach, California, advised that on 5-15-68, a man (generally fitting previous description of William A. Marshall) driving a gold and black car (same color as stolen 1967 Plymouth) came to her home in response to a sign in front indicating it was for sale by owner. This man indicated he was interested in buying the home and Mrs. DeLuca left him in her living room to arrange for a later appointment. She was gone for approximately ten minutes and when she returned, the man indicated he would obtain \$500 in cash and return the following day to handle details. After this man left, Mrs. DeLuca discovered her checkbook and numerous credit and identification cards as well as her driver's license had been taken from her purse which had been in the living room. Several of the items stolen from Mrs. DeLuca have been recovered.

We are continuing investigation to determine if subject Ray is involved in this matter in view of the fact that Mrs. DeLuca examined photograph of James Earl Ray and indicated photograph somewhat resembled man who stole her identification but could not make any positive identification, and also that other individuals stated that James Earl Ray resembled person known as William A. Marshall.

Allen Thompson, manager of the St. Francis Hotel, Los Angeles, California, which is a former residence of subject Ray, advised an individual who he knows as "Fitz" recently inquired about the relationship between Ray and one James Hardin. Thompson recalls during period of March 1 through March 17, 1968, while he was operating the switchboard at the hotel, an individual called for Ray and left a message for him to call James Hardin collect. According to Thompson, calls were subsequently received from this individual from Atlanta and New Orleans. Thompson advised that later a person identifying himself as James C. Hardin came to the hotel during the period March 1 through March 17, 1968.

Thompson reported that "Fitz" may be the subject of an outstanding warrant, and that he has seen Fitz on an infrequent basis in the vicinity of Hollywood and Western area, Los Angeles, during the past six months. Thompson advised he has no knowledge of associates of "Fitz," his residence past or present, his automobile, or his employment, if any. Thompson said sometime after the first of the year he believes he expelled "Fitz" and another Caucasian male from the parking lot of the St. Francis Hotel where they were sleeping in an automobile. Thompson said that whenever and wherever he observes Fitz, he will immediately notify the FBI. We are thoroughly checking this matter out.

Memorandum to Mr. DeLoach RE: MURKIN

The Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) have been conducting an examination of Canadian passports issued to individuals since April 23, 1967 (date of subject's escape from Missouri State Penitentiary) in an attempt to locate our subject James Earl Ray. The RCMP advised our Legal Attache in Ottawa, Canada, that Canadian passport number was issued to an individual by the name of Ramon George Sneyd on April 24, 1968, at Ottawa and the photograph in the file is very definitely similar to Ray, and there is a good probability it is a photograph of Ray.

Sneyd's application for passport was filed on his behalf by the Kennedy Travel Bureau, Toronto, Canada, and the purpose for the passport was for Sneyd to fly to London, England, on May 6, 1968, by way of British Overseas Airline Company and return to Canada on May 21, 1968. Sneyd filed an affidavit in lieu of listing a guarantor as he had been in Toronto three weeks and did not know a guarantor. He also listed as a friend Paul Bridgman, Toronto, Canada. (The RCMP has not been able to locate Bridgman to date.)

The address of 968 Dundad Street, Toronto, Canada, as listed by Sneyd is a Chinese rooming house and investigation there by the RCMP has established that Sneyd arrived there on April 19, 1968, and roomed there for three weeks.

Our records indicate that one Paul Osborn Bridgeman was fingerprinted by the Department of Correction, Jefferson City, Missouri, on April 23, 1965, on a robbery charge. Bridgeman received a five-year sentence which was commuted on January 16, 1968.\* It is to be noted that subject James Earl Ray was confined to the Missouri State Penitentiary from 1959 to April 23, 1967.

The RCMP are conducting extensive investigation and are going all out in this matter to determine if subject James Earl Ray and Ramon George Sneyd are identical. Our Legal Attache in London has been instructed to check records of British Overseas Airline Company in a most discreet manner.


