STEPHENS, Montgomery, contacted Mrs. GAYNOR TURNER, head of the IBM Section, Drivers License Division, Alabama Department of Public Safety, who advised that new drivers license applications for Alabama total approximately 10,000 each month. She said that all the April applications will be placed on IBM cards by June 1, 1968, or possibly a little earlier, as the office is currently running three or four weeks behind.

It is noted that referenced radiogram instructed that all drivers license applications be checked for April and May 1968 concerning all male Caucasians over 30 years of age and under 55.

Through the cooperation of Captain T. L. PAYNE, Drivers License Division, Alabama Department of Public Safety, Montgomery, Alabama, records of new drivers licenses issued

since 4/1/68 were reviewed on 5/27-28/68 by SA B. TIM MC COY, and copies of the IBM cards for all applicable new license holders were obtained. Each card reflects a physical description and name and address of the licensee. The applications for license which are available, if necessary, contain additional data such as employment and signature of the licensee.

On the dates in question, it was estimated that the license applications available for review cover the period April 1, 1968, through May 16, 1968. It was stated that the applications for the remaining portion of May would be available later in June 1968.

A total of 205 cards within the Mobile Division territory was furnished concerning new licensees fitting the guideline. A total of 289 cards for licensees residing in the Birmingham Division territory was furnished, and these cards are enclosed herewith for Birmingham.

Mobile is proceeding to check out the 205 individuals in line with instructions in referenced radiogram. It is suggested that Birmingham likewise check out the ones in the Birmingham territory.

Further contact is being maintained with Mrs. TURNER of the Drivers License Division, Department of Public Safety, Montgomery, Alabama, and when the cards are available for the new licensees for the latter part of May 1968, these cards will be obtained and those residing in Birmingham territory will be furnished Birmingham.

Investigation conducted in Seattle and Spokane, Washington, at the Salvation Army and other shelters for transients, failed to disclose any information concerning HARRY CONNER or his two companions, FABER OLSEN and WILLIAM MALLET. Stops were placed with each of these places so the FBI would be notified if any of these three men showed up.

He stated cooperation with regard to completing a TCR-1 Form is for the most part voluntary on the part of the banks. The regulations regarding the TCR-1's completion are handled by the Comptroller of Currency and he pointed out that most banks do not follow these regulations to the letter.

PERRY stated he was specifically prohibited by Statute from disclosing information from the TCR-1 Form, and that he would not be able to disclose this information without the specific permission of the Commissioner of IRS.

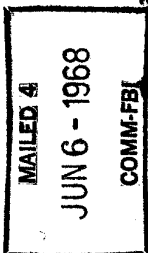

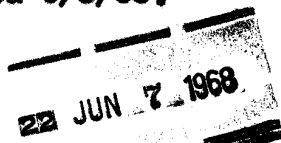
