This is the case involving the murder of Martin Luther King, Jr.

As you are aware, Departmental Attorneys are in Memphis, Tennessee, obtaining affidavits from individuals who are witnesses in this case in connection with the possible extradition of subject James Earl Ray from London.

In connection with physical evidence examined by the FBI Laboratory, the Departmental representatives requested an affidavit from SAC Robert Jensen of Memphis, which was furnished to them by Jensen.

Jensen's affidavit relates to the fact that he received various items of evidence from Inspector N. E. Zachary of the Memphis Police Department and that he, in turn, forwarded them to the FBI Laboratory for examination. The items mentioned in Jensen's affidavit relate to the rifle, the rifle scope, the brown box in which the rifle was located, a set of binoculars, a gray paper bag bearing the legend "York Arms" the cartridge shell removed from the rifle by SAC Jensen, and the bullet which was recovered from the body of Dr. King.

SAC Jensen is furnishing to the Bureau a copy of the affidavit furnished by him to Departmental representatives.

In addition, he was reinterviewed by a representative of the Memphis Police Department. Mr. YORK stated that he was told by both representatives of local law enforcement agencies that these interviews were for the purpose of extradition of JAMES EARL RAY to the United States.

8. Captain WALSH further advised that all unlicensed crews are controlled by the Seafarers International Union of Canada (SIU) and engineers who are not controlled by CMSG are controlled by the Canadian Maritime Officers Union (CMOU) of Montreal.

9. WALSH further advised that the Canadian Maritime Union of Port Colborne, Ontario, handle unlicensed crews. This Union handle all ships that belong to the Upper Lake Shipping. Contact can be made with a Jack STAPLES of King Street, Port Colborne, Ontario. It is requested that this UNION be contacted to ascertain if RAY with aliases is known there.

10. Further to paragraph 1 (3) of memorandum dated 1 MAY 68 from the A/Officer i/c C.I.B. "HQ", a list of companies which are under contract to CMSG was obtained from Captain WALSH. Captain WALSH advises that these companies only hire members of the CMSG as far as licensed members are concerned. Unlicensed crews would be controlled by the SIU.

11. List referred to in paragraph 10 above is attached and marked "A"; however, no investigation at these companies is deemed necessary at this time. These companies handle traffic on the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence Seaway.

12. Further to memorandum of the A/Officer i/c C.I.B. "HQ" dated 7 MAY 68, Mrs. Ginette BORMANN (dob [redacted]) of 11075 Boulevard Plaza, Montreal, P.Q., telephone 321-3203, was contacted. BORMANN could not identify any of the photographs of RAY and added that during her association with George Ben EDMONDSON alias Alex BORMANN, she did not meet any person by the name of RAY or any person with RAY's aliases.

13. BORMANN was very cooperative and produced an address book of hers and also one belonging to EDMONDSON. The following persons BORMANN states were friends of EDMONDSON prior to her meeting him in the Fall of 1965.

17. Investigations will be conducted at the Capri Hotel and 3465 Simpson.
