RICHARD TOMKINSON, 97 Union Avenue, Saratoga Springs, New York, President of the Delaware Corporation, a small vending machine company, advised SA DANIEL V.HOGAN that he has an acquaintance named NELSON SCHAUB of Saranac Lake, N.Y. SCHAUB, according to TOMKINSON, is a coin dealer, recently convicted of smuggling gold into the United States, who is always looking for a chance to make big money. SCHAUB told TOMKINSON that he had an idea which might make a lot of money for both of them. SCHAUB said that the United States Government was offering a reward of \$100,000.00 for JAMES EARL RAY, killer of MARTIN LUTHER KING. SCHAUB was aware that there was a far right group in Lake Placid, N.Y., which included many prominent local people. This group included doctors and lawyers. It had recently sponsored a speech at the Lake Placid Arena by a former member of the "Green Berets", the Army Special Services Force. That speech and the talks of those who introduced and thanked the speaker, was very critical of United States policy in Vietnam.

SCHAUB had heard some people in Lake Placid discuss the death of MARTIN LUTHER KING and he felt they were not unhappy at KING's death and said they felt he had probably had his appearance changed and was out of the country.

He told TOMKINSON that if the United States Government would investigate this group which he believed to be a John Birch Society group, the Government might obtain information regarding the KING killing and SCHAUB and TOMKINSON could share in the reward money.

The Albany Office Indices indicate that MATSON
RAYMOND SCHAUB is a former PCI operated by SA EDWARD A. MC SHANE, Jr., while Schauß operated a coin exchange at Plattsburgh, N.Y. This case was closed when SCHAUB was arrested by the U. S. Treasury Department and convicted of gold smuggling in 1966. SA MC SHANE determined that SCHAUB has since been involved in a \$30,000 swindle in the Tupper Lake, N.Y, area; is the subject of/ortstanding warrants for bad c

Local and New York State Police in the Saranac Lake and Plattsburgh areas characterize SCHAUB as a "con-man", of absolute unreliability.

SCHAUB was located and interviewed by SA EDWARD A. MC SHANE, Jr. on 6/7/68, at which time he stated that he had absolutely no reason to suspect anyone or any group in the Lake Placid, N.Y. - Saranac Lake, N.Y. area of involvement in the King Killing, but feels that such a group might be responsible for KING's death.

In view of SCHAUB's poor character, and history of unreliability, no further action is being taken.

Keith Edward Roberts; John Joseph Capello

A review of indices of the New York Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation disclosed that one Keith Edward Roberts, date of birth at Tortola. British West Indies, had voiced the opinion that Ho Chi Minh of North Vischam was doing a good job in connection with the war and was minding his own business and not making inquiries concerning happenings taking place in the United States.

Mr. Roberts was then employed as a mail and file clerk at the Brooklyn Army Terminal and used the name Keithley Edwin Roberts. As a result of irrational actions while at work in 1964, he was examined at the United States Public Health Service and it was concluded that he was the subject of "Schizaphrenic Reaction", which was no reason for separation if the employing agency would tolerate his behavior.

In 1965, he was escorted to the Kings County Hospital in handcuffs for examination following the writing of an irrational letter to a General Montgomery. It was concluded at the Kings County Hospital that there was no evidence of physical or psychotic abnormalities on the part of Roberts.

Roberts was listed as living at 393 Bradford Street, Brooklyn, New York. He was married and had a six year old son in 1965. He was married seven years in 1965, and his wife's name was Celestia.

An item has been appearing in the Toronto, Canada, newspapers as to a mysterious "Fat Man" who delivered an envelope to subject James Earl Ray while Ray was residing at 962 Dundas Avenue, West Toronto, during latter part of April and early part of May, 1968.

The mysterious "Fat Man" who identified himself as Robert McDouldton of Toronto, contacted Deputy Chief Simmonds, Toronto PD, (National Academy) with his wife and explained that in May of this year he had used a public telephone booth in the vicinity of Dundas Avenue and found an envelope which was addressed to Sneyd. He, thereafter, took this envelope to the address on Dundas Avenue and gave it to Sneyd in the presence of Sneyd's landlady. According to McDouldton, the envelope contained a Toronto postmark, no return address and he had the impression it contained some kind of application for a job. The landlady at Dundas Avenue viewed McDouldton and identified him as the "Fat Man" to whom she previously referred to in newspaper articles.

Officers of the Toronto Police Department and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police are satisfied that McDouldton, who has been employed as a salesman for a paint company in Toronto for the past eight years, is a reputable citizen and has no knowledge of or involvement with subject as Sneyd.

Two Department of Justice employees with the U. S. Bureau of Prisons contacted our Memphis Office and advised that they have been in Memphis for two days on instructions of the Attorney General counseling with local authorities concerning the security measures which may be needed in the event James Earl Ray is returned to Memphis. They stated they are in Memphis in an advisory capacity and desired to be helpful, and their purpose in contacting our office was to advise they were in the city and they would appreciate any suggestions our office may have in connection with handling of Ray. Our Memphis Office will make absolutely

no comments regarding the handling of security of Ray if and when he is returned to Memphis.

Tennessee State Attorney General Phil M. Canale contacted our Agent in charge in Memphis and advised he is not in agreement with Department Attorney John Rosenberg in regard to making efforts to obtain affidavits from Ralph M. Carpenter. Carpenter is an employee at the company who sold binoculars to the subject and who is currently confined to a psychiatric hospital in Memphis. Canale was of the opinion that any extensive interviews with Carpenter may well lead to publicity regarding his incarceration and could have detrimental effect on the future of the case. Departmental Attorney Rosenberg contacted our Memphis Office and he advised that at the present time no interview will be attempted with witness Carpenter.

We have ascertained that the raincoat in possession of subject when he was arrested by London authorities in London, England, on June 8, 1968, was purchased at "Andy's Mens Shop" in Toronto, Canada, on May 6, 1968, and he paid for it with a \$50 Canadian bill. The wife of the store owner has identified subject as purchaser of this coat.

While talking to Attorney General Ramsey Clark on another matter, The asked how the James Earl Ray investigation looked now. I said I thought it was more or less stymied in legal technicalities in Great Britain as it has "to go through a long process on extradition. I commented that, of course, the plawyer who has gone over to represent Ray is a former FBI Agent; that he is no good and was the attorney in the Mrs. Viola Linzzo case, but, of course, we got convictions in that, but this lawyer has always been strongly pro-Klan. I said he was Mayor of Eirmingham, Alabama, at one time and at that time he was a strong supporter of "Bull" Connor and I thought it significant that Ray should get a fellow who has certainly a strong smell of the Klan about him. I said he denies that he is a Klansman or that he ever attended any of their meetings and he claims he does not know how Ray came to ask for him as his lawyer. I said that Ray claims he read about him in the newspaper when he was in the penitentiary in Missouri. The Attorney General said he does not see how Ray would remember that. I agreed and told the Attorney General

The Attorney General asked how long ago the fellow was with the Bureau and I stated it must have been before the war. he does not intend to ask for a change of venue if he is to be tried in Memphis. The Attorney General asked if we were getting any evidence that Ray had somebody helping him and supporting him and I told him none whatsoever. I said we were checking various lines as to Ray and Sirhan Sirhan in the Robert F. Kennedy case as to the mysterious woman in the pantry of the Ambassador Hotel and so far they have all fallen through. I said the girl in the Sirhan case has refused to take a lie detector test, but I thought the police were going to give her one although so far she has refused to take one. The Attorney General asked if this were the woman in the polks dot dress and I told him it was the one who claimed she saw the woman in the polks dot dress. The Attorney General said he had read the report on her and got the feeling she was unbalanced. I commented that she was seeking publicity.

I continued that we are also checking as to who was with Sirhan Sirhan at the rifle range when he was practicing with the revolver as well as persons with him when he bought the ammunition. I stated in these instances they were men.

I stated that in Ray's case, we have not found a single angle that would indicate a conspiracy. I said the only significant thing is the money he had and which he spent freely in paying bills and I thought that could have been obtained from a bank robbery. The Attorney General said that if we could show he robbed the bank at Alton, it would be helpful. I said we are working on that because he was paying his bills with \$50 bills up to his arrest. I said on the other hand he stayed at flop houses and never stayed at a first-class hotel but at the same time he spent, I thought, \$1200 or more in buying guns and the car, which I thought was \$1500, and then he took dancing lessons, bartender lessons, and lessons in picking locks, and that is why I think security is so exceedingly important not only in England but on the way back to this country and when he gets here.

The Attorney General commented that he hoped my men can bring him back and asked if that were satisfactory. I told him it was and that I would be strongly of the opinion, unless there is a compelling reason to the contrary, that he ought to be brought back by military plane; that I could not see any difference between a military plane, a Cunard liner, or Pan American; and on the Military plane we would have our Agents and have Ray confined with

leg irons and handcuifs. I said he is a dangerous individual and is not a damn fool; that he is desperate and will make any effort to escape that he can. I said I thought he should be landed at the Naval airport in Memphis and not the regular airport. The Attorney General asked if we should have a representative of the Memphis Police Department on board or not, and I said I would not think so. I said I would think we would be responsible for taking him from the British and arrange with Frank Holloman to have the Memphis Police at the airport in Memphis on arrival, but to do it almost on an "eyes only" basis so there will be no leak as to where or when he is coming in because we will be plagued by the press, as they are trying everything they can in England to get a line on when he is being moved. I said i noted the lawyer says he expects to be advised exactly when and where he will depart. The Attorney General commented that he will know when he gets in.

I said there is a military airport in London and I thought that is where the military plane should land if it goes from this country with absolute silence on the part of the Commanding General as to its departure; that the first knowledge in this country would come when he is delivered to the Memphis Police with sufficient time to get him into jail. I said the plane should arrive so as not to allow them to go through the dity in the daytime but to arrive around 2:00 or 3:00 in the morning. The Attorney General said he was sure that was exactly right. I said otherwise there will be efforts to kill him if there is a conspiracy and if there is no conspiracy, the supporters of Dr. King will do everything in their power to kill him. I said the same thing is true in the case of Sirhan Sirhan in Los Angeles because the feeling: on behalf of the Kennedy followers is so strong that they will have to take great precautions to see he is not killed. I said it would be a horrible thing as it would be charged it was done by the Federal Government or something like that and for that reason it must be very carefully handled both as to transportation of Ray from London and incarceration, if he is ever extradited as I think it is going to drag on for five or six weeks. I said what I am afraid of is that there is going to develop in this country criticism on the part of the British in getting this fellow back here. I said people have asked how soon he will be brought back and I have told them it is up to the British as it is not our responsibility as we have done everything so that he has legal representation.

The Attorney General stated that Assistant Attorney General Fred Vinson, Jr., will be going back over to England Monday night as the Home Secretary and our Ambassador asked that he come back. He said that we have urged in every way that it be speeded up because of the strong feeling in this country about it.

The Attorney General asked then it i thought a initiary plane is better than leasing a commercial plane and I said I did because when you lease a commercial plane, you would have a crew, unless you put a military crew on it, but there would be no purpose putting a military crew on a commercial plane. I said I could not see any legal difficulty as the method of getting him back does not make much uniterence as to the legality of the thing or the image of it. The Attorney General commented that he had been thinking the other way. I said he is a dangerous man and has proven himself to be very clever as he headed for various parts of the world as I thought he was headed for brussels to join the mercenaries and he had plans to go to Rhodesia and he was in Libbon where he laid around for about a week and came back to London. I said the London Police have never been able to pick up what he was doing for the balance of the time. I said he is a slippery, shrewd individual and he is most contemptuous in manner and action with the prison authorities over there. I said knother thing about the British is that they are not tight on security as they do not search a person unless he is convicted and they do not search adjocuty visiting someone in jail, but that is the old British procedure. The Attorney General commented that it is absolutely wrong. I said I thought any person visiting a prisoner ought to be seguched. The Attorney General said he thought my men talked them into doing that. I said they finally did, but they always talk about traditions over there. The Attorney General commented that they were about as strict as anybody on those.

I said I thought we have a very serious problem in moving this fellow and we ought to do it with very carefully laid out plans and take him into the Naval airport in Memphis and arrange to turn him over to Holloman and then announce he is in the custody of the Memphis Police. The Attorney General said he hoped my men were working on that so we will be ready and I told him we were.
