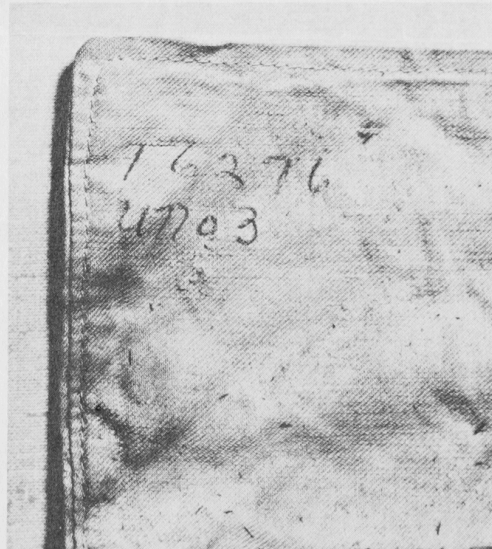
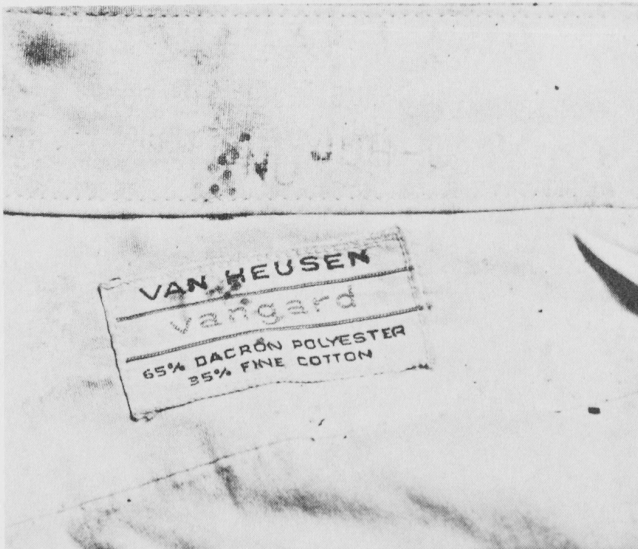

TO ALL LAUNDRIES AND DRY CLEANING ESTABLISHMENTS:

On July 13, 1967, two unknown males, wearing stocking masks, robbed The Bank of Alton, Alton, Illinois, at gunpoint and obtained over \$27,000. Investigation of this crime led to the recovery of a white Van Heusen Vanguard shirt and a pair of tan trousers among other items.

The shirt bears laundry marks and the trousers dry cleaning symbols, facsimiles of which appear below. The laundry marks appear on the shirt collar, and dry cleaning symbols appear on the front and rear pockets on the right side of the trousers.



If, after review of the above facsimiles, you feel you have information which would be of assistance to the FBI, please call the nearest office of the FBI, the telephone number of which is in the front page of your telephone directory.

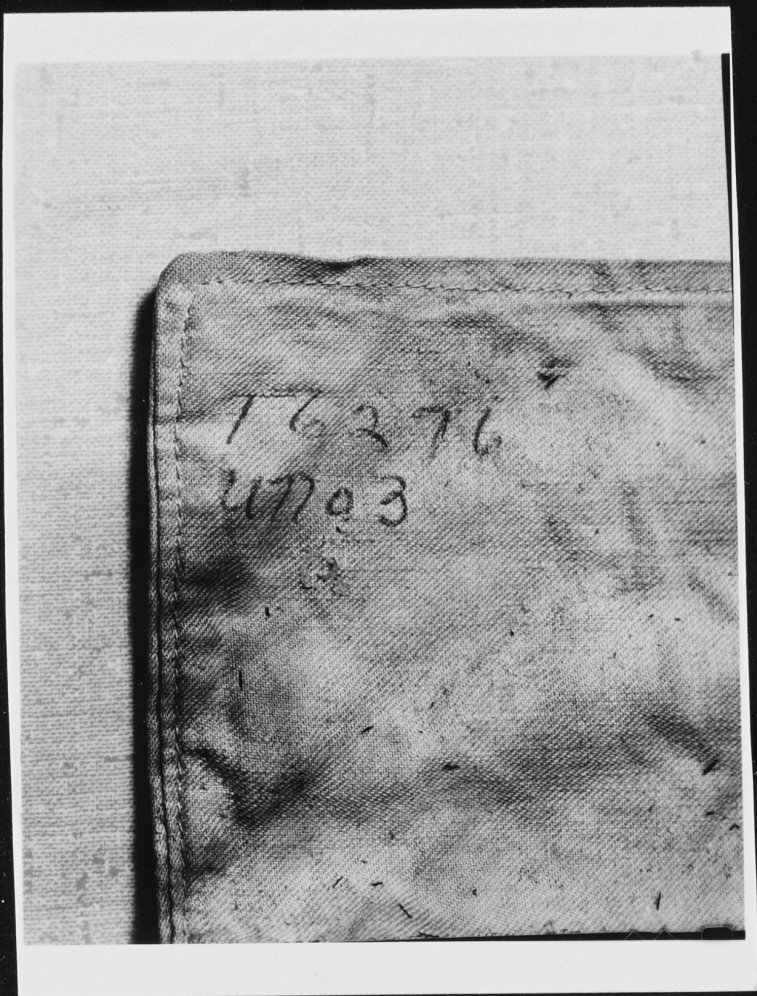

REMElet to Bureau 7/19/68 and MEtel to Bureau 7/30/68 concerning court orders issued by Shelby County Criminal Court Judge W. PRESTON BATTLE, and ATlet to Bureau 7/29/68 concerning the disposition of the 1966 Mustang abandoned by JAMES EARL RAY in Atlanta, Ga.

Enclosed herewith for the Bureau for information is one xerox copy of an "Amendment to Order" dated 7/23/68 and an "Order" dated 7/30/68, both of which concern "Order on Courthouse and Courtroom Procedures and Publicity" issued by Shelby County Criminal Court Judge W. PRESTON BATTLE.

On 8/2/68 the Honorable PHIL M. CANALE, District State Attorney General, Memphis, Tenn., advised SA ROBERT F. BOYLE that he does not see any need for the physical presence in Memphis of the 1966 Mustang abandoned by JAMES EARL RAY in Atlanta, Ga.; however, he desires that this automobile not be disposed of until completion of the murder trial of RAY scheduled to commence in Memphis on 11/12/68.

He stated that under state law the defense counsel is afforded an opportunity to examine any potential evidence and in this particular instance would be given an opportunity to examine this automobile if he so desires. Mr. CANALE stated, however, that since this automobile is the property of JAMES EARL RAY he would offer no objections if Mr. ARTHUR B. HANES, RAY's attorney, initiates any action to have this automobile turned over to HANES.

O R D E R

In this cause, the Court having heretofore appointed a committee of eight members of the Bar to act as amici curiae and said committee having this day filed a report that there is probable cause to believe that this Court's Order of July 18, 1968, as amended July 23, 1968, has been violated by certain individuals in certain circumstances, to-wit:

(1) Certain statements attributed to Arthur B. Hanes, Esq., to the effect that the shooting of Doctor Martin Luther King, Jr. involves a Communist conspiracy, to the effect that his client's rights were being trampled in Jail, and to the effect that himself, his family and servants are being threatened by "them", as quoted in the Memphis Press Scimitar of Saturday, July 27, 1968, and the Commercial Appeal of Sunday, July 28, 1968;

(2) Certain statements in Memphis Press Scimitar of July 27, 1968, attributed to William Morris, Sheriff of Shelby County, Tennessee, concerning the cost and expenses for the security of the prisoner and the treatment of the prisoner, and the prisoner's demeanor and attitude while in confinement.

(3) Certain statements appearing in the Memphis Press Scimitar of Saturday, July 27, 1968, attributed to Russell X. Thompson, Esq. concerning his opinion as to the guilt or innocence of the defendant,

and said report further pointing out that to the extent that Ramsey Clark, Attorney General of the United States is a "Law Enforcement Officer" or "a lawyer participating in this case" through his staff, assistants, office associates, investigators or employees under his supervision, the statements attributed to him and the United States Department of Justice as referred to in the Commercial

of July 28, 1968 are in probable violation of the principles
set out in Sheppard vs. Maxwell, 384 U.S. 333, 16 L.Ed. 2d 600,
86 S. Ct. 1507 (1966),^{321 P.2d 1344 (1968)} to the effect that there was no evidence
of a conspiracy in the shooting of Doctor Martin Luther King, Jr.

The Court, in the interest of preserving the constitutional rights of all concerned and protecting the orderly preparation and progress of the trial, reserves further inquiry and disposition of each and all of the above instances until a later date.

And whereas it is the desire of the Court to avoid any possible misunderstanding of its orders heretofore made, said orders of July 18 and July 23 respectively are herewith supplemented as follows:

All lawyers participating in this case, their assistants, associates, staff members, investigators and employees under their supervision and control, County Medical Examiner, Jury Commissioners, Criminal Court Clerk, County Sheriff, Police Officials and other law enforcement officers, employees of this Court and all other persons employed in the "Criminal Courts Buildings", their associates, deputies, assistants, staff members and personnel under their supervision and control, are forbidden to take part in interviews or press conferences for publicity and are enjoined from making extra-judicial statements about this case which involve: (1) the personal belief of the Declarant as to the guilt or innocence of the accused; (2) the plans of the Declarant relating to the preparation or conduct of the trial, the theory, techniques and strategy of the Declarant in the preparation and trial of the case; (3) the jurors or potential jurors who may serve; (4) the comment of the Declarant about the merits of the case and about any evidence which may be presented; (5) the credibility of or information concerning any known or intended witnesses or the treatment, acts and attitude of the defendant, and are further enjoined from making any and all other statements which may be prejudicial to a fair trial by an impartial jury in this case, whether specified herein or not.

All persons or entities subject to this Order who feel aggrieved by anything herein contained are hereby admonished that any such grievances or complaints should be judicially presented.

The Court recognizes the wide and pervasive publicity which has been and will be an inevitable incident of this trial. The Court further recognizes that there are many individuals who are beyond the jurisdiction of this Court, but who may be interested in the outcome of this trial, and whose statements may have been violative of this Order had the Court jurisdiction over such parties. As to such persons, the Court urges self-imposed compliance with this Order in the interests of a fair trial to the defendant and to the State of Tennessee.

In accordance therewith the Court orders a certified copy of this Order to be sent by the Clerk of this Court to all persons named herein or subject hereto, and all newspapers of general circulation, radio and television stations within the jurisdiction of this Court.

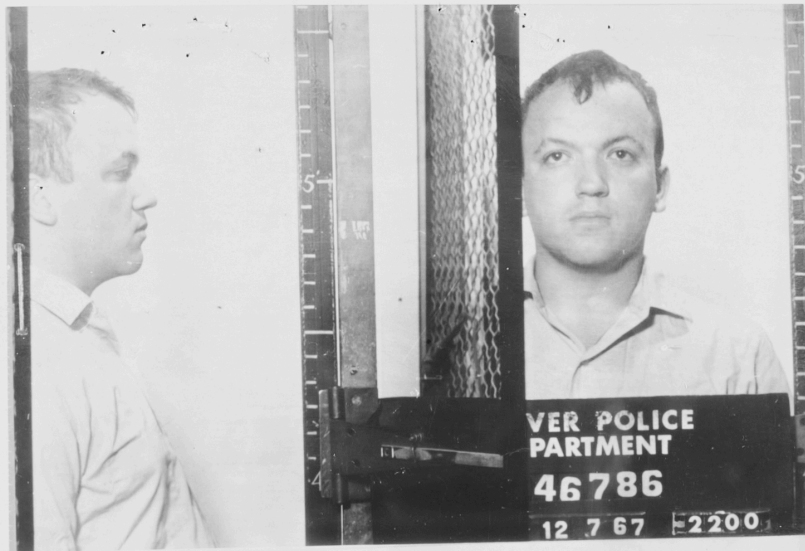

Mr. JACQUES DE LANGRE, 7557 Sunset Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, was interviewed on 8/19/68 and advised that the name ERIC GALT was unfamiliar to him. He reviewed his records and advised that an address card with the name ERIC GALT, 2608 Highland Avenue, Birmingham, Alabama, was contained therein. No legend appeared on the card, but he stated he felt, because of the color of the card, the inquiry was made at least six months ago.

He stated that GALT probably made inquiry of their concern from an advertisement in "Modern Photography", "National Professional Photography", "Popular Photography" or "PSA Journal", as his firm advertises in these magazines. He stated that the Mortensen Texture Screens are darkroom aids. He felt that a person interested in this type of equipment would be one who was either a professional photographer or had his own darkroom setup.

He stated that records of his firm contain no indications of any additional correspondence with ERIC GALT.

Re Savannah airtel to Bureau 7/31/68.

On 8/15/68, SV 524-R (PROB) (Protect Identity), advised that a few days previously, J. B. STONER, Vice Chairman of NSRP, had told Dr. EDWARD R. FIELDS, NSRP Director and Editor of "The Thunderbolt" (NSRP publication) that he, STONER, had received a letter from JAMES EARL RAY.

Source said STONER did not elaborate on this statement when he handed the letter to FIELDS, and that both STONER and FIELDS left NSRP headquarters with FIELDS reading the letter.

Source commented he did not know when STONER received the letter, noting the possibility that STONER may have had the letter for several weeks before giving it to FIELDS, as STONER sometimes handled other mail.

Informant has been instructed to continue to be alert for any contacts between NSRP officials and JAMES EARL RAY or his representatives.

This is in response to your memorandum of August 5, 1968, concerning the question whether the federal complaint against James Earl Ray should be dismissed.

I have discussed this entire matter with Assistant Attorney General Vinson who dealt with the British authorities concerning the extradition. He has no objection to allowing the federal complaint to remain outstanding under these circumstances.

In reply to your inquiry as to the circumstances under which federal prosecution would be pursued, we would want to review the facts after the conspiracy investigation has been completed; if the evidence and the outcome of the State proceedings were such that federal prosecution seemed desirable, we would consider taking steps to try to obtain the necessary waiver from the British government.

Mrs. BRANUM advised that WELKER is a good babysitter and is good with the children, but she talks continually about any and everything, and at times her conversations do not make sense. Mrs. BRANUM advised that Mrs. WELKER can presently be located where she is visiting at Apartment A, 768 Richmond, Ontario, California.

On 8/15/68 Mrs. FRANCES WELKER was contacted at Apartment A, 768 Richmond, Ontario, California, where she was visiting.

Mrs. WELKER took the Agent's credentials and, after observing them closely, stated that the Agent was not J. EDGAR HOOVER, and that she wanted to discuss this matter with Mr. HOOVER personally.

Mrs. WELKER was advised that Mr. HOOVER could not contact her personally, and that the Agent would take any information she had to offer concerning the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING or any other matter over which the FBI has jurisdiction.

Mrs. WELKER stated she absolutely did not have any information to offer and had no knowledge of the KING case, but that she merely wanted to discuss this matter with Mr. HOOVER. She advised that she had previously written to Mr. HOOVER following the Brinks robbery in Boston in January 1951. She said that at that time she had no facts to offer concerning this robbery but merely wanted to guess who did it. She stated that, as it turns out, she did not guess right.

It was suggested to Mrs. WELKER that if in the future she desired to furnish information to the FBI, she contact the local Resident Agency, rather than writing letters to the Bureau in Washington.
