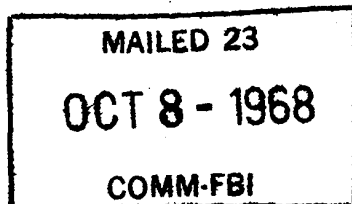

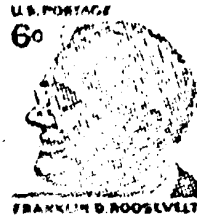

Dr. Bertram D. ~~Sarason~~ *I* Sarason, professor of English, Southern Connecticut College, New Haven, Connecticut, advised us that he recently was at a small gathering of four individuals and one of these individuals was employed at McCalls Publications. *AR*

During the course of the conversation a "McCalls" employee mentioned that "Look" magazine beginning with the issue of October 29, 1968, will run a series on James Earl Ray. In this series of articles Ray reportedly will state that the Ku Klux Klan hired him to assassinate Martin Luther King, Jr.

Dr. Sarason requested that his identity be protected and he declined to furnish the name of the "McCalls" employee since he feared if it became known the employee might lose his job.

We previously had information that William Bradford Huie, author, who allegedly entered into a contract with James Earl Ray to write his life story, has been in contact with restaurant owners in Winnetka, Illinois. Based upon information furnished by Ray, Mr. Huie interviewed these people, as they employed Ray at their restaurant during May and June of 1967, and he promised to furnish them "proofs" of an article to appear in "Look" magazine on November 10, 1968. To date Huie has not furnished the proofs to the restaurant owners. *9*

We have run out similar allegations of Ray having been involved in an assassination plot financed by the Ku Klux Klan with negative findings. *EC-41/4-2571-2536*

Bureau files contain no derogatory information concerning Dr. Sarason.

A source advised that on May 22, 1960, the National Grand Council of the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan met at Atlanta, Georgia, to discuss consolidation of the Klan's unity of effort and activities to establish a National Fund, and a National Secretary, and to design a new flag. The meeting was attended by representatives of the Federation of Ku Klux Klan, Alabama; Association of Arkansas Klans, Arkansas; Florida Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Florida; Southern Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Florida; Association of Georgia Klans, Georgia; Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, North Carolina; Association of South Carolina Klans, South Carolina; Dixie Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Tennessee; and Kyksos Klan, Texas.

This source advised that at a consolidation meeting at Atlanta, Georgia, September 2-5, 1960, at which the North Carolina and Texas Klans were not represented, it was resolved and passed that their name be changed to National Ku Klux Klan.

A second source advised in March, 1964, that several meetings of Klan groups were held during the period 1960 to 1963 in an effort to unite the Klan groups under a single leadership.

The organization was granted a charter in DeKalb County, Georgia, November 1, 1963, under the name National Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc., as a "patriotic, secret, social, and benevolent order."

A third source advised in December, 1963, that the organization had issued a statement of its program which indicated the organization to be anti-Negro, anti-Jewish, anti-Catholic, and anti-foreign born.

HUIE reappeared at Dr. BRADLEY's office on 9/27/68 with a handwritten medical release from RAY witnessed by RAY's attorney ARTHUR HAYNES. With approval of his personal attorney Dr. BRADLEY then furnished HUIE information concerning ERIC S. GALT from his files.

This information consisted of the facts that BRADLEY had a first appointment with GALT on 2/19/68 for consultation. On 3/5/68 BRADLEY performed a nasal tip reconstruction for an elongated nasal tip on GALT in his office. On 3/7/68 packs were removed from GALT's nose and on 3/11/68 sutures were removed. GALT was scheduled to return in six weeks for a postoperative checkup but failed to keep the appointment.

He furnished his address as 5533 Hollywood Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, telephone 464-1131 and date of birth as [REDACTED]. He listed his nearest relative as CARL L. GALT, 2608 Highland Avenue, Birmingham, Alabama. GALT stated he had been referred to Dr. BRADLEY by the Los Angeles County Medical Association.

Dr. BRADLEY stated he performed a nasal tip reconstruction for an elongated nasal tip on GALT in his office on March 5, 1968. A local anesthetic was used. On March 7, 1968 GALT returned to Dr. BRADLEY's office to have packs removed from his nose. On March 11, 1968 he again returned and the sutures were removed from his nose by Dr. BRADLEY.

GALT was scheduled to return in six weeks for a final postoperative checkup but failed to keep the appointment.

Dr. BRADLEY stated he personally saw GALT on each visit. He continued that GALT was quiet and pleasing in manner, unassuming and composed. Dr. BRADLEY stated that GALT paid \$200 in cash for the surgery on the date of the operation, March 5, 1968. Dr. BRADLEY stated that the surgery he performed on GALT did not alter his appearance to any degree.

Reference is made to my memorandum dated June 4, 1968, captioned as above, pointing out that your decisions were urgently needed concerning requests for electronic surveillances on the individuals and organizations listed in my memorandum of May 20, 1968. Subsequent to the memorandum of May 20, 1968, a request for electronic surveillance was submitted to you on May 31, 1968, concerning the National Headquarters of the Students for a Democratic Society, Chicago, Illinois. ~~(S)~~ ✓ U

As you were previously advised, this Bureau is greatly concerned about the delays involved regarding the requests for electronic surveillances which have been submitted to you. While we are making every feasible effort to obtain essential intelligence data in the internal security field, we cannot hope to fulfill our responsibilities in the intelligence field unless the requested investigative techniques are made available. It is absolutely essential that in critical cases full coverage be given in areas of foreign intelligence, counterespionage, domestic subversion, and insurrection. The requests which are pending are in critical cases and in view of the developments during the past several weeks, particularly concerning activities of subversive organizations, civil rights groups, and organizations affiliated with the New Left, this Bureau must have consideration of the coverage requested of you. ~~(S)~~ u

I again find it necessary to bring to your attention that your delays involving requests for electronic surveillances are causing a loss of invaluable intelligence information. It is again requested that you furnish your decision as soon as possible concerning the requests which have been made. ~~(S)~~ u

The three state prosecutors from Memphis, ROBERT DWYER, JAMES BEASLEY, and JOHN CARLISLE, spent the entire day and early evening in Birmingham on 10/3/68 and were afforded courtesies of the Birmingham Office in arranging interviews, etc., with prospective witnesses. They appeared to be satisfied with responses obtained. They also gave the impression of being extremely dedicated toward the prosecution of this case.

For consideration of the Bureau, it appears advisable at this time for the physical evidence which was personally delivered to the FBI Laboratory immediately after being located to be returned to Birmingham in order that the items may be available for witnesses at Birmingham to produce in response to subpoenas duces tecum. 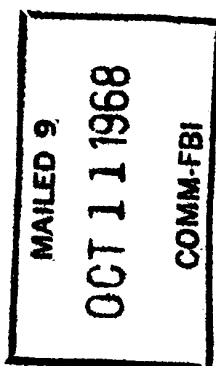
