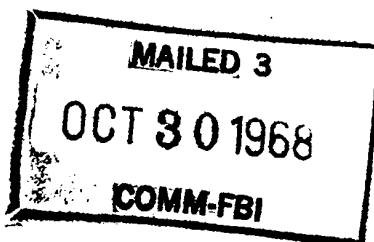

NOTE: Memphis by communication advised that Mr. Phil M. Canale, Jr., handling the state's prosecution in this case stated that Captain John W. DeShazo appears to have potential for being an excellent witness in this case. In connection with this, Canale has learned that DeShazo is currently a dentist on active duty with the Air Force in Tokyo, Japan. Mr. Canale desired that the Bureau make arrangements to have DeShazo available for testimony in connection with the trial. DeShazo was at the Aeromarine Supply Company, Birmingham, on March 29, 1968, and he can testify that photograph of Eric Starvo Galt (bartender photo) is photograph of man who purchased the Remington Model 700 (1st gun).

It is felt that we should advise Mr. Canale that arrangements can best be made through the commanding officer at Seward Air Force Base in Memphis, Tennessee, which is the closest Air Force Base to them. If we honor this type of request of Mr. Canale, we may be handling similar requests for numerous witnesses, which would consume quite a lot of Agents time. SA Leon F. Schwartz of Liaison suggested that this situation be handled in this manner, as this has been the procedure followed in the past.

In accordance with your request, this is to advise you as to the exact procedure which would be necessary to obtain proper permission for Sr. Jose Manuel Da Cunha Passo, Inspector of the Policia Internacional e de Defesa do Estado, Lisbon, Portugal, and Mrs. Manuela Teixeira Lopes, a Portuguese employee of the Consulate of the Canadian Embassy, Lisbon, to appear as witnesses during the trial to take place in Memphis, Tennessee.

Insofar as Inspector Passo is concerned, it would be necessary for you to address a communication to The Honorable W. Tapley Bennett, Ambassador of the United States, Embassy of the United States, Lisbon, Portugal, requesting that the Embassy direct a request to the Portuguese Foreign Office that Passo be permitted to visit the United States to testify in the trial of James Earl Ray, who is accused of the assassination of Martin Luther King. It would be advisable for you to stipulate the financial arrangements in the communication. At the same time, it is suggested that you advise our Memphis Office so that I can be advised expeditiously through Bureau channels in order that I can inform Passo personally at the same time that you are advising the Embassy in Lisbon.

Insofar as Mrs. Lopes is concerned, it would be necessary, according to the Canadian Embassy in Lisbon, for you to direct a communication to the U. S. Department of Justice requesting that an invitation be issued to Mrs. Lopes through the U. S. Department of State to the Canadian Foreign Office.

Review also indicated that this information was provided to you by the RCMP by their letter dated 10-25-68. You transmitted this information to us by your communication dated 10-25-68, and this was received at the Bureau on 10-28-68.

In the future you should make every effort to insure that such information is furnished to you by the RCMP on a timely basis. This is particularly true in instances such as this where the information was included in an article which appeared in a national magazine released on October 29, 1968. Obviously, it is desirable that the Bureau receive information of this type as early as possible so it can be evaluated at the Bureau prior to its actual publication.

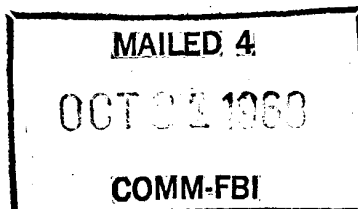

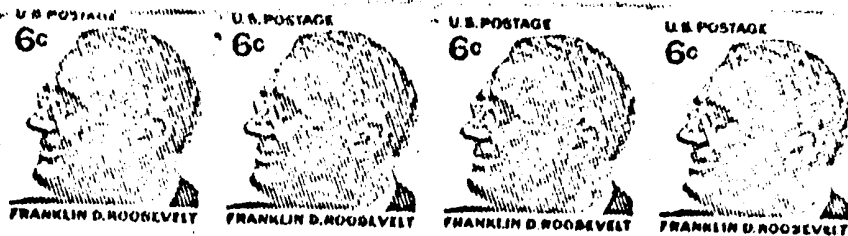

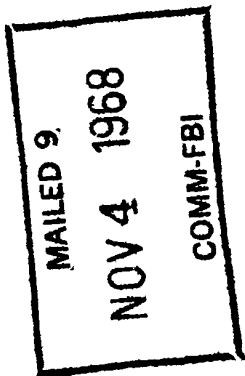

ROBERT DWYER, JAMES BEASLEY AND JOHN CARLISLE arrived London 10/20/68, were met, assisted and hotel rooms obtained.

On 10/21/68 an interview room was obtained for them at New Scotland Yard (NSY). Chief Inspector RON BURROWS and Sgt. PETER ELLIOTT, NSY, were assigned to assist them in locating, coordinating and driving them to witnesses who could not appear at NSY.

All witnesses were interviewed by them, except one who was in Paris. Her address in Paris was obtained.

They were driven to the Airport on 10/22/68 and assisted to depart for Paris to interview the witness and were to leave Paris on 10/23/68 for Lisbon. Legat, Paris, was advised.

They expressed the greatest appreciation for assistance rendered and were most impressed by the treatment rendered by NSY.

They indicated that all of the police officers involved, and one or two others, would be needed to testify in Memphis. In this regard I stressed the necessity that this office be notified as soon as possible as to the dates they will be required.

Bureau requested to have Memphis Office keep the Bureau immediately advised of identity of witnesses and dates required.

According to our legal attache in London, the representatives of Mr. Canale indicate that several police officers would be needed to testify in Memphis at the state trial on November 12, 1968. Legat states he would like to be notified as soon as possible as to the identity of these witnesses and dates required. This is important to the Legat in maintaining good relationships with British contacts. Memphis is being instructed to obtain this information for the Bureau's use and they are being instructed to advise Mr. Canale that he should communicate directly with British authorities on this matter.

This is the case involving the murder of Martin Luther King, Jr. Previous information received from Memphis indicated that committee of seven attorneys advising Judge W. Preston Battle, Criminal Court, Memphis, Tennessee, was presenting to the Judge a petition stating that George Bonebrake, Latent Fingerprint Examiner, may be in violation of the Judge's court order restricting comment in this case. Their recommendation based on article appearing in Wichita, Kansas, "Beacon" newspaper concerning a police school conducted by Bonebrake in September, 1968. Bonebrake presented expert fingerprint testimony on June 27, 1968, in London, England, in connection with extradition of James Earl Ray. His testimony received widespread publicity in news media throughout the world. Bonebrake has emphatically denied discussing his fingerprint testimony with press representatives at any time or unnecessarily airing fingerprint testimony of this case before a police school in Wichita, Kansas. On one occasion representatives of this police school, in a closed session, attempted to query him as to details of the fingerprint testimony. Bonebrake reports he gave no facts other than what had already been quoted by the press concerning his London testimony. Administrative action has previously been taken against Bonebrake for discussing the case at the closed police school.

Judge Battle signed petition 10-24-68 which requires that Bonebrake appear before the Court on 12-6-68 to show cause why he should not be adjudged in contempt. The Judge noted he was setting the date of 12-6-68 which would be after the trial of James Earl Ray, subject of the case, since to do otherwise would result in unnecessary publicity, defeating purpose of his original order. The committee of attorneys in presenting the petition to the Judge recognized that the Court does not have jurisdiction. The committee of attorneys has no sound grounds to substantiate their recommendation and undoubtedly took this action against our employee as a face-saving gesture. The committee has been severely criticized by Ray's Defense Attorney Arthur Hanes, Sr., and a Memphis "Commercial Appeal" newspaper reporter Charles Edmundson, who are both currently under contempt citation by Judge Battle in this case as result of

recommendation by the committee of attorneys. The committee is reportedly extremely liberal and, in fact, one member, Lucius E. Burch, Jr., according to SAC, Memphis, has served as an attorney for the American Civil Liberties Union.

The Court has not officially notified the Bureau of the petition but reportedly has mailed a copy to the Attorney General. The Department has requested a letter from the Bureau setting out information concerning the nature of the police school conducted by Bonebrake at Wichita, Kansas, in September, 1968, and what transpired at this meeting. The Department indicated they intend to present this to the Court in Memphis. Attached is proposed letter. Copy of letter being sent to SAC, Memphis, for his information and so that he may properly advise the State's Attorney General, Shelby County, Memphis, Tennessee, prosecutor in this case. State's Attorney General is fully aware of this entire situation and is of the opinion that this will have no adverse effect on his handling of the prosecution.

On 10/26/68, CS CI 569-S made available to SA MACK O. ELLIS at Athens, Ohio, Page 31 of "Look" magazine, dated 4/25/61, Volume 25, No. 9. The page is enclosed for Atlanta, and a xerox copy of the page enclosed for Memphis and the Bureau.

CS CI 569-S advised that this page is the beginning of the article, "The Second Battle of Atlanta," by GEORGE B. LEONARD, JR., Look Staff Writer, and included on page 31 are two photographs. One photograph shows a marching Ku Klux Klansman, and the other a Negro student demonstrator. Source advised he noted this article while thumbing through the old issue of the magazine. Being an artist himself, he noted the great similarity between the Ku Klux Klansman and the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY, photograph of RAY taken in 1966. Source states there is enough similarity between the Ku Klux Klansman in 1961 and RAY to be the one and the same person.

Source advised that the photo credit for the Klansman is the "Atlanta Journal" photographer.

The photo mentioned above appears in the 4/25/61 issue of "LOOK," however, the date the photo was taken is not known. However, the article mentions that "Both Ku Klux Klansmen and Negro students have marched in downtown Atlanta in recent months."

It is further noted that Bureau teletype to all SAC's, dated 4/19/68, captioned MURKIN, reveals RAY had been received at the Missouri State Penitentiary at Jefferson City, Missouri, on 3/17/60.

If Atlanta does not know the identity of the Klansman shown in the photo, it may be desirable to contact the "Atlanta Journal" to determine the date the photo was made.

Atlanta is requested to advise Cincinnati only should the Klansman in the photo be identified as RAY.
