Legat Ottawa advised us that John William Beattie, leader of Canadian National Socialist Party, was in contact with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) and said that David Stanley, who at one time was a member of the Canadian National Socialist Party, had forwarded names of Toronto residents to the National States Rights Party (NSRP) in Birmingham in order that the publication "Thunderbolt" could be forwarded to them. Stanley allegedly forwarded lists of 200 to 300 names on several occasions in 1965 and feels that the names of Sneyd, Bridgeman, and Galt (aliases of James Earl Ray) were among the names forwarded. The RCMP places little value on any of this information as Beattie is continually seeking any recognition through press and news media.

William Bradford Huie, author, stated the names Sneyd, Bridgeman, and Galt were obtained by Ray through old editions of newspapers.

Beattie is an American Nazi Party advocate and there is no indication he ever associated with the NSRP. We have no knowledge of Stanley or Beattie forwarding such lists to NSRP in Birmingham or any other location according to Racial Intelligence Section, Domestic Intelligence Division.

Legat Ottawa requested to be advised concerning these lists and this communication is advising him of such.

On 3/10/69, subject appeared before Judge W. PRESTON BATTLE, Division III, Criminal Court, Shelby County, Memphis, Tenn., and entered plea of guilty to murder in the first degree for which he was sentenced to 99 years imprisonment. On 3/13 and 3/14/69, efforts made by FBI Agents to interview RAY at Tennessee State Penitentiary, Nashville, Tenn., were unsuccessful. On 4/7/69, subject filed in Criminal Court of Shelby County, Tenn., a motion for a new trial.

DETAILS:

On March 10, 1969, the subject and his attorney, PERCY FOREMAN, appeared before Judge W. PRESTON BATTLE, Division III, Criminal Court of Shelby County, Memphis, Tennessee, and entered a plea of guilty to murder in the first degree for having murdered Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. RAY was sentenced to ninety nine years imprisonment, this having previously been agreed to by RAY, by the District Attorney General, and by Judge BATTLE.

On March 13, 1969, and again on March 14, 1969, the subject RAY, then incarcerated at the Tennessee State Penitentiary, Nashville, Tennessee, declined to be interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

On April 7, 1969, the subject through his attorneys, RICHARD J. RYAN, J. B. STONER, and ROBERT W. HILL, JR., filed in the Criminal Court of Shelby County, Tennessee, a motion for a new trial. The subject asks that the Court set aside his waiver, his plea of guilty, and his conviction and that he be granted a new trial. Subject states that his waiver, plea, and conviction were the results of his being deprived of legal counsel, in violation of the 14th and 6th Amendments to the U. S. Constitution. The subject states he will show that he and his two prior attorneys, ARTHUR HANES and PERCY FOREMAN, entered into contracts with the author WILLIAM BRADFORD HUIE while the subject was awaiting trial, and that these contracts established a conflict of interest between the subject and his two prior attorneys. The subject therefore asks that the judgment heretofore entered be set aside and that his case be restored to the trial calendar.

The 66th determined that JOESTEN is registered as residing in Munich, Federal Republic of Germany (FRG), at 13/1 Grieg Strasse, in care of SCHMITZ. This registration record shows that he was born on in Cologne, Germany. He came to his present address on 10/15/68 from 87-70 173rd Street, New York, New York.

Passport No. issued on 4/18/67 at the American Consulate General in Stuttgart, FRG. JOESTEN was married on 9/8/40 in Stockholm to the former MAY JANIELSSON, who was born on in Gaevle, Sweden. They have a daughter, INGRID J., who was born on in New York. JOESTEN's wife and daughter reside in the United States.

Other records in Munich which might be expected to contain some information about JOESTEN are negative.

None of our other applicable sources has been able to discreetly determine if JOESTEN's book concerning RAY is available at no cost. 





AMENDED PETITION

Your petitioner would respectfully show the Court:

That this cause is subject to federal jurisdiction in
that there is a diversity of citizenship (see caption) and that
the subject matter of this suit is in excess of \$10,000.

That he is presently in the Tennessee State Penitentiary at Nashville serving time under a sentence of 99 years imposed by the Criminal Court of Shelby County, Tennessee, the Honorable Judge Preston Battle (now deceased) then presiding.

That he was imposed upon by the respondents in the following manner: Petitioner first consulted with Arthur J. Hanes, an attorney at law in the State of Alabama, and that they reached a tentative agreement for the said Hanes to defend him on a charge of murder. The petitioner charges that he was before and at all times since in jail without bail and under every restrictive security. Petitioner would show that after the original meeting with Hanes that he and Hanes started a line of discussion relative to Hanes' fee and expenses.

approached by the respondent, Huie, and that Huie would be willing to pay large sums of money for the exclusive rights to the story of your petitioner's life, including any and all facts surrounding the petitioner's alleged involvement in the slaying of Martin Luther King (whom petitioner at that time stood charged with murdering). After being assured by Mr. Hanes that his rights pending the homicide case would not be prejudiced or imperiled, the pe-

titioner entered into a contract with respondent Hanes and with respondent Huie (a copy of which, together with other material contracts and correspondence, is attached tororiginal petition).

Your petitioner now realizes and so charges that the original and all subsequent contracts were not in any way for the petitioner's benefit; nor were they ever so intended to be. On the contrary, it is charged that respondent Hanes entered into collusion with respondent Huie, each having the specific intent to emploit your petitioner's plight to their own monetary benefit. Your petitioner was under extreme emotional and mental stress, whereby he was made more susceptible to the urgings of the attorney who was allegedly acting in his behalf. Respondent Manes realized that your petitioner was a stranger to the tangles of the law, and therefore proceeded to "take him in."

Your petitioner would show the Court that he at all times depended wholly upon the advice of Mr. Hanes until such time as Percy Foreman, the lawyer from the Texas Bar, entered into the case. At this point in time, the petitioner released Mr. Hanes and depended fully upon the advice of said Percy Foreman.

Your petitioner would show that he initially entered into a contract with Mr. Hanes, but that through, an amendatory agreement induced by Mr. Percy Foreman, he signed a contract by virtue of which Mr. Hanes was released upon the promise to be paid some \$35,000 by Mr. Huie. Under the amendatory contract, Mr. Foreman was to receive all rights formerly to have been Mr. Hanes'. However, Mr. Foreman was to receive further rights in regard to exclusive stories, motion picture contracts, re-run contracts, tolevision rights, etc. In other words, Mr. Percy Foreman was to receive everything which might otherwise have been the property of James Earl Ray, in return for defending James Earl Ray.

The petitioner believes that the defendant Foreman has some sort of power of attorney so that on the face of said power of attorney, Foreman, if not restrained, will in all probability further act in the name of the petitioner to the petitioner's detriment in these and other matters.

Your petitioner was not versed in the law relative to

Petitioner charges that the respondent Poreman advised, then cajoled, then pressured him into pleading guilty to the aforementioned charge of murder in the first degree. Among other things, the said Foreman told him that this course was the only way to save petitioner's life - all of this in spite of the fact that petitioner had at all times protested his innocence to Mr. Foreman.

Petitioner now believes and charges that neither respondents ever intended for him to have a fair trial and testify in his own behalf, as this would then make the facts and testimony public property and no one would or could have exclusive rights in the matter.

Petitioner charges that Foreman informed him that the only way to raise enough money to pay his fee was to sign over such rights as he had. Petitioner at this time had full faith in his attorney and acted strictly in accordance with his attorney's advice. He did not know that such acts actually prejudiced his rights in the criminal case and caused to arise a serious conflict of interest which rendered it impossible for Mr. Foreman to well and truly represent him. There was no way for the petitioner to know that Mr. Foreman had, in fact, positioned himself in such a manner as to have a strong monetary interest in having his client found guilty and sentenced to a 99 year term for a crime which he 61: not commit. Mr. Foreman did not tell the petitioner, nor did the petitioner know, that there have been no executions in this. state within the past decade and that the "bargaining" for the 99 year sentence could have easily been done by almost any student fresh out of law school. No ability, experience, or exhaustive research would be necessary to obtain the said results, particularly in view of the fact that petitioner at all times prior thereto proclaimed his innocence.

Petitioner would further show that the presiding judge, Judge Prescon Battle, in an effort to keep down unnecessary pube

licity had enjoined all parties, including the attorneys, from releasing to the Press any statements relating to the petitioner and/or his case. That in spite of this injunction, respondent Foreman released statements to his co-respondent Muio, said statements purported to be from this petitioner. That such statements, even when and if the same were made by the petitioner, were statements of a confidential nature and privileged between client and attorney.

Patitioner charges that there has since appeared in a mational magazine an article in which Nuie sets forth certain statements purportedly made by the petitioner. Even if such statements were true, which petitioner denies, they could only have been based upon statements made to his lawyer, therefore bringing them under the rule of privilege between attorney and client (a copy of said magazine is filed to the original petition).

Finally, petitioner charges that not only does the above conduct violate the relationship of attorney and client, but also violates Canon No. 6 of the professional ethics set forth by the American Bar Association and which have been adopted by the state. Potitioner avers that the relationship of attorney and client existed at all times whenever he talked with any of his lawyers, but that he was never told, nor did his lawyer explain to him, the true monetary aspects of the case or that the reception of such money under the conditions of the contract hereto attached would imperil petitioner's rights in the homicide case and violate the mandates of the Honorable Judge Preston Battle, now deceased.

From what he has now learned and believes, petitioner charges that his final attorney, Mr. Percy Foreman, was the agent of the co-respondent William B. Nuie and was in fact looking out for his own (Foreman's) and his principal's (Nuie) monatary interests, rather than the rights of this petitioner.

Patitioner would show in corroboration of his belief and charge that Percy Foreman, who was allegedly representing him, coorced your patitioner into signing some sort of patition for waiver and other unlawful and unconstitutional patitions attached

to this the amended petition. Among those rights which respondent Foreman attempted to coerce your petitioner to waive were 1) his motion for a new trial; 2) successive appeals to the Supreme Court of Criminal Appeals of the Supreme Court of Tennessee; and 3) petition for review by the Supreme Court of the United States (see page 2 of Voir Dire of Defendant of Waiver and Order).

Petitioner would point out to the court that there is no procedent for such a waiver in law or equity and that as an emperienced attorney, Mr. Foreman must have realized not only the impropriety, but the gross injustice he was fostering upon his can client in direct contradiction to all of those legal rights contacted him by the constitution of both this state and the United States.

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, PETITIONER PRAYS:

- 1. That he be allowed to file this petition and that proper process issue and be served upon the respondents and/or their agents, requiring them to appear at the earliest day convenient to be set by this Court, and to answer this complaint fully, but not under oath, their oath to the same being waived.
- 2. That a preliminary injunction issue enjoining the respondents from the further exposure of the alleged facts surrounding the slaying of Martin Luther King, insofar as such alleged facts affect the petitioner, or purport to involve this petitioner with said killing. Petitioner prays that upon the final hearing of this cause that said injunction be made final.
- 3. That any and all contracts entered into by the parties described above be voided or nullified and that all parties respondent be perpetually enjoined from pursuing their course by reason of any alleged contractual agreements or powers of attorney.
- 4. That all costs pursuant to petition be taxed against the respondents.
- 5. That he be granted such other general relief as the equities of this cause may demand.

- l. On this date, the Assistant C.I.B. Officer disclosed that he had been advised by a local press representative that William John BEATTIE would be coming to this Headquarters on this date to offer information regarding the murder of Martin Luther AING.
- John William BEATTIE claims to be the National Leader of the Canadian National Socialist Party. His philosophies and political ideologies are extremely right wing and he has written several articles and given numerous speeches on anti-Semitism and anti-negro events. He is continually seeking any recognition through the press and news media. It was learned that he had originally offered this information to the press and when nothing appeared in the papers, he told the press that he was going to the R.C.M.P.
- 3. The Assistant C.I.B. Officer instructed that SEATTIN be interviewed by S/Sgt. Morse and myself.
- 4. SEATTIS advised that David STABLEY who was at one time a radical member of his organization, forwarded names of Toronto residents to the National States Rights Party in Birmingham, Alabama, so that the publication THUND ARBULT could be forwarded to them. STABLEY chose these names out of the City Directory and forwarded lists of two to three hundred names on several occasions. This incident took place in 1965 and shortly after this, STABLEY went to the South States and went on a speaking tour with J.B. STONER, who is now the Defence Counsel for James Earl RAY.
- 5. BEATTIE feels that the names Ramon SNEYD, Paul BRIDGEMAN and Eric Vincent GALT were some of the names forwarded to J.B. DTON IR. These names and identities were eventually utilized by James Earl RAY.
- 6. SHATTH supplied postcares and letters which connect STANLEY with STANE on his speaking tour, and these documents were photostated and returned to BEAUTIC; copies are attached.
- 7. BEATTIE feels that there is a conspigacy between FONER, MAY and others concerning the murder of Martin Luther AINTER admits that it is only a presumption on his part.
- 8. With reference to the attuchments, STONER is noted as Vice Chairman of the National States Party and the copies of the postcards indicate that STANLEY was with him on one of his speaking tours.
