**ASSASSINATION OF

On June 18, 1970, Assistant District Attorney General Clyde Mason, Memphis, Tennessee, made available the following documents filed in the Criminal Court of Shelby County, Tennessee, by attorneys for the subject Ray. One copy of each of these documents is enclosed for the Department.

1. Motion to Produce, directing the Sheriff of Shelby County, Tennessee, to furnish the name of the person or persons who constructed and designed the quarters in the Shelby County Jail wherein the subject was incarcerated. This motion has been denied by Judge William H. Williams.
2. Motion to Produce, requesting that the Clerk of the Shelby County Criminal Court produce date books, log books, or notebooks, or other personal data belonging to the late Judge Preston Battle. This motion has been denied by Judge Williams. *Wa*
3. A motion to declare the subject Ray indigent. Judge Williams has withheld decision on this pending receipt of an affidavit from Ray stating that he is indigent.
4. Motion for an order to require the Shelby County Sheriff to permit psychiatrists to visit the Shelby County Jail quarters where Ray was confined. This motion has been denied by Judge Williams.

5. Motion to Produce, asking that the Shelby County Sheriff make available all records pertaining to the visits made to the subject by Percy Foreman and by Jerry Ray. Judge Williams has denied this motion.
6. Motion for profuction of books, papers, documents, and tangible objects. Judge Williams ruled that those items of evidence mentioned in the stipulation at the time of the subject's guilty plea may be reviewed by the subject's counsel. He directed subject's counsel to request the Clerk of the Criminal Court to make these items available for examination.

In memorandum from Bishop to DeLoach of 6-24-70, it was stated that Bill King in the Information Office of the Department of Justice advised Bishop on 6-24-70 that the Department had decided it would not be possible for the Government to successfully defend the civil action by Harold Weisberg against the Department for the release of the documents which Weisberg is seeking to secure from the Department, and copies of these documents were, accordingly, furnished to Weisberg by the Department. King also advised that the Department was going to release these documents to the press at 3:00 p.m. on 6-24-70. The Director has inquired "Did you get a written instruction from Dept confirming conversation King had with you? H".

For the information of the Director, no written notice has been received from the Department to the effect that it had decided that it would not be possible for the Government to successfully defend the civil action by Weisberg against the Department for the release of the documents in question, or that these documents were, therefore, furnished to Weisberg. The first notice that the Bureau had of this action was when King telephoned Bishop at approximately 11:50 a.m. on 6-24-70, at which time King also stated that the Department was releasing copies of these documents to the press at 3:00 p.m. on 6-24-70. King, subsequently, on 6-24-70 furnished Bishop copies of the documents being released.

By way of background, on 4/27/70 Assistant Attorney General William Ruckelshaus, Civil Division, Department of Justice, advised the Director that Harold Weisberg, the author of the books "Whitewash I" and "Whitewash II" has filed a civil action against the Department of Justice and Department of State demanding copies of all the papers which were employed in the extradition in the James Earl Ray matter. These documents were used in the extradition proceedings against James Earl Ray in England and were thereafter returned to the State Department and were transferred to the Department of Justice. Included in the documents were a considerable number of affidavits of FBI Agents, affidavits covering fingerprints, ballistics' examinations, etc. Ruckelshaus asked if the release of these documents to Weisberg would in any way prejudice the work of the FBI. It is noted that Weisberg is an author who has been extremely critical of the FBI, the Secret Service and other police agencies in books which he has written about the assassination of President Kennedy.

By memorandum of April 30th the Director advised Ruckelshaus that the determination as to the release of the pertinent documents is within the province of the Department of Justice and the FBI interposes no objection. It was suggested, however, that the Civil Division communicate with the Civil Rights Division of the Department on this matter since Federal process was still outstanding against Ray charging a violation of a Federal Civil Rights Statute.

The Bureau is in possession of a copy of a letter dated May, 1970, from Jerris Leonard, Assistant Attorney General, Civil Rights Division, to Ruckelshaus stating that any release of any information in the files pertaining to the investigation regarding James Earl Ray would be inimicable to the investigation.

Current Developments

On 6/24/70 Bill King in the Information Office, Department of Justice, advised that the Department subsequently ~~decided~~ that it would not be possible for the Government to successfully defend the civil action by Weisberg against the Department for the release of the documents in question. Accordingly, copies of these documents were furnished to Weisberg. King advised that in view of the fact that the Department had released the documents to Weisberg the Department did not wish Weisberg to make a profit from his possession of the documents and, accordingly, has decided to make similar copies available to the press and others who might desire them. King stated that the documents to be released consist of approximately 200 pages of copies of affidavits, autopsy reports, affidavits with regard to fingerprint examinations and ballistics tests, and copies of other documents which serve to link Ray with the assassination of Martin Luther King. At Bishop's request King furnished the attached set of the documents being released. King stated that these documents will be released to the press at 3 p.m. on 6/24/70.

The General Investigative Division has been orally advised of the above information.

I was advised by the local police department that I should write to you to find out about petitioning the court to reopen a case that has been closed on the basis of further information (information involving material evidence which was disposed of but of which I have certain knowledge). I am referring to the case of James Earl Ray in the assassination of Martin Luther King, Jr. The assassination was definitely a conspiracy on the part of some Nazi or Nazis from the evidence I received, meaning other than Mr. James Earl Ray. The local district attorney's office and the local police department said I might need an attorney to file such a petition. I would like the name of an attorney in Memphis (other than Richard J. Ryan, to whom I have already written) if this is necessary. If your office can handle the matter, I would appreciate that information also. Thank you.

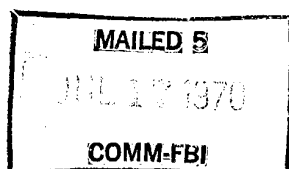
Dear Mr. McBane:

On April 9th, 1968, about 10AM, I was having my old car (1951 Hudson Hornet) serviced at the Texaco Station, the car was then was up on a hoist, this man walks in and asked for the Keys to the men's room- I sensed right there that was the James Earl Ray, as I had cold chills up my back, I just was frozen, could not phone, could not get my car, but said to myself, don't act as if you know anything-well he wasn't in the men's room 30 seconds came out hung up the Keys, and seemed to stagger towards his car-altho not drunk- He had to be a very marked man-I don't for the life of me see how anyone could have missed him. at all--

Have never heard whether I was right or wrong I know I was Right- All I want to know was I Right ? I realize it is a touchy thing to advertise, as the Blacks would Love me, and there are a lot of Whites, would have it in for me, but I am a great believer in equality, and Justice for ALL. I even told the F B I -(LA) that he would drive East which would have taken him to Ontario Airport and to Canada.

Envelope Is Cited By Ray Attorney

A battered envelope, postmarked one month before James Earl Ray escaped from the Missouri State Prison, was one of the leads obtained by Ray's defense attorneys this week after they examined in detail for the first time the state's evidence against Ray, who is now serving 99 years for the slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King, one of the defense attorneys said today.

Bernard (Bud) Fensterwald, a Washington, D.C. attorney who joined Memphis attorney Richard Ryan last month in defending Ray, said the envelope was addressed to a "doctor" at a flophouse in Atlanta with a return address of a political organization.

"Marked across the top was Eric Starvo Galt," Fensterwald said. "There were some penciled notations about Galt being a man good for some odd jobs . . ."

The state contends that Galt was an alias Ray used when he registered in a Memphis motel the night before Dr. King was fatally shot on the balcony of the Lorraine Motel.

Fensterwald, who received permission from the court last month to examine the state's evidence for the first time, said the envelope was among the evidence he examined at the Memphis police department's property room where the Ray evidence is stored.

There was nothing in the state's summary of proof, Fensterwald said, about the envelope or about the individual the letter was apparently addressed to.

The attorney also said the 30 caliber metal jacketed bullet extracted from Dr. King's body was intact enough that it could be subjected to a spectrographic analysis, adding that there was no indication in the state's proof that it had ever undergone any such tests.

A new trial motion will be heard Sept. 2. Atty. Gen. Phil M. Canale will ask for dismissal of Ray's request for a new trial on the grounds that it does not allege any violations of Ray's constitutional rights.

Yesterday, Criminal Court Judge William Williams denied a defense motion by Fensterwald and Ryan for a spectrographic analysis of the bullet that killed Dr. King.

Ray Case Claim: 'New Evidence'

An attorney for James Earl Ray said today he has uncovered new evidence "that runs very contrary" to the state's theory that the bullet taken from the body of Dr. Martin Luther King was fired by the rifle found at the assassination scene.

The claim was made by Bernard Fensterwald Jr. of Washington, D.C., during a brief hearing before Criminal Court Judge William H. Williams in connection with Ray's petition for a new trial under the Tennessee Post Conviction Relief Act.

Judge Williams set a hearing for oral arguments on the issue for Wednesday, Sept. 2.

Fensterwald told the judge that he had been unable to determine if a spectographic analysis had ever been made of the bullet that killed King. The attorney asked the judge to authorize such a test.

Fensterwald said the FBI evidence relating to the bullet presented at Ray's guilty plea trial on March 10, 1969, was "very vague."

Fensterwald did not elaborate on his new evidence claim at the hearing, but he went into some detail with reporters after the hearing.

Among the documents, he told newsmen, was a sworn statement by an FBI ballistics expert identified as Robert Frazer that the bullet recovered from King's body was so mutilated it could not be identified as having been fired by the rifle traced to Ray.

Ray Denied Court Approval For Analysis Of Fatal Bullet

Criminal Court Judge William H. Williams yesterday denied a motion by an attorney for James Earl Ray, confessed slayer of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., for a spectrographic analysis of the bullet that killed the Negro leader.

Bernard Fensterwald Jr., the 11th attorney to be employed by Ray, contended the analysis is needed to establish whether the bullet taken from Dr. King's body here in April, 1968, is of the same composition as either of two lots of bullets left on the sidewalk at 422½ Main just after the slaying.

Judge Williams denied this and other defense motions as not in order for arguments to be made before him on a defense move for a new trial under the Tennessee post-conviction relief act. Judge Williams set the new trial hearing for Sept. 2.

Atty. Gen. Phil M. Canale will contend Ray's motion for a new trial should be dismissed because it alleges no violation of Ray's constitutional rights.

Mr. Fensterwald, executive director of the Committee to Investigate Assassinations, with offices in Washington, contends Ray did not fire the shot that killed Dr. King. A spectrographic analysis of the fatal bullet might show, he maintains, that it belongs to neither of two lots 30-06-caliber cartridges left on the sidewalk in front of the rooming house from the second floor of which the state contends Dr. King was shot.

Robert A. Frazier, an FBI ballistics expert, found that the bullet extracted from Dr. King's body was a 30-caliber

metal-jacketed self-point sporting type bullet. He found it identical to five unfired bullets the state claims Ray left behind but dissimilar from four others, also left behind, that had full metal jackets.

If the FBI made a spectrographic analysis of the bullets, the 560 word affidavit prepared by Dr. Frazier for use at the trial does not mention it.

"This is a serious flaw in the investigation and should be corrected," Mr. Fensterwald said.

Judge Williams refused a defense request for Ray to be brought to Memphis from Brushy Mountain Penitentiary in East Tennessee for the Sept. 2 hearing.

FBI Says Mustang Left Here 2 Years Ago Not Linked To Martin Luther King Murder Car Looks Like One Implicated In Assassination

By LAURENCE H. GELLER
(Of The Tribune Staff)

A Georgia-licensed white Mustang abandoned almost two years ago in a center-city garage, and similar to the one implicated in the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., is not linked to the murder, an FBI spokesman in Philadelphia told the Tribune yesterday.

However, the local branch of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, officially asked the FBI yesterday, for a "thorough investigation of the 1965 model car and the owner." Her whereabouts are unknown.

ON PROBATION

The FBI has already reported to the Tribune that the owner of the car is a probation violator (narcotics charge), missing since December 1969.

Her name is Lois Jane Floyd, 36, white. Ironically, likewise, she sometimes uses the alias of Lois King. She was born November 1933.

The car arrived in Philadelphia on September 13, 1968, five months after the assassination.

An FBI spokesman told the

Tribune that "we have the Mustang owned by James Earl Ray. As of now, we see no connection between the abandoned Mustang bearing Georgia license plates and the King assassination."

SCLC PRESIDENT

Dr. King was the president of SCLC at the time of his death on April 4, 1968.

The relation of a white Mustang to the assassination is as follows:

—The accused killer of Dr. King, James Earl Ray, is alleged by the FBI to have purchased a white '66 Mustang sometime in 1967 and traveled extensively in it to Los Angeles, New Orleans, Birmingham, Mexico, Memphis and Atlanta.

—Memphis policemen were drawn to the northside of the city about a half-hour after Dr. King was killed by a false report that a white Mustang, believed to be the getaway car, was speeding through the city streets.

—A white Mustang, allegedly belonging to Ray, and bearing Alabama license plates, was

STORY DOUBTED

It goes without saying that the car in the center-city garage may have no connection whatsoever with Dr. King's assassination. But many persons throughout the country have never completely believed that the whole story of the assassination is known.

—James Earl Ray has indicated that there is more to the case than the public knows.

—It has never been proven that the rifle found was the weapon used to kill Dr. King.

—Dr. King's associate, James Bevel, SCLC education director, believes Ray is innocent of the assassination.

—The source of the police radio reports that a white Mustang was speeding through Memphis,

have never been uncovered.

DUST-CO0VERED

Sitting in the center-city garage, the white Mustang, now thickly covered with dust, looks black at first glance.

It was first reported to the Tribune several weeks ago via a phone caller who said he had worked part-time at the garage, and that the mysterious car had become a conversation piece amongst the employees there.

The information given to the Tribune was then turned over to the FBI; but it turned out that the license number was not carefully given. The Tribune went to the garage, obtained the license number and then called in local SCLC.

The most that can be hoped from whatever investigation is held is another clue to that is unknown about Dr. King's assassination.

The least that would result from such an investigation is that the missing Lois Jane Floyd, alias Lois King, will be retrieved from the depths of society in which she has submerged herself, to reveal why she drove a 1965 white Mustang, bearing Georgia license plates, to Philadelphia almost two years ago and left it there to gather dust.

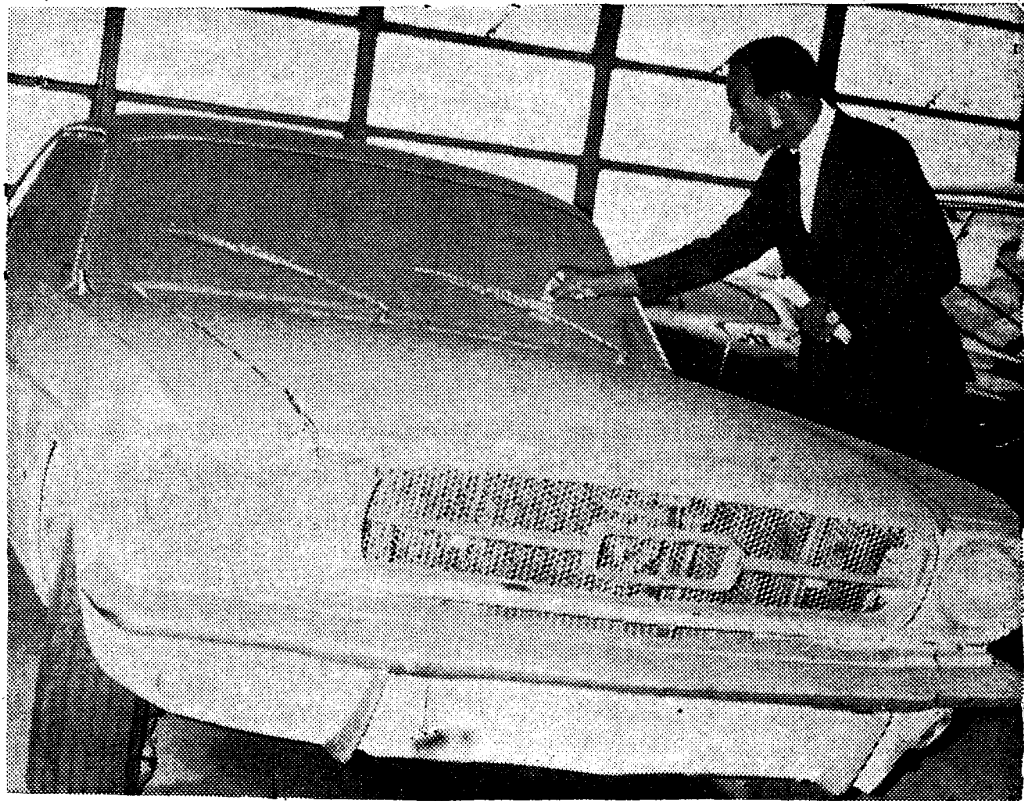

Mustang a Link to King Murder?

A Philadelphia civil rights leader said Friday he believes a 1965 white Mustang abandoned for two years in a downtown parking garage here was "somehow involved" in the assassination of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

Mercel Randolph, board chairman of the Philadelphia chapter of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference said he believes the car either was driven by the man who killed Dr. King or was used as a decoy to lead police away from the murderer.

Speaking at a press conference at the Mt. Olivet Baptist Church, 42d and Wallace sts., Randolph said a white, 1965 Mustang with Georgia tags has been parked at a garage at 12th and Chestnut sts. since September 1968, almost four months after Dr. King's death.

No record in National Crime Information Center on vehicle identification number or 1968 Georgia license plate of car located at Philadelphia and vehicle identification number not identical to that of Mustang owned by Ray. Philadelphia will keep Bureau advised of any pertinent developments.

On 7/31/70, GEORGE BEN EDMONDSON, a former Top Ten Fugitive, who is presently residing and working in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, under the assumed name of ALEX BORMANN, personally appeared at the Pittsburgh Office at which time he furnished the following information:

EDMONDSON advised that he is presently residing with his wife JINETTE and his young son at Brighton Terrace, Apartment 403, 721 Brighton Road, Pittsburgh, Pa. 15233, after having recently moved to Pittsburgh from Montreal, Canada, where he had been living and working since his release from the Missouri State Prison (MSP), Jefferson City, Missouri, on \$5,000 bond pending an appeal with the Missouri Supreme Court on his armed robbery sentence. EDMONDSON stated that since his release from MSP he has been living and working under the assumed name of ALEX BORMANN. He stated he is employed as a project engineer by Rust Associates, Ltd., Montreal Canada, a Division of Litton Industries and was recently transferred to Rust Engineering, Pittsburgh, Pa., for a new work assignment. EDMONDSON stated that officials of Rust Associates, Ltd., and Rust Engineering, Pittsburgh are cognizant of his present status and his background as a former Top Ten Fugitive. *P*

EDMONDSON advised that his purpose in contacting FBI, Pittsburgh at this time was because he was greatly disturbed over some recent developments that have come to his attention which could result in his identity being exposed, thereby jeopardizing his employment and all that he has accomplished since his release from prison.

EDMONDSON stated that he recently learned that a book entitled, "I Slew a Dreamer," written by WILLIAM BRADFORD HUIE, published by Delacorte Press, New York City, is being sold throughout the United States and Canada. He stated that this book is a story about JAMES EARL RAY and the events leading up to the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING. He stated that upon reading this book, he determined that his name and some of his aliases, including ALEX BORMANN, are frequently mentioned in several chapters of the book with regard to the author's suspicions that he, EDMONDSON may have been involved with and influenced JAMES EARL RAY in the plot to murder KING, while both he and JAMES EARL RAY were serving prison sentences together in the MSP.

EDMONDSON stated he is fearful that notoriety of this book will lead to his subsequent exposure by some news media tracing him to Pittsburgh. He stated he has already received one anonymous telephone call at his place of employment wherein the caller suggested he go to a bookstore and read, "I Slew a Dreamer" which he would find very interesting.

EDMONDSON stated that he immediately notified his attorney, JAMES A. DUNN, Carthage, Missouri, of the contents of the book and mailed him a copy to read. He stated that he has also brought this book to the attention of his superiors at Rust Engineering, Pittsburgh. He stated that if he should be exposed he will consider filing a damage suit for slander against the author and publisher of the book. He stated that insofar as the author's suspicions, that he was involved with JAMES EARL RAY in the murder of KING are concerned, they are not true and FBI records would substantiate him on this as he was extensively interviewed along these lines by the FBI after his apprehension as a Top Ten Fugitive.

EDMONDSON stated that he was merely bringing the above mentioned developments to the attention of the FBI for informational purposes. He stated he is awaiting instructions from his attorney as to what action he should take with regard to his problems.

The above information is being forward to the Bureau for informational purposes only.

Enclosed is one copy each of a self-explanatory letter received from captioned individual dated August 14, 1970, and my reply to him.

It is noted that McMillan is a free-lance writer who appeared in the office of Mr. Thomas E. Bishop, Assistant Director of the FBI Crime Records Division, on June 4, 1968. He requested information concerning James Earl Ray for a book he was writing about the latter, and he was informed that no assistance could be given him since investigation of Ray was continuing.

Our files also disclose that McMillan was the author of an article entitled "The Birmingham Church Bombing," which appeared in "The Saturday Evening Post" issue of June 6, 1964, and that he also authored another article, "Racial Violence and Law Enforcement," which was published in pamphlet form by the Southern Regional Council, which has allegedly been affiliated with the Southern Conference for Human Welfare, an organization cited as subversive by the House Committee on Un-American Activities (now known as the House Committee on Internal Security). On several occasions during the past few years, McMillan has contacted several FBI Field Offices for information in connection with articles he was writing concerning civil rights matters. No cooperation has been extended to him by the FBI in the past.

I have received your letter of August 14, 1970, requesting information for a book you are writing about James Earl Ray, convicted assassin of Dr. Martin Luther King.

While, as you noted in your letter, Ray has nearly exhausted all of the appeal remedies available to him under state law, Process for violation of Federal civil rights laws is still outstanding against Ray. In view of this and since the release of information in such matters is a determination within the province of the Department of Justice, I am referring your request to Mr. Jerris Leonard, Assistant Attorney General, Civil Rights Division, United States Department of Justice.

This is to record receipt of a letter from captioned individual, dated 8/14/70, in which he requested information for a biography of James Earl Ray which he is preparing for the publishing house of Little, Brown and Company.

McMillan
Files disclose that, in connection with his book on Ray, McMillan appeared in your (Mr. Bishop's) office on 6/4/68 seeking our cooperation. At that time, you (Mr. Bishop) pointed out to him that we could be of no assistance since the Ray case was still pending investigation and that no additional information could be released other than previously issued press releases. In addition, files reflect that McMillan is a free-lance writer who was the author of an article entitled "The Birmingham Church Bombing" which appeared in "The Saturday Evening Post" issue of 6/6/64. The article was not unfavorable to the FBI. McMillan also was the author of an article which appeared in November, 1960, captioned "Racial Violence and Law Enforcement" dealing with troubles in Little Rock, Chattanooga, and Montgomery. The article was printed in pamphlet form by "New South" a publication of the Southern Regional Council which, in turn, was interlocked with the Southern Conference for Human Welfare, an organization cited as subversive by the House Committee on Un-American Activities. McMillan wrote some studies in 1956 on "Individual Rights and Civil Liberties" for which he was paid by the "Fund for the Republic, Inc." He has contacted several of our Field Offices in connection with his writings; the last of which occurred in August, 1969, when he reported to our Columbia Division an anonymous threat he received locally as a result of research he had been conducting on the bombing of a Negro church in Birmingham, Alabama. No action was taken on his complaint, and we have given him no assistance in the preparation of his articles.
